

DANTE ABSHER *Glenville State* **6-1 181 WR**
2016 All-MEC First Team. Runs crisp routes and won't be denied. Good speed and cutting ability. Great for the slot. Team's leading receiver by far. 2016 Stats: 78 rec, 870 yds, 11.15 avg, 12 TDs.

KYLE ADKINS *Western (CO)* **6-2 193 WR**
All-RMAC Honorable Mention. Led the team in reception yardage (612) and receiving TDs (9) for the second year in a row.

JALEN AMIS *Upper Iowa University* **5-11 183 WR**
Named to the All-NSIC Honorable Mention list for the second straight year. A season after breaking both the Upper Iowa and Northern Sun Conference record for receptions in a season with 108 catches, which was second best in all of NCAA Division II a year ago, Amis pulled in 72 passes which tied for third in the conference. This season's 899 receiving yards are the sixth highest total in the NSIC, while his 81.7 yards/game rank seventh. Amis got off to a slow start with just 17 catches in the first four games, but big games against Southwest Minnesota State University (13), Augustana University (13) and Wayne State (10) got the receiver back near the top of the conference. Added 76 yards on the ground on 12 carries for a 6.3 yard average per carry. During his two seasons in Peacock blue, Amis caught 180 passes for 1,779 yards and 10 touchdowns.

JOSH ANGULO *Sioux Falls* **6-0 209 WR**
Earned his second, second-team All-NSIC honor and his third all-league honor after being honorable mention a year ago. He has 63 receptions for 770 yards (17th, NSIC) and eight TDs (7th, NSIC). With 205 career receptions, Angulo has moved up to third on USF's all-time receiving list. He has a season-career best 15 catches for 164 yards (1, 4, 43) vs. Bemidji State that tied a school record.

JOEY AUGUSTIN *Charleston* **6-4 200 WR**
2015 All-MEC First Team; 2016 Honorable Mention. Great height and ability to get downfield. A playmaker. 2016 Stats: 47 rec, 795 yds, 16.91 avg, 8 TDs; 21 carries, 156 yds, 7.4 avg, TD.

ANTHONY AUTRY *Texas A&M-Kingsville* **6-2 190 WR RS**
Transfer from Georgia Tech. Picked up back-to-back All-LSC first team nods and added an honorable selection as a return specialist. The wideout finished the regular season with 42 catches for 686 yards – both team highs – and seven touchdowns. He also picked up three carries for 79 yards and averaged 24.9 yards per return. Autry had four receptions for 109 yards and three scores in the 68-7 win over Simon Fraser University and ended the regular season with three 100-plus reception games.

XAVIER AYERS *Western New Mexico* **5-11 180 WR**

All-American, D2CCA All-Super Region 4 Second-Team, Lone Star Conference Receiver of the Year and was a First-Team Lone Star Conference selection most of the awards were for the second consecutive year. Put together his second-straight 1,000-yard plus receiving season going for 1,025 yards on 80 catches and added nine touchdowns. He averaged 93.2 yards per game and averaged 12.8 yards per completion. He had a long reception of 75 yards and started in all 11 games. He led the LSC in receiving yards, receiving yards per game and receptions per game. He was second in the conference in receiving touchdowns and was ninth in all-purpose yards per game. Ayers was ninth nationally in receptions per game (7.3), 26th in receiving yards, 30th in receiving yards per game and 43rd in receiving touchdowns. He had six games with at least 100 receiving yards, going for a season-high 165 yards against nationally-ranked Midwestern State. A calling card of Ayers throughout his career was his ability to raise his game against the best teams and he did that as well with 123 receiving yards against nationally-ranked Texas A&M-Commerce. His top receiving touchdown game of three came against UT Permian Basin. He had four games with multiple touchdowns. If his receiving numbers weren't enough, he added a 34-yard pass against Oklahoma Panhandle State. In the past two seasons alone, Ayers caught 171 passes for 2,381 yards and 14 touchdowns. He started all 22 games over those two years.

LARRY BAKER-BRUCE *Eastern New Mexico* **6-0 175 WR**

What do you say about a guy who is on a team that is run-heavy, where one WR got 9 times more targets than everyone else and he only had 9 receptions but 5 were for TDs and he averaged 30.1 yds/catch. We say worth a look.

BJ BALDWIN *Notre Dame College* **6-0 195 WR TE**

Earned Super Region I First Team honors as an undersized TE, making him the first student athlete in the history of the program to do so. Also earned First Team All-MEC honors after finishing an incredible season where he came through with a number of huge catches throughout the year. He had one of the biggest grabs in the history of the program, as he hauled in a 44-yard Hail Mary touchdown pass from Malik Grove on the last play of the game to defeat Glenville State, 34-28, on Oct. 1. Baldwin finished the season with 25 receptions for 466 yards and five touchdowns, including two in the final game against WV Wesleyan.

JORDAN BERRY *Wingate* **5-11 170 WR RS**

2nd Team All-SAC. Finished his career as one of the best wide receivers in the history of Wingate University football. He caught at least one pass in 43 of 43 career games. The Dutch Fork High School graduate led the 2016 Bulldog receiving corps with 717 receiving yards (third in the SAC) on 48 total catches with three touchdowns. Berry also ranked third in the conference with 65.2 receiving yards per contest. He compiled 1076 all-purpose yards on the season. Berry posted 246 yards of kick-off returns and 114 yards of punt returns.

DYLAN BLUNK *Findlay* **5-10 192 WR**

Appeared and started in all 11 games. Earned honorable mention all-GLIAC honors. Made 60 receptions. Had 610 receiving yards. Caught three touchdown passes. Tied a school record with 15 catches on Oct. 8 vs. Wayne State. Had season high 118 yards in that game against Wayne State. In his career, appeared in 40 games and made at least one reception in 34 of those games. Had 33 straight games with at least one reception.

BEAU BOFFERDING *Minnesota-Duluth* **5-8 190 WR RS**

Was selected All-NSIC as a return specialist, wide receiver and running back and is believed to be the first individual to attain All-NSIC honors at three different positions. 2016 Stats: 87 carries, 589 yds, 6.8 avg, 12 TDs; 43 rec, 517 yds, 12.0 avg, 7 TDs; 31 KOR, 890 YDS, 28.7 avg.

GARRY BROWN *California University of Pennsylvania* **6-1 200 WR RS**

Team's first AP All-American since 2012. led NCAA Division II with 26 total touchdowns and led wide receivers at all NCAA levels in scoring at 13.0 points per game. He ranked second in the country with 22 receiving touchdowns and also finished fifth with 1,475 receiving yards on 91 receptions. Brown set single-season school records for receiving yards, receiving touchdowns, all-purpose yards (2,219), total touchdowns (26) and points (156) as a senior. Brown finished with multiple receiving touchdowns in 10 games this year and scored three total touchdowns in a game five times. He eclipsed the century mark in receiving yards in the last five games of the year and posted seven 100-yard games in 2016. Brown ranked fourth in the country with 184.92 all-purpose yards per game after totaling nearly 700 combined return yards, highlighted by three returns for touchdowns (two punt, one kickoff). Brown broke each of the school's all-time receiving records in 2016. He shattered the receiving yardage record by over 1,000 yards, as he closed his career ranked fifth in Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) history with 3,761 receiving in just three years as a starter. Brown totaled 222 career receptions, which is over 50 catches more than the previous school record that was held by former NFL wide receiver Perry Kemp since 1983. A dynamic playmaker, Brown finished his career tied for seventh in league history with 43 receiving touchdowns, as the previous school mark was 28 career receiving touchdowns.

MARCUS BROWN *Chadron* **6-2 200 WR**

Chosen for the National Bowl. Had an okay season but tall receivers will get extra looks. 2016 Stats: 18 rec, 231 yds, 12.8 avg, 2 TDs.

OTIS BROWN *Fort Valley State* **6-2 195 WR QB**

FCS Bowl selectee. Ended the year as an SIAC All-Conference First Team player, SIAC Eastern Division and SIAC Champions. He had 244 yards rushing on 11 carries, three touchdowns, while completing 51-of-106 passes for 771 yards and seven touchdowns. Brown also led the Wildcats with 23 catches for 265 yards and seven touchdowns.

BILLY BROWN *Shepherd* **6-4 236 WR**

2016 Don Hansen's Football Gazette All-Super Region One 1st Team. Played in the East-West Shrine Game. Led the Rams with 99 receptions for 1,580 yards and 22 touchdown grabs. All three marks are school single-season records. Brown ranked second nationally in receiving yards and receiving touchdowns. 2015 D-II All-America 1st Team.

B.J. BUNN *UNC-Pembroke* **6-0 210 WR**

2016 Don Hansen Super Region 2. A three-year starter for the Braves, Bunn registered 70 catches for a career-best 1,142 yards and 10 touchdowns this season, while also returning 14 punts for 64 yards as well. His senior season included six 100-yard receiving games, including a 7-catch, 205-yard showing in the win over Kentucky Wesleyan.

TYRONE CARTER *Chowan* **6-1 185 WR**

All-CIAA Second Team. Led the CIAA with 1,099 receiving yards on the season. He recorded 50 receptions with nine touchdowns for the Hawks. Transfer from University of Louisiana-Monroe. 2016 Stats: 50 rec, 1099 yds, 22.0 avg, 9 TDs.

KELLY CARTER *Urbana University* **5-10 175 WR RS**

Team's #2 receiver with proven ability to get deep. Averaged over 17 yds/rec gaining 511 yds on 30 receptions with 5 TDs. Has served as the primary return guy in the past.

BRYCE CHAVIS *Washburn* **5-9 180 WR RS**

Was a third team all-MIAA pick after earning honorable mention all-MIAA honors last season. Chavis led the Ichabods with 39 catches for 628 yards and four touchdowns while averaging 16.1 yards per catch. Chavis also led the Ichabods in all-purpose yards per game with 73.0. Returned a punt for an 83 yd TD.

KEELAN COLE *Kentucky Wesleyan* **6-2 175 WR**

Named to the D2football.com First-Team All-American and the Associated Press Little All-America First-Team. He was also named to the Don Hansen First-Team All-America. Received recognition from the Great Midwest Athletic Conference, being named both the Offensive and Special Teams Player of the Year. All three selections came as an all-purpose player. Led the nation in kickoffs returned for touchdowns with two, and ranked second in all-purpose yards, averaging 198.1-yards per game. He ranked fourth in both receiving yards (1,401) and yards per reception (24.6), while finishing fifth in receiving yards per game (127.4). Cole tabbed 15 receiving touchdowns, good for seventh in the nation, and averaged 29.4-yards per kickoff return, a mark good for 14th.

LEVI COPELIN *Pittsburg State* **6-2 190 WR**

Honorable Mention All-American, first-team All-MIAA. Led the MIAA in receiving with 60 catches for 1,012 yards and 10 touchdowns. The Broken Arrow, Okla., native averaged 16.9 yards per catch and 92.0 receiving yards per game. Transfer from Umissouri, possesses good speed and is a solid special teams performer.

CJ DAVIS *Shepherd* **5-10 192 WR RS**

Moved from corner to WR in 2016. Earned All-MEC Second Team accolades as a return specialist, returning 28 kickoffs for 764 yards, (27.29 avg.) and two punt returns for nine yards. Named MEC Special Teams Player of the Week for Nov. 14 following his performance in the regular season finale, with two kickoff returns for 96 yards and a touchdown reception. Second on the team in receiving yards, with 69 catches for 1,235 yards and nine touchdown receptions. Reached the No. 1 spot in the program's record for career combined return yards with 3,437. 2015 D-II All-America Honorable mention as a RS.

VINCE DINKEL Bemidji State 6-2 188 WR

Two-time All-NSIC. Caught 29 passes for 449 yards to rank third for the Beavers' receiving corps. He brought in three touchdown passes and averaged 40.8 yards per game. Dinkel ended the regular season with 999 career receiving yards and nine touchdowns.

JERMEIL DOUSE Concord University 5-10 180 WR RS

In 2016, started in 10 of 11 games for Concord. All-purpose receiver for CU that caught 54 passes for 755 yards and five touchdowns. Added 23 rushes for 121 yards and tossed a touchdown at UNC-Pembroke. Returned eight punts for 42 yards. Transfer from Alabama State.

JAMION DUNNING Lane 5-10 165 WR RS

All-SIAC as a RS. Good returnman who came off of the bench as a WR. 2016: 12 rec, 115 yds, 9.6 avg, TD; 13 PR, 151 yds, 11.6 avg; 12 KR, 304 yds, 25.3 avg.

Trenton EARL Clark-Atlanta 6-3 165 WR

Hauled in 34 receptions for 665 yards and found the end zone six times. Three times this season - twice versus SIAC opponents - Earl eclipsed 100 yards receiving and scored in five-consecutive games. Averaged 19.56 yds/rec. He was named SIAC 1st Team.

K'SHUN EVANS Delta State University 6-4 195 WR

Started all 10 games for the Statesmen. Led DSU with 48 receptions for 511 yards and a touchdown. Averaged 10.6 yards per catch and 51.1 yards per game receiving. Career-high eight receptions for 91 yards versus West Florida and at West Alabama. Caught six passes for 70 yards and touchdown versus Shorter. His 48 receptions ranked sixth in the GSC at the end of the regular season.

BREION EVANS Midwestern State 6-1 195 WR

Honorable mention All-LSC. Had 32 rec., 484 yards, and 5 TDs in 2016. Average 15.1 yds/rec and led team in yardage, receptions and TDs.

LANCE EVANS Texas A&M-Commerce 6-3 200 WR

Repeat First Team All-Lone Star Conference. Finished fourth in the LSC in receiving yards per game. Caught 42 passes for 662 yards in 10 games for the Lions as a senior. Fifth in the LSC with eight touchdown catches. Had four catches for 123 yards and a touchdown against Delta State. Season-high seven receptions for 110 yards and two touchdowns against Panhandle State. Also had two touchdown catches against Angelo State. Had six catches for 87 yards and a touchdown for the Lions in their second round playoff game against Grand Valley State. Finished A&M-Commerce career with 101 receptions for 1,753 yards and 16 touchdowns in 37 career games.

KENNY FEYH *Ferris State* **6-6 227 WR**

Played key role on FSU's 2014 GLIAC Championship & NCAA Playoff squad as a starting wideout in the FSU offense. Had 15 catches for 192 yards and five touchdowns in his first season with the program after his transfer from College of the Canyons. Has had injury problems since then. Caught only 3 passes for 1 TD and appeared in 7 games in 2016.

MICHAEL FINE *Arkansas Tech* **6-5 219 WR**

A very consistent and reliable receiver. Good hands and great target. 2016 Stats: 26 rec, 384 yds, 14.77 avg, 3 TDs.

MITCHELL FOOTE *Emporia State* **6-3 186 WR**

2016 Don Hansen Football Committee All-Super Region Three Team. Led the MIAA with 75 receptions, 12 touchdown catches, and 1,016 receiving yards on the year. He was a unanimous first-team All-MIAA selection and ends his career ranked second at Emporia State with 215 catches and 30 receiving touchdowns while finishing with 2,594 receiving yards.

KEVIN GENEVRO *Clarion University* **6-2 195 WR**

2016 NCAA Division II All-Super Region One 1st Team. Posted one of the best seasons in program history at the wide receiver position, finishing the year with team highs in catches (65), receiving yardage (1,096) and touchdowns (13), the last of which ranked as the best on the team at all positions. He became just the third player in program history to top 1,000 receiving yards in a season, and this year's campaign ranks as the second-best in that regard. Genevoro's 13 touchdown receptions are tied for second for a single-season in program history, and he graduates from Clarion ranking near the top of the list in career receiving yards (9th) and receiving touchdowns (3rd)

LEO GILBERT *Tuskegee* **6-3 204 WR TE**

Named to the D2CCA Super Region 2 2nd Team offense as a TE. A first All-SIAC selection. The senior finished the year with a career-high 20 receptions for 394 yards - good for third on the team in both categories. He also recorded five touchdown receptions.

CHRIS GILCHRIST *West Texas A&M* **6-5 200 WR**

Red-shirted at Florida Atlantic. Transferred to WT A&M from Mt. San Antonio where he was an MVP receiver. Size and basic ability make him an interesting prospect. 2016 Stats: 20 rec, 326 yds, 16.3 avg, 4 TDs.

FABIAN GUERRA *Fairmont State* **5-10 180 WR**

Shattered the career receptions record at Fairmont State by hauling in 233 receptions for 2,805 yards and 19 touchdowns during his storied FSU football career that ended with the Falcons earning a berth in the NCAA Division II Playoffs for the first time in school history.

Guerra's 76 receptions as a senior were a career high and is the second-highest total in a single-season at Fairmont State. Guerra also leaves Fairmont State in second in career receiving yards (2,805) and is tied for third in career touchdowns with 19. 2nd Team All-MEC receiver whose one-handed catch lit in 2014 up the internet. National Bowl selectee.

RISHAWN HARRIS *New Haven* **6-0 185 WR**

Appeared in 10 games for the Chargers. Caught 24 passes for 401 yards and 5 TDs. Averaged 16.7 yds/reception.

ANAS HASIC *West Florida* **5-10 215 WR**

Earned a spot on the All-GSC second team after catching 46 balls for 719 yards with eight touchdown receptions. Tied for first in the GSC in TD catches, sixth in yards and eighth in receptions. His 15.6 yards per catch led the team and was eighth in the GSC, while his 65.4 yards per game were sixth. Not a prima donna receiver. Croatian born Hasic is hard-nosed and physical. Transfer from North Carolina Central where he tarterd all 11 games in 2014 at wide receiver and ranked third on the team and top 10 in the MEAC with 530 yards on 36 receptions with 14.7 yards per catch and 44.2 yards per game.

CHARLIE HAYES *Augustana* **5-9 176 WR**

A two-time All-NSIC First Team selection and made his second straight appearance on the Don Hansen All-Super Region Three Team. Hayes finished the 2016 season hauling in 53 passes for 787 yards and six touchdowns. He put up two 200-plus receiving yard performances on the season. Hayes caught 15 passes for 214 yards and a touchdown against Minnesota State on Oct. 15 before catching 11 passes for 232 yards at Upper Iowa on Oct. 22. Hayes finished his career at Augustana catching 160 passes for 2,397 yards and 26 touchdowns.

TY HEADEN *New Haven* **6-0 190 WR**

First Team All-Conference. Pulled in 56 receptions, a career-high 991 yards and eight touchdowns. He finishes his New Haven career second all-time with 179 catches and is fourth in program history with 2,416 receiving yards.

MATT HELLER *Augustana* **6-0 195 WR**

Named to the Associated Press Little All-America First Team. He earned CCA All-America Second Team honors after being named to the CCA All-Super Region Three First Team. Heller was a First Team All-NSIC selection in 2016 after finishing the year ranked second in the country with an Augustana and NSIC single season record 1,490 receiving yards. He also led the NSIC and finished second in the country with 21 receiving touchdowns, which also set single season Augustana and NSIC records. Heller had 100-plus receiving yards in 8 of 11 games, including 240-plus yards twice. He caught a career-high three touchdown passes in a game five times and finished his career with 3,389 receiving yards and the most touchdown catches in program history with 38.

ANDREW HERNANDEZ *Oklahoma Panhandle State* **5-8 172 WR**

Team leader in receptions. Good route-runner with good hands. Hard-working. 2016 Stats: 50 rec, 597 yds, 11.94 avg, 4 TD.

JAMEL HICKS *Wayne State (MI)* **5-11 170 WR RS**

2016: Earned Second Team All-GLIAC honors ... started all 11 games. Saw action on the punt return team vs. the Timberwolves, served as the holder for PAT/FG in three games. Concluded the regular-season sixth in the GLIAC with a career-best 834 receiving yards, accounted for 38 percent of the team's receptions (51 of 133) and 43 percent of the squad's receiving yards (834 of 1,931). Garnered seven of the team's 14 touchdown catches, finished third on the team with 910 all-purpose yards. Set career-highs in receptions (51) and touchdown receptions (7). Was 32nd among all active D2 players in career yards per catch (15.6). Played in 32 career games, making 25 starts and finished fourth in school history with 1,799 receiving yards, fifth in receptions (115) and tied-for-fifth in touchdown receptions (13), sixth in catches per game (3.59 - minimum of 20 games played), seventh in average yards per catch (15.64 - minimum of 40 receptions), tied-for-20th in touchdowns scored (15), tied-for-29th in scoring (90 points), and 31st in all-purpose yards (1,938)

SHANE HUBBARD *LIU-Post* **6-1 202 WR**

Football Gazette All-Super Region I Second Team. ECAC All-Star First Team. Fueled the LIU Post receiving corps in 2016 with a team-high 92 catches for 1,048 yards and nine touchdowns. It was the second time in three years that he eclipsed the 1,000-yard single-season plateau. Furthermore, Hubbard broke the program's three career receiving records (yards, receptions and touchdowns) in his final campaign as a Pioneer.

BRAXTON IVERY *Newberry* **5-10 195 WR**

2nd Team All-SAC. Was a versatile weapon for Newberry this season. Ivery was third on the team and sixth in the conference in receiving yards, netting 605 yards and four touchdowns on 54 catches. He also added 172 yards and three touchdowns on the ground, sometimes on handoffs and at other times taking direct snaps at quarterback in a wildcat formation. His rushing touchdowns of 10 and 49 yards on consecutive fourth-quarter offensive snaps gave Newberry the win over Wingate, and he totaled 153 all-purpose yards in the contest with 74 yards on the ground and 79 on four catches. Also played QB/WR in 2015.

DEANDRE JACKSON *Clark-Atlanta* **5-3 167 WR RS**

Led the SIAC in kick return average (26.4 yards/return) and punt return average (7.8 yards / return) in SIAC games and was selected to the All-SIAC team as a kick returner. Overall, he returned 28 kicks for 676 yards (24.1 yards / return) and led the Panthers in all purpose yards with 1,033 yards (199 receiving, 158 on punt returns, and 676 on kick returns) to average 103.3 yards/ game. His 834 combined returned yards led the SIAC and ranked No. 5 nationally.

DEVANTE JENKINS *Southern Connecticut* **6-3 210 WR**

Collected 2nd Team All-Conference laurels for the second year in a row after leading the Owls in all major receiving categories. He totaled 49 catches for 850 yards and nine touchdowns. Jenkins ranked second in the NE-10 in yards per catch, third in touchdown receptions, fourth in total yards and fifth in yards per game. He closed his SCSU career ranked tied for fourth in touchdown receptions (24), eighth in receptions (115) and ninth in receiving yards (1,720).

AARON JOHNSON *Eastern New Mexico* **6-5 208 WR**

2nd Team All-LSC. One of the league's most explosive receivers despite being on a run-heavy team. This season and led the league in yards for catch (19.7) for any player with at least 30 receptions. Caught 5 almost times as many balls (43) as his nearest teammate (9). He also was third in receiving yards (848). Had 5 TDs. Johnson topped the century mark on three occasions this season and finished with five touchdowns. Against NCAA tournament participant Southwest Baptist and the Wagon Wheel game against West Texas A&M, he showed versatility with 30-yard runs.

CAMERON JOHNSON *Winona State* **6-3 227 WR**

2016 Don Hansen All-Region, NSIC First Team. Led the Warriors in all main receiving categories, including; receiving yards, receiving catches and touchdown catches. He finished 2016 with 69 catches, 1,239 yards and 13 touchdowns. Johnson was third in touchdown catches, third in receiving yards, third in receiving yards per game and sixth in the NSIC in catches.

STRATRON JONES *Midwestern State* **5-9 180 WR**

Honorable mention All-LSC. Three-year starter. In 2016, had 28 rec., 451 yards, 3 TDs. Averaged 16.1 yds/rec. As a Junior (2015), was a second-team All-Lone Star Conference performer as the teams leading receiver.

AL LASKER *Henderson State* **6-3 205 WR RS**

In 2013, was selected Third-Team All-American Return Specialist by Beyond College Sports. Transfer from Central Arkansas. Good speed, deep threat. 2016 Stats: 25 rec, 453 yds, 18.12 avg, 6 TDs.

SCOTT LATHROP *Missouri Southern* **5-11 180 WR**

All-MIAA. Was second in the MIAA this year with 66 receptions. He finished the season with 491 yards and an average of 7.4 per catch. Transfer from SE Missouri.

QUAD LAW *Gannon* **5-7 180 WR RS**

Small but sturdy WR with Good acceleration and hands. Team's leading receiver with twice as many catches as closest teammate. 2016 Stats: 52 rec, 598 yds, 11.5 avg, 4 TDs.

RAPHAEL LAWSON-GAYLE *SW Minnesota* **5-10 173 WR RS**

Honorable Mention All-NSIC AS A RS. Led the NSIC in kick return average (32.9) and was seventh in all purpose yards (120.4). Lawson-Gayle finished the season with 21 kick returns for 690 yards. He had kick returns of 40, 76, 73 and 53 yards in four of the last six games of the season. As a wide receiver, he led SMSU with seven touchdown receptions and ranked second in both receptions (39) and receiving yards (600).

MATT LEHMAN *Clarion University* **6-3 200 WR**

2nd Team All-PSAC West. Put a punctuation mark on one of the great careers in Clarion history, with the senior tying the Golden Eagles' 21-year-old career receiving touchdowns record late in the year and finishing near the top of the list in all major receiving categories. He snagged his 25th career touchdown pass against Gannon on Nov. 5, tying Terry McFetridge's record set in 1985, and finish his career ranking third in receiving yards (2,457), fourth in receptions (156) and tied for fourth in career touchdowns (25) among all Clarion offensive players.

ANTON MCCALLUM *West Liberty* **6-0 185 WR**

Was team's #1 receiver before D-I transfer arrived in 2016. As #2 target he continued to show his ability to get down field for the long pass or as a result of yards after the catch. 2016 Stats: 40 rec, 665 yds, 16.6 avg, 7 TDs.

DAVON MCGILL *Concord University* **6-3 220 WR**

2016: Played in all 11 games for CU caught 37 passes for 536 yards and three touchdowns added 13 rushes for 111 yards and two scores. First career 100-yard came against Notre Dame after catching seven passes for 124 yards. Career-best 158 yards on six receptions and two touchdowns at West Virginia State. Was a LB in 2015. WR in 2014.

LAKE MCGUFFIE *Morehouse* **6-3 175 WR**

Good, tall receiver who suffered from a so-so passing game; especially after his brother's exit in game five. Tied for second in receptions. 2016 Stats: 22 rec, 305 yds, 13.86 avg, 3 TDs.

LANCE MCGUFFIE *Morehouse* **6-0 175 WR**

Was on his way to what appeared to be a stellar season when his season ended early in game five. Continuously averaged 13 or so yds/rec through his career. Was only 5 receptions behind team leader despite only appearing in 5 games and no receiver surpassed his 3 TD receptions. 2016 Stats: 19 rec, 252 yds, 13.26 avg, 3 TDs.

GORDON MCLEOD *Stonehill* **6-1 175 WR**

All-Northeast-10 second team. Finished his senior season with a team-high 46 receptions for a team-best 556 yards and five touchdowns, averaging 12.1 yards per catch and 50.5 yards per game. He ranks ninth in the NE-10 for receptions and yards per game, while ranking eighth for touchdowns and tenth for yards per reception. McLeod posted a career-high ten receptions for a career-best 132 yards and a touchdown at NE-10 regular season champions Assumption College in week ten. Wraps up his Stonehill career ranked third in program history with 143 receptions, fifth with 1,906 yards and 15 touchdowns in 43 career games played. He also posted 1,972 career all-purpose yards and scored 16 total touchdowns, having added one rushing score over his career. McLeod was an NE-10 All-Rookie Team selection as a freshman.

DAN MONTEROSO *West Liberty* **6-3 195 WR**

2016 All-Mountain East Conference 2nd team. Had only one season with the Hilltoppers after transferring from Purdue but made the most of it. The athletic wideout led WLU and ranked among the MEC leaders with 57 catches for 918 yards and 14 TDs. He also served double-duty as West Liberty's punter, averaging better than 36 yards per punt with 18 of his punts pinning the opponents inside their 20.

DAVID MOORE *East Central* **6-2 225 WR**

Don Hansen All-Super Region Three Third Team. The All-GAC First Team selection, finished the season with 878 receiving yards, 10 receiving TDs, 74 rushing yards and a touchdown. Added 421 yards on kick returns and 46 on punt returns for 1,419 all-purpose yards. During his career with the Tigers, Moore recorded 2,776 receiving yards and 35 TDs, with both setting new career records for ECU. He also recorded his first career rushing touchdown in the final game of his career. This is the second-straight season that Moore has been named to the Don Hansen team, after he received First Team Offensive honors in 2015.

ANTHONY MULLINS *William Jewell* **5-8 170 WR**

All-GLVC second team. Led the Cardinals in receiving with 63 catches for 782 yards and three touchdowns. Mullins finished fourth in the GLVC in All-Purpose yards and had two kick return touchdowns in 2016.

SHAZZON MUMPHREY *New Haven* **6-3 218 WR**

A JUCO QB who originally committed to Florida A&M. A talented athlete who never carved out his role at UNH. 2016 Stats: 7 rec, 132 yds, 18.9 avg.

MARK MUNSON *Angelo State* **6-0 205 WR**

A decent deep-threat on a run-first team. Very good after the catch; took one pass 99 yards to the house. Caught 22 passes for 426 yards, a 19.36 avg, and 7 TDs. Even minus the 99 yarder he averaged over 15 yards/catch.

MARCEL NEWSON *Mississippi College* **WR RS**

Named an American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Second Team All-American, a D2CCA All-Super Region 2 selection, a finalist for the C Spire Conerly Trophy (Mississippi's top four-year college football player), a Harlon Hill Trophy candidate and a First Team All-Gulf South Conference selection as a wide receiver and return specialist. Over his two years as a Choctaws, Marcel caught 97 passes for 1,509 yards and 13 touchdowns, while adding two rushing touchdowns, two punt return touchdowns and a kickoff return for a score to record 18 touchdowns over 19 games played. In 2016, Newson led the GSC with 180.6 all-purpose yards per game and 94.8 receiving yards per game. His all-purpose yards mark was good enough to finish 5th nationally, while he set single-season school records for receptions per game (6.33) and all-purpose yards per game.

RYAN NOLAN *Chowan* **5-11 190 WR**

Earned a spot on the CIAA Honorable Mention Team after notching 106 rushing yards for two touchdowns and hauling in 50 receptions for 830 yards with four touchdowns. Also threw three touchdown passes this season.

MANN'S NYME *Bowie State* **6-4 212 WR**

All-CIAA First Team (2015, 2016), BOXTOROW All-American (2015), Team Coach's Award (2015), Dr. Calvin's 2015 Mid-Major First Team (2015). Transfer from WV Wesleyan. Name is etched all over the Bowie State Bulldogs record book as the all-time leader in receptions in a game, receptions in a season, career receptions, reception yards in a game, reception yards in a season and career reception yards. 2016 Stats: 83 rec, 1241 yds, 15.0 avg, 8 TDs.

PARK PARISH *Harding* **5-10 185 WR QB**

GAC Offensive Player of the Year as flexbone QB. Led Harding with 910 rushing yards and 17 rushing touchdowns. He also completed 21 passes for 479 yards and three touchdowns.

JAMESON PARSONS *St. Cloud State* **6-2 201 WR**

Don Hansen Second Team All-Region selection as a wide receiver. Parsons caught 71 passes for 1,142 yards and seven touchdowns in 2016. He led the team and placed fourth in the conference in receiving yards. His 1,000 yard season was only the seventh in school history and he is one of only two players at the school to record back-to-back 1,000 yard receiving seasons. Parsons 1,142 yards receiving is the fourth-most in a single season in school history, while his 71 catches are the fifth-most in the school record books for a single campaign. Despite only working as a wide receiver for two seasons (Former QB), Parsons ended his SCSU career with 132 catches (eight) for 2,414 yards (sixth), 16 receiving touchdowns (eighth) for an average of 18.29 yards per catch (10th). Earlier in the off-season, Parsons was a First Team All-NSIC selection as a wide receiver, earned the 2016 NSIC Glen Galligan Award, was a CoSIDA Second Team Academic All-American, was a nominee for the Harlon Hill Trophy and earned selection to the 2016 Division II Conference Commissioner's Association (CCA) All-Super Region 3 Second Team.

ERIC POINDEXTER *Quincy* **5-11 174 WR**

Unanimous selections to the All-GLVC first team. Set the program single-season records for receptions (69), yards (1,331) and touchdowns (13). He led the GLVC in yards and receiving touchdowns and was second in the league in receptions. He was also fifth in Division II in receiving yards and 13th in receiving touchdowns. Also led the GLVC and ranked third nationally in all-purpose yardage at 192.2 per game. The two-time All-GLVC first team standout is the program's all-time leader in receiving yards (3,057) and touchdowns (33). Poindexter ranks second in total receptions (173). He graduates as Division II's active leader in receiving yards per game at 95.5 over his three seasons at Quincy. Reached 100 receiving yards five times this season.

CONNOR PULLEY *Central Oklahoma* **6-4 228 WR**

Third Team All-MIAA. Pulley led the Bronchos with 53 catches and 948 yards receiving. The catches rank as the eighth-best season in UCO history, and the yards are the seventh-most in school history for one season. Pulley finished his career with the Bronchos with 106 receptions (9th all-time), 1,909 yards (7th all-time), and 14 touchdowns.

DESMOND REECE *Tuskegee* **5-10 165 WR**

HBCU Gameday Division II All-American team first team selection. finished the season with 58 receptions for 910 yards with 10 touchdowns, all while averaging 15.69 yards per reception and 75.83 yards per game. The yardage put up by Reece was the highest since 2007 and is the fifth-highest in school history. The senior also hauled in the fourth-highest total number of receptions in school history and finished just three receptions short of third all-time in school history.

AUBREY REED *Dixie State* **6-1 205 WR**

Led the Trailblazers in receiving in 2016, logging 33 receptions for 538 yards and three touchdowns. Chosen to play in the College Gridiron Showcase.

JUWAAN RICHARD *Bemidji State* **5-11 171 WR RS**

Two-time All-NSIC. Ranked third in the NSIC with 644 kickoff return yards and averaged 26.8 yards per return. He was one of two returners in the conference to bring a kickoff back for a touchdown. In addition to his kickoff return work, Richard led the BSU receiving corps with 32 receptions and eight touchdown receptions. He totaled 560 receiving yards, averaging 17.5 yards per reception and 50.1 receiving yards per game. Richard ranked third on BSU in points scored with 54.

ZACH RICHTER *Colorado School of Mines* **5-11 185 WR**

Good possession receiver, can make the hard catch over the middle - in traffic. 2016 Stats: 78 rec, 712 yds, 9.13 avg, 4 TDs.

TRE' ROBY *Lindenwood* **5-8 171 WR RS**

Transfer from Ball State. Had 6 TDs and averaged 17.6 yds/rec in 9 games.

PHIL ROMERO *Adams State* **5-10 190 WR**

Honorable Mention RMAC. Concluded his ASU career in stellar fashion by posting 196 receiving yards and 3 touchdowns against New Mexico Highlands. All 3 of his touchdowns against the Cowboys came in the second quarter. The big game pushed him to a season total of 833 receiving yards on 61 receptions along with 9 touchdowns.

DELVON ROUSER *Lincoln (MO)* **6-0 225 WR ATH**

Was honored as an offensive utility player, on the All-GLVC second team. Started the season as a wide receiver, but due to injuries eventually began lining up as a fullback, H-back and tight end. Rouser made plays for LU as both a blocker and a receiver, and by the end of the season was lining up for nearly every offensive snap. Rouser tied for second on the team with 24 receptions for 210 yards and a score.

MARCUS SANCHEZ *South Dakota Mines* **6-2 205 WR**

Earned RMAC Second Teams honors as a wide receiver and proved to be a game changer for the Hardrockers this season. He broke the school record for career receiving touchdowns, catching 17 as a Hardrocker. This season he had six TD catches and has racked up 796 yards on 50 receptions. He ranked fourth in the RMAC for receiving yards per game (72.4).

SHAKUR SAUNDERS *Ferris State* **6-1 210 WR**

Quality receiver. Proven ability to get separation and get downfield. Good hands and concentration. 2016 Stats: 47 rec, 893 yds, 19.0 yds/rec and 4 TDs.

JOEY SCHENCK *Truman* **6-4 215 WR**

Wrapped up his Truman career with his second straight second-team all-GLVC mention. Schenck broke into Truman's top 25 in career receiving yards with 1,291 and finished eighth in career receptions with 127. On the season, Schenck was second in receptions with 37 and yards with 438 while catching eight touchdown passes.

COOPER SCHROEDER *Alderson Broaddus University* **6-3 205 WR TE**

Earned honorable mention honors on the Don Hansen All-America Team as undersized TE. Led AB with 381 receiving yards while grabbing two touchdowns on the year and finished with 21 receiving touchdowns in four seasons.

MITCHELL SEGOS *Notre Dame College* **6-2 200 WR**

Finished his career as the program's all-time leading receiver in several different statistical categories, including receptions, receiving yards, and touchdown receptions. Earned First Team All-MEC status, All-Region and his second Academic All-American honor. He set a program record on Oct. 1, when he caught 11 passes for 266 yards and a trio of touchdowns. The 266 yards are a program record, and second most in a single game in MEC history. Segos finished the year as the MEC's leader in receiving yards with 1,097, 15th best in D-II. He caught 12 touchdown passes, fourth most in the MEC and averaged 6.8 receptions per game. In his career, he produced three consecutive 1,000-yard receiving seasons, and caught at least one pass in each of his last 33 games.

GEORGE SEHL *N.W. Missouri* **6-3 207 WR**

All-MIAA honorable mention in 2015 & 2016. In 2016, caught 26 passes for 424 yards and four touchdowns. 2015: Appeared in all 15 games. Caught 32 passes for 551 yards and 7 TDs.

SHAWN SEIF *Lock Haven* **5-7 160 WR RS**

LHU's first All-American pick since 2003 became just the second player in school history to go over 1,000 yards receiving in a single season. His 1,282 receiving yards set a single-season record as did his 11 TD-receptions. Seif finished the season with 128.2 yards per game, which ranked first in the PSAC. After the regular season, his 64 catches ranked fifth in the PSAC, No. 1 in the PSAC East and highlighting his season was a four-TD effort in the historic win over East Stroudsburg. Seif's 128.2 receiving yards per game and his 1,282 total receiving yards were two of the best offensive outputs in all of NCAA Division II football.

AARON SEWARD *Carson-Newman* **6-0 180 WR**

A very good receiver on a team that runs more than twice as much as they pass. Proven ability to get deep, very good hands and concentration. 2016 Stats: 23 rec, 464 yds, 20.2 yds/rec, 3 TDs.

DARBY SMITH *Texas A&M-Commerce* **5-10 180 WR**

Earned second team all-LSC honors at wide receiver for the second consecutive season after leading qualifying players in yards per reception this season. Had 26 receptions for 537 yards, averaging 20.7 yards per catch. He had consecutive games of over 100 yards receiving against Midwestern State and Western New Mexico, scoring twice against MSU. Finished A&M-Commerce career with 88 catches for 1,652 yards and 14 touchdowns and an average of 18.8 yards per catch in 39 career games.

KEVIN SNEAD *Carson-Newman* **6-0 190 WR RS**

Transfer from Eastern Michigan. Listed as a DB but was primarily a RS and WR. Named the fastest man in college football by the US Track and Field/Cross Country Coaches Association of America. Snead set the Carson-Newman school records for the 100 and 200-meter dashes and earned All-America honors during indoor season in the 60. Team ran more than twice as much as they passed. 2016 Stats: 5 rec, 151 yds, 30.2 yds/rec, TD; 17 KR, 419 yds, 24.6 avg, TD, 90 long.

BUBBA TANDY *Tarleton* **6-1 190 WR RS**

2nd Team All-LSC WR wrapped up his senior season at Tarleton with 695 receiving yards and seven touchdowns on 42 receptions this season. Average a very respectful 16.55 yds/rec. Was Second-team all-LSC return specialist as a sophomore.

NATHAN TIDWELL *St. Joseph's (IN)* **6-4 205 WR**

Two-year starter at forward on the basketball team. In his only year on the football squad, he displayed good receiving skills and agility. Better route-running skills than expected. Picked up the offense well enough to be the team's third leading receiver with 24 receptions for 359 yards, a 14.96 average and 3 TDs.

TRAVION TUCKER *Kentucky Wesleyan* **6-4 185 WR**

Team's second leading receiver. Transfer from Adams State. A hard-working player who accentuates his natural ability with a strong work ethic. Great hands and tough to bring down after the catch. 2016 Stats: 46 rec, 624 yds, 13.57 avg, 6 TDs.

GABE VANDIVER *Central Missouri* **5-10 190 WR**

Earned his first All-MIAA award in his only season as a starter at UCM. Starting all 11 games, he rushed for 486 yards and four touchdowns on 104 carries, averaging 4.7 yards per rush. He also caught 18 passes for 169 yards and a score.

IAN WADDELL *West Virginia Wesleyan* **5-11 170 WR**

Team's leading receiver in terms of yardage (502 yds), yds/rec (16.7) and TDs (5). Transfer from Wagner.

JOE WALLACE *Wingate* **6-2 210 WR**

A sturdy, good-size, good hands receiver. Good route-runner and positive after the catch. 2016 Stats: 23 rec, 356 yds, 15.48 avg, 4 TDs.

DAVID WALTER *Michigan Tech* **6-2 215 WR**

2nd Team All-GLIAC. Hauled in 52 passes for 627 yards and two touchdowns during the course of the 2016 season. Walter averaged 5.2 receptions and 62.7 receiving yards per game to go along with 12.1 yards per catch. Walter also completed two passes on the season, including a 26-yard touchdown pass at Tiffin on October 15th. Walter wrapped up his career at Tech with 1,262 receiving yards and 11 touchdowns. His total catches and yards per game in 2016 were career highs.

DeSEAN WARREN *Lindenwood* **5-11 172 WR**

A transfer from North Dakota State. Honorable mention all-MIAA. Finished the season with 31 receptions for 831 receiving yards and five touchdowns.

DRE WASHINGTON *N.W. Missouri* **6-3 189 WR**

Tall receiver with good hands and quickness. Had to compete with multiple options at receiver. 2016: All-MIAA honorable mention as he had four touchdowns, recording 27 catches for 341 yards. 2015: 43 REC, 596 YDS, 13.9 AVG, 4 TDs. MIAA Academic honor roll in '15 & 14.

AKIL WASHINGTON *West Virginia State* **6-0 206 WR**

Was on his way to a stellar season until it ended in game 7 vs Notre Dame College. Akil already had 8 TDs and almost 400 yards receiving. Has recovered and attending various showcase games.

COLE WATSON *Newberry* **6-0 185 WR**

Earned honorable mention ECAC accolades after securing a first-team nod from the SAC. He was second on the team and fifth in the SAC with 697 yards and scored six touchdowns on his 51 catches. He netted a career-high 151 yards at Mars Hill, one of his three 100-yard games on the season. Was All-SAC at two spots, his second all-conference selection comes as a return specialist. He finished second in the league with 159 punt return yards on 23 attempts, including a season-long 39-yard return against Tusculum. He was the SAC Special Teams Player of the Week for returning three times for 25 yards, holding on all PAT attempts, and averaging 49.5 yards on four punts after being pressed into emergency punting duty at Brevard.

MARQUIS WELLS *Central State* **6-1 175 WR**

Was among the SIAC's top receivers in 2016. Led the SIAC with 4.8 receptions per game. He finished the season with 43 catches for 515 yards and 3 scores.

HENRY WESLEY *Arkansas Tech* **6-2 182 WR**

Good receiver who gets the most out of every reception. Team, however, was a run-heavy team. 2016 Stats: 19 rec, 396 yds, 20.84 avg, 3 TDs.

COURTNEY WHITEHEAD *Henderson State* **6-3 215 WR**

2nd Team All-GAC. Was Henderson's top receiver totaling 731 yards on 50 receptions. Had a season-best 165 yards on 7 catches against Arkansas Tech and also recorded 8 receptions for 142 yards against Northwestern Oklahoma.

MATT WILLIAMS *Grand Valley State* **6-2 195 WR**

All-GLIAC 1st-Team WR who was an All-GLIAC Second-Team selection a year ago, caught 44 passes for 807 yards and eight TDs during his senior campaign. He broke the 100-yard receiving mark three times, including a career-high 10 catches for 179 yards and two TDs versus Findlay. Williams, who averaged 18.3 yards per catch, ranked fifth in the GLIAC in receiving yards per game (80.7), seventh in receiving yards and TD catches. Williams ranks seventh in GVSU annals in all-time receptions with 128, fourth in receiving yards (2,345) and fifth in TD catches (28). Spent two years at Northern Illinois. Former QB turned WR. 2015: 2nd Team All-GLIAC as a wide receiver and punt returner.

KELLEN WILLIAMS *Kutztown* **6-0 220 WR**

Was one of three, two-year team captains for Kutztown this year and earned his third straight All-PSAC East First Team honor. He broke the three career receiving records at KU this year and was one of KU's top leaders during his final years. This season, Williams hauled in 59 catches for 830 yards and a career-high-tying nine touchdown catches – extremely consistent with his 2014 and 2015 campaigns. He ranked in the top-10 in the PSAC in each category and caught a pass in 38-of-39 career games, including a career-ending streak of 17 in a row.

Williams sits atop the KU record books with 214 career catches (t-12th in PSAC history), 2,970 receiving yards (18th) and 31 touchdowns (12th). He is also a three-time PSAC Scholar-Athlete and a Dean's List honoree.

THERON WILSON *Northwood* **6-2 194 WR**

Finished his career as one the best big-play threats in the country this season. He ranked third nationally in yards per reception, averaging 26.21 yards per catch. For the year, Wilson finished with 629 yards on 24 receptions. He led the team and ranked 12th in the GLIAC with six receiving touchdowns.

VERNEL WINGATE *SW Minnesota* **6-5 221 WR**

Really came on at the end of 2015 had 15 receptions in the final four games of the season, but was injured in the first game of 2016; and missed the rest of season. Great red zone target, reach.

PARIS WOODS *Northern Michigan* **6-2 205 WR**

All-GLIAC second team. Emerged as Northern Michigan's primary deep-ball threat, totaling 802 yards on just 35 receptions. He surpassed 100 receiving yards in five games and also matched a school record set in 1981 with a 92-yard touchdown catch on Oct. 1 against Walsh. Woods also tied for third in the GLIAC with 12 receiving touchdowns, which was 48 percent of the Wildcats' season total.

RALEIGH YELDELL *Newberry* **6-0 175 WR ATH**

Finished ninth in Harlon Hill Trophy voting as a QB and Newberry's first-ever finalist for the Division II Player of the Year award. Has a SAC Conference Offensive Player of the Year award, a first team all-SAC nod, four SAC Offensive Player of the Week honors, and one Eastern College Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Week awards to his credit this season. Played a major role in Newberry's conference championship, sparkling 7-0 league mark and 10-2 overall record, and No. 2 seed in the 2016 Division II Football Championship. Led the nation with a 70.3 percent completion rate, connecting on 260 of his 370 passes for a school-record 3,087 yards and 27 touchdowns. He added 331 yards and six scores on the ground to set a Newberry record and finish eighth in SAC history with 3,418 yards of total offense and 33 touchdowns accounted for. He also accumulated gaudy career totals, becoming the only Newberry player to pass for 5,000 yards and rush for 1,500 in a career.

JUSSE YORKE *Virginia Union* **6-2 190 WR**

Transfer from Old Dominion with breakaway speed, great moves, good hands. 2016 Stats: 43 rec, 474 yds, 11.0 avg, 7 TDs.

TY YOUNG *Colorado School of Mines* **6-5 205 WR**

Had a phenomenal senior season for the Orediggers, catching a career-high 13 touchdowns and matching his career-best with 843 yards. The deep threat averaged 13.2 yards per catch on 64 receptions, with his top games coming against CSU-Pueblo (110 yards, 1 TD), Colorado Mesa (96 yards, 2 TD), South Dakota Mines (84 yards, 2 TD), and at Black Hills State (61 yards, 3 TD). Young caught at least one touchdown in seven consecutive games during Mines' mid-season eight-game win streak. Both his yardage and touchdown totals ranked second in the RMAC, and his 13 touchdowns ranked 13th in NCAA Division II. In his career, Young caught 191 passes for 2,696 yards and 29 touchdowns, averaging 69.1 yards per game and 14.1 yards per catch over four seasons. A First-Team All-RMAC selection in 2016, he was also all-RMAC in 2013 and 2015.

JESSE ZALK *Central Washington* **5-8 165 WR RS**
First-Team All-Conference. Embedded himself as one of Central's most dynamic athletes this past season. Against Simon Fraser University, Zalk secured four CWU single game records (receiving yards, touchdowns scored, receiving touchdowns scored, and points scored), and two GNAC records (receiving yards, receiving touchdowns). In addition, Zalk became Central's new career leader in all-purpose yards, recording 5,200 all-purpose yards in his four years at CWU. Zalk is also just the third non quarterback in school history to record over 300 yards of total offense in a single game. In 2015: Ranked third in the nation in all-purpose yards (1,674). Recieved Second Team All-American and First Team All-Conference recognition. Started in nine games. Tallied 31 kick returns for 813 yards, including a 95 yard touchdown. Returned 19 punts for 176 yards and one touchdown. Caught 43 passes for 675 yards and four touchdowns. Rushed three times for 18 yards.
