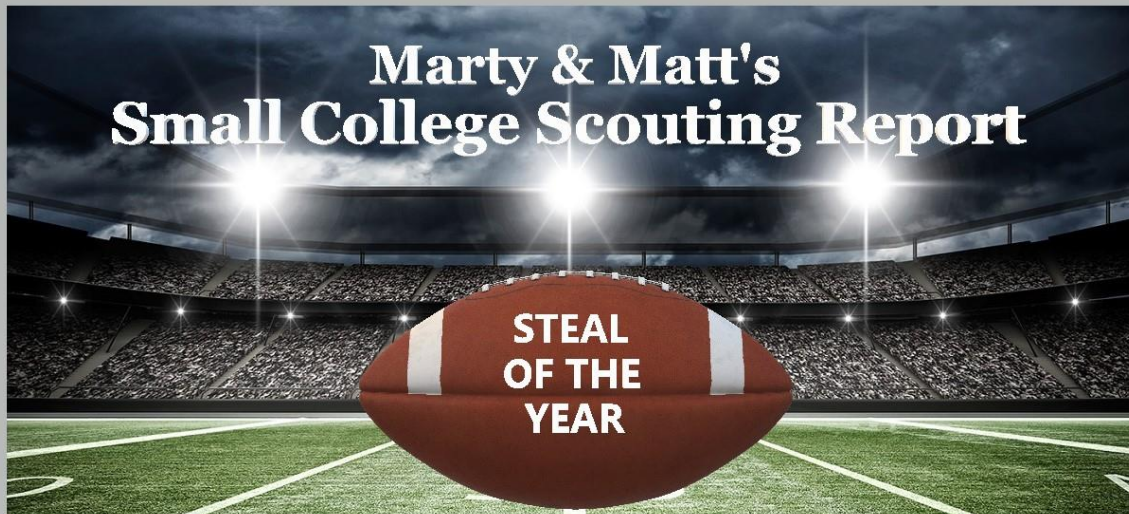

2015, 2016, 2017: First Team All-Iowa Conference. 2017: Named Iowa Conference Defensive Player of the Year. Cliff Harris Award as best small college defender. The first Division III player to win the award. Joseph led the Iowa Conference with eight interceptions and was tied for third in all of NCAA Division III. To go along with his eight interceptions, he added 16 passes defender, eight pass break ups, 56 tackles and one kickoff return for a touchdown. Joseph recently received an invite to the 2018 Reese's Senior Bowl.



LUIS PEREZ

Texas A&M-Commerce

6-3 220 QB

2017: The winner of the 2017 Harlon Hill Trophy, awarded the top Division II college football player in the nation. He completed 421-of-596 passes for 4,999 yards, 46 touchdowns, and 11 interceptions. The 4,999 yards are the fourth-most by a quarterback in a single Division II season. He also set a Division II Championship records for pass completions (144), pass attempts (211) and passing yards (1,570). He became the first quarterback to pass for over 300 yards in the National Championship game since 2005 and tied a Lone Star Conference record for the most 200-yard passing games in a season with 14. He became the first Harlon Hill Trophy winner to also win a Division II National Championship since 2002 and only the sixth overall in the 32-year history of Division II's premier football award. For his career, Perez completed 665-of-985 passes for 8,325 yards, 78 touchdowns, and 16 interceptions. He was the starting quarterback for 28 games, leading the Lions to a 25-3 record, two NCAA Division II playoff appearances, and a Lone Star Conference championship. He completed his collegiate career leading the Lions on a 10-game winning streak, which is the longest active winning streak in Division II. He was previously named a First Team All-American by the Division II Conference Commissioners Association and the Associated Press, and a Second Team All-American by the American Football Coaches Association. He was also named the Ron Lenz Offensive Player of the Year by the D2CCA. He won the J.W. Rollins Award as the Lone Star Conference's Offensive Player of the Year and is a two-time First Team All-Lone Star Conference selection at quarterback. 2016: Nominated for the Harlon Hill Trophy, awarded to the Division II College Football Player of the Year, Don Hanson Division II All-American Honorable Mention, Second Team All-Super Region Four, First Team All-Conference selection.



ALEX CAPP

Humboldt State

2017: A national finalist for the prestigious Gene Upshaw Award, Cappa has captured national attention. The four-time Great Northwest Athletic Conference Offensive Lineman of the Year was tabbed a D2CCA First Team and First Team AP All-American selection. He helped the Lumberjacks average 488.3 yards of total offense per game, ninth in NCAA Division II, and anchored an offensive line that allowed just 22 sacks all season. Cappa will represent the Green and Gold at the 2018 Reese's Senior Bowl. 2016: Consensus All-American; 2015: D2CCA Second Team All-American, Don Hansen Honorable Mention All-American honors, GNAC Offensive Lineman of the Year; 2014: Unanimous First Team All-GNAC selection, GNAC Offensive Lineman of the Year.
