



Named a First Team All-American by the Jewish Sports Review. Glasser powered the Stags' pass rushing attack with six sacks, 10.5 tackles for loss, and two forced fumbles. Additionally, he was named as an All-SCIAC Second Team defensive end.

**ALEXANDER GREENIDGE RPI 5-11 225 ILB OLB**

A captain, Greenidge led the team in tackles with 108 - the most on the team in a season since 2007 - including 47 unassisted. He had 2.5 tackles for lost yards (6), an interception (34 yard return), two pass breakups and three fumble recoveries. He was second in the Liberty League in total tackles, first in assisted stops and fourth in tackles per game (9.8). Greenidge, who was named All-Liberty League First Team and All-ECAC North First Team, had double digit tackles in six games, including the last four of the regular season in which he totaled 57 stops (23 solo).

**CALVIN HARRIDGE Loras 6-1 230 ILB OLB**

2016 All-West Region selection as a member of the third team and A 2016 All-Iowa Conference pick, Harridge led the league in tackles, averaging 12.3 tackles per game, which ranked eighth in all of Division III. Racked up a career-high 123 total tackles and notched double-digit tackles in all but two games during the 2016 season. Harridge finished his Loras career with 412 total tackles, 23.5 tackles for loss, six fumbles forced and 4.5 sacks.

**JAMES HEDGER Hobart 6-1 255 ILB**

A defensive end, D3football.com All-East third team. ECAC North All-Star first team. All-Liberty League first team. NFF Hampshire Honor Society. Captain. Started all 11 games. Finished third on the team with 62 tackles. Led the team with eight sacks. Ranked second on the squad with 8.5 tackles for loss. A three-year starter, Hedger finished his career with 128 tackles, 13.5 tackles for loss, 11.0 sacks, and five pass breakups.

**STEPHAN LEWIS Kean 6-0 245 ILB**

1st Team NJAC All-Conference. Finished 11th in the conference (81) in total tackles this fall with 6.5 with a loss.

**ZACH MARTINEZ Gustavus Adolphus 6-1 230 ILB**

Made the league's Second Team defense for the second time in his career after leading the team with 58 tackles (19 solo, 39 assist). He also tallied 3.5 tackles for loss, one pass breakup, and one pass defended. The two-year team captain finished his career with 162 total tackles.

**HEATH McCRAY Huntingdon 5-10 230 ILB OLB**

Just the fifth Hawk to earn All-Region honors in multiple years. McCray earned honorable mention All-American honors last season with 39 tackles, 6.5 sacks, 11.5 tackles for loss and two forced fumbles. He turned in better numbers in every category this season. Led the Huntingdon defensive line with 50 tackles, led the Hawks and was second in the USA South Athletic Conference with eight sacks and 14 tackles for loss and tied for the conference lead with three forced fumbles. He also had two fumble recoveries and broke up two passes.

**DeJON ROTHSCCHILD** Cal Lutheran 6-0 258 ILB MLB  
Played in all nine games as a defensive leader up front for the Kingsmen. Recorded 18 solo tackles and totaled 52 on the season, also contributed 4.5 sacks and seven tackles for loss. Earned First Team All-SCIAC and was named to the Third Team All-West Region team as a D-Lineman.

**BOBBY RUSSELL** King's College 6-2 235 ILB  
A three-time All-MAC selection, Russell concluded his senior year ranked fourth in the MAC with 92 tackles (54 solo) with two interceptions, and a forced fumble. He wrapped up his career on November 12 with 14 tackles in King's Mayor's Cup victory over Wilkes and will graduate fifth in the Monarch record books with 290 tackles, while adding 22.5 tackles for loss, and four interceptions in 40 games played.

**WILL SEWELL** Frostburg 6-1 245 ILB OLB  
Was selected to the D3football.com All-American first team defense at defensive end. The New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) Defensive Player of the Year, Sewell finished the season ranked eighth nationally in tackles for loss (22.0) and 11th in tackles for loss per game (2.0). He also posted a team-high 78 total stops on the season with 5.0 sacks, three forced fumbles, two recovered fumbles and one pass breakup.

**JOHN SNYDER** Moravian 5-10 261 ILB  
Received a spot on the Centennial All-Conference First Team after three seasons as an Honorable Mention selection. An undersized DT, Snyder had 54 tackles including 36 solo stops, nine tackles for loss, two sacks, an interception, four passes defended and a pair of blocked kicks. In 36 career games, Snyder posted 168 tackles with 92 of them solo, 27 and a half tackles for loss which ranks fourth in school history, 10 sacks which is ninth all-time at Moravian, one interception, 10 passes defended, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and three blocked kicks.

**ELLIS THROCKMORTON** Husson University 6-3 235 ILB OLB  
Husson's leading tackler in 2016 with 61 stops (10.5 for loss) to go with his 4.5 sacks, one interception, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and two pass breakups helping him earn first team All-ECFC for second time in his career and the first since 2014. The two-time captain became the second player in program history to record 300 career totals this past season and is currently tied for the most career tackles for loss (46.0).

**A.J. WILLARD** Susquehanna 6-0 245 ILB OLB

Receives 2nd Team All-Centennial Conference recognition as a D-lineman following a strong season. He led the team in sacks this season with eight and finished up the year with 37 tackles, 11 of them being for a loss. Along with leading the team in sacks, he also was able to block two kicks this season.

**WILL FLAKE Rowan 6-2 266 MLB**

As a d-lineman, started every game and collected 28 tackles (nine solo, 19 assisted), two for a loss (eight yards), one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. He was a team captain and received NJAC All-Conference honorable mention. A two-time Rowan Scholar-Athlete.

**PAUL FOSTER UW-Whitewater 6-2 231 MLB**

2nd Team All-WIAC. Foster ranked third on the team with 60 tackles, including 9.0 for a loss, and has one interception (TD) and a forced fumble.

**ANDREW JOSEPH Cornell (IA) 6-2 235 MLB ILB**

Was named second team all-MWC for the second year in a row. The disruptive 6-foot-2 end tied for fourth in the league with 12.0 tackles for loss and also posted a team-high 4.5 sacks, good for fifth in the MWC. Joseph led Cornell's defensive line with 47 total tackles, 29 solo. He recorded five quarterback hurries. In 33 career games, Joseph finished with 41.5 tackles for loss, the fourth-most ever by a Ram. He ranks sixth with 15.5 career sacks.

**BEN KETCHUM Monmouth College 6-2 255 MLB**

Wrapped up his regular season career as a defensive lineman with 9.5 tackles for loss and 4.5 sacks. It is his second straight all-MWC honor.

**JOHN KONTOWICZ UW-Stevens Point 6-3 232 MLB**

1st Team All-WIAC, earned his second career All-WIAC honor after receiving second team laurels in 2015. This season, Kontowicz led the Pointers with seven sacks, four of which came against league foes. He tied for the team lead with 10 tackles for loss and forced and recovered a fumble.

**QUINTIN STUBBS-LEE Hanover 5-8 266 MLB**

First team all-HCAC as a defensive lineman. Stubbs-Lee, who earned his first all-conference award this year, ranked third on the team with 49 tackles. The senior also recorded 9.5 tackles for loss, including 3.5 sacks.
