

TRAVIS ANDERSON *Missouri Western* 6-3 305 OG
Second team Don Hansen All-Super Region Three for the third time. Anderson became a three-time first team All-MIAA offensive lineman, starting all but one game over the past three seasons and blocking for a 1,000-yard rusher each of those seasons.

ZACH BEARD *Nebraska-Kearney* 6-4 290 OG
Honorable Mention All-MIAA for a second straight year. Fifth-year seniors on a Loper line allowed 18 fewer sacks this fall and was part of an offense that saw all of its numbers (points, yards and TD's) increase from 2015.

ERIC BECKWITH *Bentley* 6-2 285 OG
2016 All-Northeast-10 Conference football first team. Has been a fixture on the Bentley offensive line since his arrival on campus in the fall of 2013. The six-foot-two, 285-pounder played in 41 of a possible 44 career games, with 35 starts.

MIKE BERARDI *West Liberty* 6-5 290 OG OC
Versatile veteran had multiple starts throughout his career at tackle, guard and center along the Hilltoppers' offensive line.

ED BIER *IUP* 6-2 280 OG
All-PSAC West 2nd Team in his first year as a starter who helped anchored a line that has helped IUP average 278.5 rushing yards per game this season.

BRANDON BURRELL *Lincoln (PA)* 6-5 310 OG
Transfer from Bethel. Poor offensive year for the team. But good-sized, experienced lineman are in demand.

AUSTIN CARSON *West Texas A&M* 6-1 304 OG OC
Earned second team all conference honors for the third-straight year as he finished his career as the all-time leader in games played and started for offensive linemen with 46. Carson had an outstanding career at center for the Buffs as he protected Harlon Hill runner-up Dustin Vaughan in 2013 as a redshirt freshman as Vaughan threw for 5,401 yards setting an NCAA Division II record and 53 touchdown passes which was third-most in NCAA Division II. This season Carson graded out at 93.7 percent counting assignment, technique and finish. He only allowed two sacks all season and had 33 knockdown blocks and was selected as a NSCA All-American Strength & Conditioning athlete.

JALEN CHAMBERS *Upper Iowa University* 6-5 300 OG
Transfer from the University of Iowa. Was instrumental in UIU gaining nearly 5,000 yards of total offense with 1,987 yards rushing and 2,975 yards passing.

MARCELLUS CORBIN *Missouri S&T* 6-4 305 OG
Two-year starter, four-year contributor on the offensive line. Helped guide an offensive line unit that helped S&T average 351.7 yards of total offense, 134.5 yards rushing and 30 points per game during the course of the season.

BRIAN CORNISH *Fort Valley State* 6-2 315 OG OC
Made second team All-SIAC and led the left side of the Wildcats line.

DJ DEGEORGE *Assumption College* 6-5 275 OG

Anchored an offensive line which gave up just ten sacks all season while allowing the offense to average a conference-best 37.2 points and 422.7 yards per game

KEVIN DELGADO *Florida Tech* 6-6 360 OG

Second team All-GSC. A key portion of the Panther offensive line that led FIT to league-highs in both total offense and rushing offense.

ZACHARY DOUGLASS *Ashland University* 6-2 297 OG

Finished his senior campaign grading out at 90 percent blocking with 95 knockdowns. Was also named second-team AFCA All-America, second-team D2CCA All-Super Region 4 and first-team All-GLIAC.

TYLER EASTER *Northeastern State* 6-3 280 OG OC

A three-year letterwinner, played in 32 career games with 22 career starts. Landed on the 2012 MIAA Academic Honor Roll and 2016 All-MIAA Honorable Mention Team.

RICHARD "CHICO" FELTENBERGER *Fort Hays* 6-5 320 OG OT

Three-year starter though did not continually stay in the starting lineup, mostly due to injury. Shows ability in both pass and run games.

TIM FINLEY *Arkansas Tech* 6-3 325 OG OT

Moved between guard and tackle. Played two seasons with Arkansas Baptist College before transferring to Lyon College for one season then to Tech.

SHANE FINLEY *Wayne State (NEB)* 6-5 295 OG OT

Earned All-Conference honors for the third time in his career after named First Team All-NSIC South last year and Second Team All-NSIC South this year and as a sophomore. He played in all 44 games during his Wildcat career and started the last three seasons and 33 games at either right or left tackle on the Wildcat offensive line.

JOHN GARLAND *Bloomsburg* 6-4 300 OG OT

Three year starter. Very strong run blocker with very good pass protection skills. Was All-PSAC in his first year as a starter in 2014; when the Huskies averaged 223.3 yards per game on the ground while surrendering a PSAC-low six sacks.

ANTONIO GREEN *Sioux Falls* 6-3 294 OG

USF's second three-time first team All-NSIC selection and is a two-time Gene Upshaw Award nominee. He has been named a preseason All-American by Lindy's Sports Magazine and Game Plan. In two plus seasons at USF, Green has graded out at 86.8 percent, allowing just 1.5 sacks while recording 190.5 knockdowns.. In 2015 graded out at 88 percent, allowing no sacks with 54 knockdowns. In 2016, he has graded out at average of 86.4 percent with 80.5 knockdowns and no sacks allowed.

JAMIL HALEY *Virginia State* 6-4 300 OG

All-CIAA Second Team. All-CIAA Second Team. Well-rounded. Part of an offensive line that was #1 in sacks allowed and #1 in rushing TDs.

BRYCE HALL *Northwood* 6-3 316 OG

Played at Eastern Michigan during the 2012 season. Played in 21 games at Northwood including as a 2016 starter.

REGGIE HARRIS *Angelo State* 6-2 305 OG

Integral in ASU's first 1,000-yard rushing running back since 2008. After helped ASU reset the school records for passing yards and total offense in 2015. Two-year starter, named honorable mention on the All-LSC team

TERRY HUBER *Sioux Falls* **6-4 297 OG**

Earned his first All-NSIC honorable mention recognition. A key member of an offensive front that ranks ninth nationally with just 10 sacks allowed. He also has played a key role in the nation's third ranked offense at 532.0 yards per game and third ranked rushed offense at 323.2 yards per game. The offense front has produced the two top leader rushers in per carry average in DII. He has graded at 87.4 percent grade, 713 reps, 623 positive reps, 25 knockdowns, and 0.5 sacks.

MARK JENKINS *Southern Arkansas* **6-1 357 OG OC**

Second-Team All-Conference. Helped anchor an offensive line that has protected the league's top-ranked total offense (497.7 ypg) and second-ranked scoring offense (36.3 ppg). Paul a starter in all 11 games at center, helped the Muleriders turn in the second-ranked passing attack (299.5 ypg) and paved the way for the GAC's fifth-best rushing attack (180.3 ypg) as well. Five times this year, the Muleriders have rushed for over 200 yards and six times did the passing attack go for over 300 yards. In total, there have been six games in which the Muleriders gained over 500 yards of total offense.

JUSTIN JOHNSON *Charleston* **6-3 290 OG**

2016 First Team All-MEC . 2015 AFCA All-American Honorable Mention. Strong run blocker, ever-improving in pass protection.

GUS JOHNSON *Humboldt State* **6-3 290 OG**

All-GNAC Honorable Mention. One of the cornerstones of the Lumberjacks offensive line that surrendered a league-best 19 sacks during the season. Helped provide protection for an offense that scored 35 points and 460.2 yards per game.

ROBERT KELLY *Wayne State (MI)* **6-3 288 OG**

2016: Earned Second Team All-GLIAC honors. Started all 11 games at right guard and saw action on PAT/FG in the first 10 games. Helped WSU score the third-most TD in the GLIAC (52) this past fall. WSU was seventh nationally in rushing offense (274.3 ypg), 13th in fewest tackles for loss allowed (4.18 pg) and 24th in yards per completion (14.59). Blocked for the nation's second-leading rusher during the regular season. Participated in the National Bowl. Played in 43 of 44 games in his four seasons, making 41 starts (first 16 at right tackle, 16 at right guard, and nine at left tackle).

TERRANCE KNIGHTEN *North Alabama* **6-3 318 OG**

Played at University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff prior to transferring to UNA. Played as a true freshman for the Golden Lions and started in 30 games.

DESHAUN LAWSON *Lindenwood* **6-3 298 OG**

Was a guard for the Lions offensive line, and earned all-MIAA honors after switching from defense to offense this year.

AUSTIN LEWIS *Carson-Newman* **6-4 280 OG**

All-SAC lineman who set a record on the Carson-Newman offensive line by grading out at an 83 in the Eagles' week two win over Saint Augustine's. He also moved into fourth place on the all-time knockdowns list and finished the year as the offensive line's leader in overall grade.

LARRY **McKENZIE** *Western New Mexico* **6-4 320 OG**

He helped the Mustangs average 26.5 points per game, 407.9 yards per game and 36 touchdowns. He helped lead the passing game to 3,195 yards and 25 scores.

BOBBY **McNEIL** *Newberry* **6-2 310 OG**

2016 ECAC Division II Football All-Star team, anchored the left side of a dominant offensive line that allowed just 20 sacks on 423 pass attempts and helped the Wolves roll up school records in passing yards, total offense, and scoring in 2016. McNeil was a candidate for the Gene Upshaw Award, given to the best offensive or defensive lineman in Division II, and accumulated 47 pancake blocks at his left guard position. He has started 34 of Newberry's 35 games over the last three seasons.

KYLE **MEYER** *N.W. Missouri* **6-3 280 OG**

Appeared in games since freshman year before earning starting gig as a senior. Part of an O-line that allowed a league-low seven sacks and blocked for the conference's top-ranked scoring and total offense.

DAIVON **MILAN** *Mississippi College* **6-3 320 OG**

Two-year starter since transfer from Northwest Mississippi Community College where he was an MACJC All-Star selection in his one year with the Rangers. Transferred to Northwest from the University of Memphis where he played in every game as a true freshman.

ZACH **MOREHEAD** *California University of Pennsylvania* **6-4 295 OG OT**

Three-year starter at both tackle and guard. Able to be moved during season. Part of an offensive line that has helped Cal U average 468.0 yards of total offense, 194.4 rushing yards and 52.1 points per game, which is the most in NCAA Division II.

TONY **MORGANTE** *IUP* **6-3 285 OG**

All-PSAC West 2nd Team. Two year starter who helped anchored a line that has helped IUP average 278.5 rushing yards per game this season.

JASON **MULLIGAN** *Findlay* **6-4 298 OG**

Appeared and started in all 11 games. Helped pave the way for an offense that, for the first time in school history, featured a quarterback with 2,500+ passing yards, a receiver with 1,000+ receiving yards, and a tailback with 1,000+ rushing yards in the same season.

TJ **OLSEN** *Catawba* **6-4 295 OG**

2nd Team All-SAC. Olsen had 41 starts mostly at right guard during his career. In 2016, Catawba averaged 350 yards of offense on the season with 163 a game coming on the ground.

JOEL **ONYIA** *Midwestern State* **6-4 305 OG**

1st Team All-LSC. Helped pave the way for the second best rushing attack in the LSC while ranking 37th nationally with 196.1 yards per game. The lined headed a unit that allowed 5.10 tackles for loss per game -- second in the LSC, 38th in NCAA II -- and 11 total sacks on the season.

TYLER PEERSON *California University of Pennsylvania* **6-4 285 OG**

All-Region. A four-year starter, Peerson has anchored an offensive line that has helped Cal U average 458.5 yards of total offense, 184.9 rushing yards and 51.4 points per game. Peerson has started all 43 games over the past four years while shifting from right tackle to left guard prior to the 2015 season.

CONNOR RANDALL *Minnesota-Duluth* **6-5 295 OG**

3-time All-NSIC honorable mention. Durable, hasn't missed a start since 2013 season-ending injury. Very consistent lineman, just plug in lineup and get a reliable performance.

CHRISTIAN RODRIGUEZ *Texas A&M-Commerce* **6-5 290 OG**

2016: Second Team All-Conference. Helped block for the No. 1 scoring offense in the conference and the No. 1 passing offense in the conference. Part of the line that allowed the fewest sacks in the conference.

LESTER SAMUEL *Lincoln (PA)* **6-4 320 OG**

Poor offensive year for the team. But good-sized, experienced lineman are in demand.

HASAN SHAAR *Colorado School of Mines* **6-5 320 OG**

Held down one of the nation's top offensive lines as seniors, helping Mines produce D-II's #1 total offense and #2 passing offense while allowing only 18 sacks in 525 passing downs. Mines was fourth in the nation in fewest tackles for loss allowed while averaging 5.2 yards per rushing attempt and 207 yards rushing per game. Shaar blocked for two-time 1,000-yard rusher Sam Seeton, and Mines recorded three of its all-time top four rushing games in 2016 with 369 yards against South Dakota Mines, 446 yards at Black Hills State, and 405 yards against Southwest Baptist. Shaar was previously named a D2CCA Second-Team All-American and CoSIDA First-Team Academic All-America and First-Team All-RMAC.

KELVIN SHELTON *Tuskegee* **6-5 290 OG**

HBCU Gameday Division II All-American team first team selection despite his season ending prematurely following the victory over Newberry in the opening round of the playoffs, following a lower leg injury. a First Team All-SIAC selection, allowed just one sack this season and helped pave the way for the offense, while recording 26 pancakes this season. Graded out as one of the best offensive lineman this for Tuskegee each week.

JARRETT STASTNY *Emporia State* **6-4 290 OG**

2016 Don Hansen Football Committee All-Super Region Three Team. Was a first-team All-MIAA selection for the Hornets. He was a four time winner of the Hornets Squarehead Award as the top offensive lineman in a game this year. He is a four time All-MIAA pick having earned first team honors in 2013 and 2016 and third time honors in 2014 and 2015.

JAMIE THIEMAN *N.W. Missouri* **6-4 280 OG**

All-American and first team All-MIAA performer in 2016. Allowed a league-low seven sacks and blocked for the conference's top-ranked scoring and total offense.

MALCOLM WILLETT *Augustana* **6-4 306 OG**

Played in all 11 games, making 10 starts at right guard. Helped Augustana set single season records for total offense (5,617 yards), passing yards (3,786) and touchdowns (65).

JORDAN WILLIAMS *Ferris State* **6-4 290 OG**

Transfer from University of Missouri. Three-year starter at FSU during which the Bulldogs had an incredible run in the GLIAC and the playoffs.

LEONARD WOOD *Western Oregon* **6-3 335 OG**

Big bodied guard and transfer from American River. A project, coachable with good basic skills.
