

Marty & Matt's Small College Scouting Report



TYRIEK ABLE **AVERETT**

5-9 180 CB/

2017: Earned USA South First Team honors for the second consecutive season. He finished with 29 tackles and four interceptions, including one returned for a touchdown. He also had 10 pass breakups and two tackles for loss.

EUGENE ALLEN **HARTWICK**

6-1 195 CB/

2017: Started all 10 games for the Hawks at defensive back, ranked fourth on the team in tackles with 52, 44 unassisted hits, three passes broken up, one interception with a nine-yard return.

O'SHEA ANDERSON **WASHINGTON & JEFFERSON**

6-1 180 CB/

A consensus All-American, he also claimed First Team All-South Region accolades from D3football.com this year and First Team All-Presidents' Athletic Conference laurels in both 2016 and 2017, plus gathered First Team ECAC All-Star in 2017 and earned Second Team recognition in 2016. The 6-1 cornerback is tied for the lead across all levels of NCAA and NAIA football with nine interceptions on the year, while also breaking up 11 passes for a total of 20 passes defended, which is ninth in Division III. His nine interceptions are the third-most in a season in W&J history and his 13 career interceptions are the fifth highest total for a President. Two of his nine interceptions went for touchdowns, a 72-yarder against Westminster on Oct. 21, and a 29-yard pick six on Nov. 11. The senior recorded at

least one interception in seven games this year and picked off a pair of passes twice, including the NCAA Second Round against Frostburg State (Md.). In 2017's two playoff games, Anderson picked off three passes. Anderson also made 43 tackles this season, including 34 solo and 3.0 for loss, while forcing a fumble against Carnegie Mellon. He ends his run as a three-year starter with 129 tackles (99 solo), 10.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks. He was also recently announced as a nominee for the Cliff Harris Award, given annually to the top small-college defensive player in the nation.

DAJUAN DARLING LAKELAND

6-0 195 CB/FS

2017: Named a first team All-Conference selection for the second straight year and received conference honors for the third straight season after serving multiple roles this year. He started the year at cornerback but ended up playing a safety position later in the year and finished with 48 tackles, including 10.5 tackles for loss, plus five passes broken up. A four-year starter,

DEVONTAE DUNN SHENANDOAH

6-1 200 CB/

2017: Named first team All-ODAC. Made the most of his first year as a full-time starter, posting 45 tackles, three forced fumbles and three interceptions from his cornerback spot. Dunn also registered 2.5 tackles for loss and one sack.

DANIEL GONZALEZ UNIVERSITY OF REDLANDS

6-1 190 CB/

2017: All-America First Team. Finished the recent campaign as the national leader in interceptions per game with a total of nine over nine games. He also ranks third with 19 passes defended. Furthermore, he recorded 35 tackles and two tackles for loss.

CHANCELLOR HARRIS UTICA

5-9 205 CB/

2017: Earned First Team All-Conference selection. This is his second All-Conference honor, after being chosen for Second Team All-Conference as a junior. Harris led the team and was tied for first in the Empire 8 with eight pass break ups this season. He was also tied for

second in the E8 with two forced fumbles. Chance finished the year with 25 tackles, one interception and one fumble recovery.

6-0 185 CB/FS

2017: All-MASCAC First Team. Real ball-hawk, quick and athletic. Had 35 tackles, 2 for a loss, 1 FR, 9 INTs, 9 PBUs.

C.J. HOBBS

GUILFORD

6-2 180 CB/

Former WR. 2017: Appeared in all 10 games, starting in nine as a corner back

ranked fourth on the team with 65 tackles. One of his best performances came in his final game against Emory and Henry College when he collected 10 tackles and had a fumble recovery

also recorded a career-high 12 tackles in Guilford's opening game against Huntingdon College.

TODD JETER

WESTMINSTER (PA)

6-0 185 CB/

Finished second in the Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC) in interceptions (5) and passes defended (12) this season, returning a pair of interceptions for touchdowns. He also totaled 39 tackles. Jeter's 17 career interceptions rank fifth all-time at Westminster and sixth on the league's all-time list. He was Westminster's first-ever PAC Defensive MVP honoree. Jeter, who was recently named on the D3football.com All-America team, also earned a spot on the All-Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) 2017 Division III Football team.

DAVID JIMMERSON

KEAN

6-0 180 CB/

2017: Earned first team All-NJAC selection after finishing with 25 tackles, 20 solo tackles, two sacks and two interceptions in eight contests.

DEEJAY JOHNSON **SOUTHWESTERN**

6-3 160 CB/

Honorable Mention All-SCAC - 2014, First Team All-SCAC - 2015, 2016, 2017. Very good corner, but needs serious weight gain. Was third in the ASC with 15 pass breakups on the season. In a league that featured some of the best offenses in the nation, Johnson was a huge reason that Southwestern finished fourth in the ASC in total defense. Johnson finished with 28 tackles on the second including a pair of interceptions. Had two or more breakups in four different contests this season.

PATRICK JOHNSON **WOOSTER**

5-9 185 CB/

2017: A three-time all-conference honoree, was elevated to the second-team after back-to-back honorable mention all-conference seasons. One of the conference's premier defensive backs, Johnson forced four fumbles, recorded three interceptions, and recovered two fumbles on the year, all while leading the team with 72 tackles.

MICHAEL JOSEPH **DUBUQUE**

6-0 186 CB/

2015, 2016, 2017: First Team All-Iowa Conference. 2017: Named Iowa Conference Defensive Player of the Year. Cliff Harris Award as best small college defender. The first Division III player to win the award. Joseph led the Iowa Conference with eight interceptions and was tied for third in all of NCAA Division III. To go along with his eight interceptions he added 16 passes defender, eight pass break ups, 56 tackles and one kickoff return for a touchdown. Joseph recently received an invite to the 2018 Reese's Senior Bowl.

SAMMY MOHR **DELAWARE VALLEY**

5-10 180 CB/

2017: Earned a spot on the All-MAC second team for the second consecutive year. The cornerback is tied for the team lead in pass breakups with six. He has also recorded 28 tackles and three interceptions and his two-point returned of a blocked extra-point attempt started a run of 41 consecutive points in the win over Widener. 2016: Named to the all-MAC second team.

DONTE ROWELL**LAKELAND****6-1 175 CB/FS**

2017: Three-time all-conference pick and was selected to the first team for the second time in his career. At safety, he led the Muskies and was third in the NACC with 78 tackles, and also tied for the team lead with two forced fumbles. Rowell also was second on the team and tied for third in the conference in interceptions (three) and added five pass breakups, tied for fourth on the team.

MICAM SMITH**MONMOUTH****5-11 198 CB/**

2017: A three-time all-Midwest Conference pick – earned his first All-American and All-Region honors during his final campaign, in which he started all 11 games and recorded a team-best four interceptions. Smith began the season with a nine-tackle performance against Hope College and made a game-clinching interception to preserve the Scots' season-opening win. He finished the season with 43 total tackles, fifth-best on the team. Smith also recorded 5.5 tackles for loss and broke up four additional passes.

JOSH WASHINGTON**FROSTBURG STATE****5-11 180 CB/**

2017: Repeated as First Team All-NJAC. Helped lead the Bobcats to nation's ninth-best defense in total yards allowed (233.5). Frostburg is also ranked 15th in scoring defense (12.2) and 13th in rushing defense (76.1). Leads the Bobcats with three interceptions this season and has added 29 total tackles.

TRYPP WASHINGTON**BALDWIN-WALLACE****5-10 180 CB/**

2017: All-Ohio Athletic Conference second-team selection. Selected to play in D3 Senior Classic Game. Team captain.

Led the team and was tied for fifth in the OAC with a career-best tying three interceptions. Second on the squad and 12th in the OAC with a career-high 74 tackles. Second on the team and tied for fourth in the OAC with seven pass breakups. Tallied three tackles for loss, one quarterback hurry and forced one fumble. Four-year starter.
