ST. MARY'S

6-1 190 CB/FS

Solid DB with decent height, Covers well, good vision and timing. Reliable tackler. 42.5 tackles, INT, FF, 6 PBUs.

WILL MAXWELL

BRITISH COLUMBIA

5-11 200 CB/

Former WR at U Calgary. Clocked 10.96 seconds in the 100m and 21.93 seconds in the 200m while sprinting indoors for the Dinos. Big and strong, with above-average speed.

GODFREY ONYEKA

WILFRID LAURIER

6-2 200 DB/

The highest ranking of any CFL prospect who played university football in Canada. Named a First Team all Canadian in 2015, 2016 and 2017. Was simply dominant in his fourth campaign with Laurier, tallying a team-high 42.5 tackles in eight league games, in addition to a pair of forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, one sack and one interception. Played CB but probably projects to FS/SS.

CORY ROBINSON

CALGARY

6-3 260 DE/

2017: All-Canadian. 2015: Named conference All-Star. In his time at Calgary he helped the Dinos to two undefeated regular seasons, three Hardy Cups as Canada West Champions, two Mitchell Bowls and a pair of Vanier Cup appearances.

TYLER CORDEIRO **ST. FX**

6-4 365 DT/

Big-bodied DT. Moves well for his size. Bull rusher who takes up a lot of room in the middle.

DAVID MACKIE **WESTERN ONTARIO**

6-2 252 FB/

2017: 1st Team OUA All-Star. Vanier Cup Champ. Excellent long snapper who will be able to do that right away for a CFL team. That adds to the abilities Mackie has on offense. He's physical and catches the ball out of the backfield smoothly. CFL scouts are high on Mackie as a key blocker in a Mustangs ground game that has galloped all over defenses in 2017.

JEAN-GABRIEL POULIN **WESTERN ONTARIO**

6-1 220 ILB/

Two-time All-Canadian. National Champion 2017. The heart and soul of the Mustangs defence comes as tough as anyone. Poulin is the leader of a stout Western unit. He's a downhill thumper in the run game and finds himself around the football a lot.

MICAH TEITZ **CALGARY**

6-2 225 ILB/

2015: Earned U Sports Second Team All-Canadian nod and first Canada West All-Star honors.

KENE ONYEKA **CARLETON**

6-3 240 LB/DE

As a DE from a very athletic family, turned out 10.5 sacks, 32 solo tackles, 14 assisted

tackles, four forced fumbles and two pass break-ups. Was awarded with the OUA's J.P Metras Trophy as the conference's Lineman of the Year. He was also named an OUA First-Team All-Star and a U SPORTS All-Canadian. Kene Onyeka ranked No. 14 on CFL Scouting Bureau's 2018 Draft Board.

DARIUS CIRACO **CALGARY**

6-4 295 OC/OG

5th among the Top 20 2018 CFL prospects. Chosen for the 2017 East West Bowl, an annual postseason all-star game which showcases the top U Sports football prospects who will be eligible for the following year's CFL draft. 2016: Appeared in four regular season games on the offensive line, missing the other four due to injury; 2015: Named a U Sports Second Team All-Canadian and Canada West All-Star. One of the best offensive linemen in all of Canadian university football.

ANTHONY DALEY **MANITOBA**

6-2 315 OC/

After five standout years with the CJFL, where he was a CJFL All-Canadian and three seasons, starting in 2013, practicing with the BC Lions team as a territorial exemption (someone who doesn't count towards the team's roster limit), Daley joined Manitoba in 2016. Has played a lot of organized football.

SAM MACMILLAN **TORONTO**

6-2 290 OC/

Chosen for the 2017 East West Bowl, an annual postseason all-star game which showcases the top U Sports football prospects who will be eligible for the following year's CFL draft. Brother, Nolan MacMillan, played football for the Iowa Hawkeyes and is a member of the Ottawa REDBLACKS.

MARC-ANTOINE SEVIGNY **CONCORDIA**

6-1 328 OC/

Chosen for the 2017 East West Bowl, an annual postseason all-star game which showcases the top U Sports football prospects who will be eligible for the following year's CFL draft.

K.C. BAKKER **CARLETON**

6-7 320 OG/

Chosen for the 2017 East West Bowl, an annual postseason all-star game which showcases the top U Sports football prospects who will be eligible for the following year's CFL draft. Brought a whole lot of size to Carleton's offensive line in 2017— his fourth season with the club.

JACOB CZAJA **ST. FX**

6-3 295 OG/

Chosen for the 2017 East West Bowl, an annual postseason all-star game which showcases the top U Sports football prospects who will be eligible for the following year's CFL draft.

BEN KOCZWARA **WATERLOO**

6-4 295 OG/

Chosen for the 2017 East West Bowl, an annual postseason all-star game which showcases the top U Sports football prospects who will be eligible for the following year's CFL draft.

CURTIS KRAHN **CALGARY**

6-3 295 OG/

5th year senior. Didn't start playing football until after high school, and he has worked extremely hard to become a starter and a powerful presence on the line. Invited to the CFL West Regional Combine.

JUSTIN LAWRENCE **ALBERTA**

6-3 290 OG/

Chosen for the 2017 East West Bowl, an annual postseason all-star game which showcases the top U Sports football prospects who will be eligible for the following year's CFL draft.

NOLAN MCGREER **CARLETON**

6-4 280 OG/

Chosen for the 2017 East West Bowl, an annual postseason all-star game which showcases the top U Sports football prospects who will be eligible for the following year's CFL draft.

ANDREW PICKETT **GUELPH**

6-4 300 OG/

13th among the Top 20 2018 CFL prospects. Has twice been named an OUA Second Team All-Star during his Gryphon career, was invited to the East-West Bowl this past Spring, but was forced to sit out due to a non-serious leg injury. Now fully healthy, anchored the Gryphon offensive line while also serving as one of the team captains. Pickett is one of only five players from the OUA to be named on the CFL Scouting Bureau list.

RYAN SCEVIOUR **CALGARY**

6-4 305 OG/

16th among the Top 20 2018 CFL prospects. Chosen for the 2017 East West Bowl, an annual postseason all-star game which showcases the top U Sports football prospects who will be eligible for the following year's CFL draft. 2017: All-Canadian. 2016: Canada West All-Star. Plays a tough, physical brand of football. He's athletic and mobile, and he can get to the second and third levels with his blocking.

DAKODA SHEPLEY **BRITISH COLUMBIA**

6-5 295 OG/

14th among the Top 20 2018 CFL prospects. Chosen for the 2017 East West Bowl, an annual postseason all-star game which showcases the top U Sports football prospects who will be eligible for the following year's CFL draft.

RYAN BREADNER **SASKATCHEWAN**

6-7 325 OT/

From Texas so don't think he technically is eligible for the CFL draft but was chosen for the

2017 East West Bowl, an annual postseason all-star game which showcases the top U Sports football prospects who will be eligible for the following year's CFL draft.

DAVID BROWN

WESTERN ONTARIO

6-4 315 OT/

2017: 1st Team All-Canadian. Western's left tackle was the standout for the Mustangs up front on a unit that has the best rushing attack in the country. He moves well and finishes plays with consistency.

KEILER CHERRY

ACADIA

6-6 300 OT/

A farm boy who is 17th among the Top Twenty 2018 CFL prospects. Chosen for the 2017 East West Bowl, an annual postseason all-star game which showcases the top U Sports football prospects who will be eligible for the following year's CFL draft. Started at left tackle in eight regular season and one playoff game during the 2015-16 season earning the Axemen rookie of the year award. He captured Atlantic University Sport (AUS) all-conference team honours as well as a spot in the U Sports all-star East-West Bowl game in his second year.

TOM CLARKSON

MANITOBA

6-7 310 OT/

5th year senior. Was a member of the 2012 recruiting class for the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. The lineman returned to Canada to pursue graduate studies after completing his degree at UNLV. His father Larry was a longtime professional OL, notably with the BC Lions and the San Francisco 49ers.

JORDAN FILIPPELLI

CALGARY

6-6 325 OT/

5th year senior. 2016: Started every game for the Dinos at left tackle, the only O-lineman to start every game at the same position; 2015: Named a Canada West All-Star for first time in career. Drafted by the Ottawa Redblacks with the final pick in the eighth round in 2017.

MARK KORTE ALBERTA

6-4 285 OT/OG

Chosen for the 2017 East West Bowl, an annual postseason all-star game which showcases the top U Sports football prospects who will be eligible for the following year's CFL draft.

IBRA NDIAYE OTTAWA

6-6 348 OT/

New to the game but shows good natural talent to go with incredible size. Solid project.

MATTHEW OUELLET DE CARLO BISHOP'S

6-5 310 OT/

Chosen for the 2017 East West Bowl, an annual postseason all-star game which showcases the top U Sports football prospects who will be eligible for the following year's CFL draft. Whether in the classroom or field, is committed to always performing at a high level.

SEAN STENGER SASKATCHEWAN

6-1 185 PK/P

Canada Cup Special Teams MVP 2010, 2017 Can West All Star, 2017 1st team All-Canadian.

CHRISTOPHER AMOAH LAVAL

5-10 206 RB/

Has breakaway speed (4.47 40-yard time) but ball security issues have plagued the speedy back. He had 48 carries for 356 yards and one touchdown (7.2 yards per carry) with a long of 63 in seven regular season games. A late-season injury kept Amoah out of the Rouge et Or's playoff games.

JOHNNY AUGUSTINE**GUELPH****5-9 210 RB/**

22 REPS, competitive bodybuilder. Despite a very good career and solid 2017, he seemed to be overlooked at college level. . Averaged 5.67 yds/carry gaining 839 yards on 153 carries with 9 TDs. Also caught 12 passes for 151 yards. Recently signed a two-year deal with Saskatchewan.

ED ILNICKI**ALBERTA****5-10 220 RB/**

5th year senior. Drafted by the Ottawa RedBlacks in the 2016 Draft. 2017: Had one of the most dominant seasons in University of Alberta Golden Bears and Canada West history, was awarded the prestigious Hec Crighton Trophy as the U SPORTS Football Player of the Year. Broke the Canada West single-season rushing record with 1,468 rushing yards in 2017, leading the Golden Bears back to the Canada West playoffs for the first time since 2010. Ilnicki also added 151 receiving yards in 2017, breaking a 42-year old program record for single-season all-purpose yards with 1,619. Found the end zone 11 times on the ground this season, the most in Canada. His rushing total was tops in the country by more than 300 yards and the fifth most all-time nationally. Ilnicki concluded his five-year career as Alberta's all-time rushing leader with 4,145 yards – the second most all-time in Canada West history. He also ends his career as the program's all-time leader in all-purpose yards (4,978), carries (691), and rushing touchdowns (28).

ATLEE SIMON**REGINA****6-0 205 RB/**

2017: Entered his fourth U SPORTS season tied for the school's all-time lead in rushing touchdowns (17) and second in school history with 2029 rushing yards. Smooth, quick runner who can make something out of nothing.

ALEX TAYLOR**WESTERN ONTARIO****5-10 205 RB/**

Minor knee surgery kept Taylor out of the Yates Cup and Uteck Bowl, but he could be back in action for the Vanier. Taylor with his low-to-the-ground and balanced running style put up 831 rushing yards in seven regular season games. He's the most dynamic back on Western's roster.

REGIS CIBASU MONTREAL

6-3 235 WR/

Never missed a game, a meeting, a lift, a run, a practice. He's been the model of consistency here. He's very low key. Zero maintenance. Invited to the East-West Shrine all-star game. Possesses the rare combination of size, speed and talent. As a rookie in 2014, catching 32 passes for 407 yards and scoring two touchdowns. He was named the offensive rookie of the year in the Quebec conference. In the Carabins' Vanier Cup victory against McMaster, Cibasu led all receivers with six catches for 90 yards, including a crucial 32-yard reception that set up a touchdown. He was named the game's most valuable player. In 31 career games at Montréal, he caught 145 passes for 1,765 yards while scoring seven touchdowns. He becomes the first Carabins player selected for the Shrine game. Other Quebecers chosen include McGill's Laurent Duvernay-Tardif, now the starting right guard for the Kansas City Chiefs, and Laval receiver Anthony Auclair, who plays for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

KURLEIGH GITTENS. JR. WILFRID LAURIER

6-0 188 WR/

Combines eye-popping bursts of speed with soft hands, ankle-breaking changes of direction and a relentless work ethic.

MITCH HILLIS SASKATCHEWAN

6-0 190 WR/Slot

5th year senior. 2016: sidelined for half the season due to injury then drafted by the B.C. Lions. 2015: Huskies Football MVP (2015), First team All-Canadian, Canada West All-Star, Broke Huskie Athletics single season records for receptions and yards. 2013: Huskies Football Rookie of the Year.

ARCHELAUS JACK ST. MARY'S

6-3 197 WR/

Known for his ability to create distance from a defender and then reel in the ball when it's reached its highest point. He as been described as having ridiculous vision and agility, which makes a huge treat in the return game. Was previously on the practice roster for the CFL's Saskatchewan Roughriders which caused a huge controversy over his elibility. Had 48 rec, 731 yds, 15.2 avg, 5 TDs.

ALEX MORRISON **BRITISH COLUMBIA**

6-4 220 WR/

5th year senior. invited to the 2016 NY Giants mini-camp despite suffering a season-ending arm injury in the 2nd game of his college season.

MITCHELL PICTON **REGINA**

6-2 205 WR/Slot

2016: Named a first-team All-Canadian and a Canada West all-star, set a school record, led Canada West, and finished second in the nation with 58 receptions, tied school record and led the country with 11 touchdown catches, also led Canada West and was second in the nation with 834 receiving yards.

TYRONE PIERRE **LAVAL**

6-3 210 WR/

Athletic with a pro frame. Not been featured in Laval's offence, Pierre has 13 catches for 122 yards in eight regular season game and one reception for 44 yards in three playoff contests, so that might leave questions, but Pierre has pro traits that you can't teach: 38-inch vertical, 10-foot broad jump, 4.58-second 40-yard time and 3.99 shuttle.

RYAN SCHIENBEIN **REGINA**

5-9 180 WR/Slot

2016: Named a Canada West all-star after finishing second in the conference in receptions (54), receiving yards (790), and touchdown catches (7) in his first season as a starter.

RASHAUN SIMONISE **CALGARY**

6-5 200 WR/

Invited to the 2018 CFL National Combine. His draft year was deferred from 2017 to 2018 due to a positive performance-enhancing drug test during his time in Cincinnati Bengals' training camp. Heading into the 2017 draft Simonise had been the #7 ranked prospect in September 2016 and then moved up to #4 in December 2016. Is a coach's son. 2015 First-

Team All-Canadian. Had his breakout season in his junior year and tied for the lead in Canada in touchdowns with 11. He also had 1,013 yards and 65 catches in only 8 games. Simonise was averaging 134.9 yards per game with 22 yards per catch giving him national attention. His most notable night came against University of Alberta where he racked up 9 catches for 272 yards and 3 touchdowns. Simonise also had 4 receptions that were all longer than 30 yards but were called back because of penalties. Rashaun was named 1st team all Canadian and was the number one ranked receiver in Canada. After an outstanding 2015 season he was academically ineligible for the 2016 season.

RICHARD SINDANI CALGARY

6-3 202 WR/

5th year senior. Drafted by the Calgary Stampeders in 2016. Transferred from Regina.
