

# Marty & Matt's Small College Scouting Report



## **RUSSELL BOUCHER**      **LAVERNE**

**6-2 195 P/WR**

2017: All-SCIAC 1st team. Proved to be one of the best punters in the nation this season. The senior, who also finished the year with 149 receiving yards and three touchdowns, ranks fifth in the nation with an average punt of 41.8 yards. Boucher landed nine punts inside the 20 yard line throughout the course of the season. Boucher made his biggest impact on field position in the Leopards' 28-27 win over Cal Lutheran when he pinned three kicks inside the 20, including a coffin corner kick, and another 68 yard bomb to help protect a one point lead with under four minutes to play.

## **ANDREW DINARDO**      **CATHOLIC**

**6-1 205 P/**

2017: All-American. The nation's leading punter with a 46.5 yards per punt average, racks up his fourth postseason honor this season. Played in the DIII National Senior Bowl Game. Was honored as a D3football.com All-Region selection and a First Team All-NEWMAC honoree. DiNardo boomed a long of 65 yards this season and put 16 of his boots inside the 20-yard line.

## **TYLER HENNING**      **COAST GUARD**

**6-0 180 P/PK**

2017: D3football.com All-America 2nd team, ECAC Division III North All-Star team as first team selection. Led the NEFC and is sixth nationally with a 41.5 yard average per punt. He led the conference with 23 punts inside the 20-yard line and 13 punts of over 50

yards including a season-long 69 yard punt. He was 19 of 20 converting a NEFC-best 95% of his extra points while making seven of 12 field goals this year to finish his career with a school-record tying 28 field goals while making 98 of 101 extra points in his four years. Henning was a second team All-ECAC selection last season.

## **TYLER KOHMAN**

## **CARNEGIE MELLON**

**6-3 185 P/**

2017: D3football.com All-America Second Team, AP Little All-America, AFCA Division III Coaches' All-America, D3football.com All-South Region First Team, All-ECAC First Team, UAA Special Teams Player of the Year, All-PAC First Team, All-UAA First Team. Ended his senior campaign as the top punter in the PAC and UAA with an average of 45.7 yards per punt, which ranked second nationally and set the program's single-season record. Kohman had 16 punts of 50 yards or more including a career-best 62-yarder. Kohman placed 21 of his 45 punts inside the opponents' 20-yard line. He leaves Carnegie Mellon as the program's leader in punts and yards per punt for a career. He recorded 209 punts in his four years for an average of 41.2 yards per punt.

## **MATT MURRAY**

## **ROSE-HULMAN**

**6-0 230 P/PK**

Ranked in the NCAA Division III top five in punting this year with an average of 41.7 yards per kick for his second career first-team all-HCAC award. He also made 9-11 from field goal range, highlighted by a 40-yard boot. On the season, the 2016 CoSIDA Academic All-American made 39-42 extra points. His career totals stand at 14-17 on field goals, 70-75 on extra points and a punting average of 39.6 yards per kick.

## **GLENN MYERS**

## **AUGSBURG**

**6-3 206 P/**

An All-MIAC First-Team and D3football.com All-West Region third-team selection in 2017, Meyers was the MIAC's top punter in 2017, averaging 40.0 yards per-punt on 47 punts, placing seven inside the opponent 20-yard line and forcing 13 fair catches, second-most among league punters. His 40.0 yards per-punt average ranks 24th among NCAA Division III punters nationally. He recorded eight punts of 50 yards or more this year.

---

**CLARK RIEDEL****WISCONSIN-STOUT****6-0 195 P/**

2017: Was a second team All-WIAC selection at punter after averaging 37.8 yards per kick. Of his 47 punts, 21 were fair catches, 11 were inside the 20-yard line and five were 50-plus yards. Riedel finished his career averaging 38.8 yards per punt. Played in the 2017 D3 Senior Classic.

---

**RIO SCHMIDT****HOBART****5-11 195 P/**

Made his second appearance on the all-conference first team. For the second straight year he led the Liberty League in punting average at 41.8 yards per punt. His punting average this year broke Hobart's single season punting average. Schmidt landed 11 of his 32 punts this season inside the 20-yard line and had five travel more than 50 yards. In 31 career games, Schmidt punted the ball 128 times for 5017 yards. He averaged a Hobart record 39.20 yards per punt.

**LUCAS ALFONSO****CHAPMAN****5-10 175 PK/**

2017: Second year as an All-SCIAC selection. The kicker landed on the Second Team after going 3-for-5 on field goals and 30-for-33 on PAT's this year with a long field goal of 33 yards. Was the second-highest scoring kicker in SCIAC games this season with 34 points. 2016: ALL-SCIAC.

---

**BRENDAN BOCHE****HAMLIN****6-6 230 PK/**

2017: 2nd Team All-MIAC. Was a constant source of points from the Gustie special teams unit. Boche led the MIAC with eight field goals made and has made at least one field goal in all but three games. Boche also ranked third in the MIAC with 58 points, having made 34-of-37 extra point attempts for a 92 percent completion rate. Boche broke the all-time extra points made record with his 99th career PAT in the homecoming victory over Hamline to pass Hall of Famer Ryan Boutwell (1995-98). Boche finished his career with nearly every extra point record, including career extra points made (120), most extra points made in a season (55), most extra points made in a game (9), most attempted in a career (127), most attempted in a season (58), highest career PAT percentage (94.4), and most consecutive extra points made (49).

---

**KYLE EDMISTON****RHODES****6-1 200 PK/**

2017: All-SAA Honorable Mention. Totaled 65 points in his final season, making 38 extra point attempts and nine field goals on 14 tries. His longest field goal of the season was 42 yards. Against Millsaps, Edmiston recorded 13 of Rhodes' 19 points. He went 4-of-4 in field goals that game including a 41-yard field goal.

---

**TYLER KNIGHTON****ROWAN****6-0 190 PK/**

2017: Named the Rowan Player of the Year. Competed In D3 Senior Classic. Was second on the team in scoring with 37 points. He was 8-of-10 on field goals with a long of 42 yards and went 13-for-13 on extra point attempts. Knighton ranked first in the New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) in field goal percentage (80.0), tied for first in PAT percentage (100.0), fourth in field goals (0.80) and seventh in kick scoring (3.7 ppg). He received NJAC All-Conference honorable mention. Knighton ended his career with eight school records, including highest PAT percentage with a minimum of 80 attempts (93.2), most consecutive PATs made in a career (33), most points scored by kicking in a game (15), most field goals made in a game (4), season (12) and career (37), most field goal attempts in a career (49) and highest field goal percentage in a season with a minimum of 15 attempts (75.0).

---

**ALEX LOUTHAN****MOUNT UNION****5-10 190 PK/**

2017: All-OAC first team. Played in all 15 games, Made 17 of 22 field goals with a long of 45. Made 94-of-95 extra points. Tied a playoff record with 10 extra points vs Frostburg State.

---

**JOHN MOWERY****MARY HARDIN-BAYLOR****6-1 200 PK/**

2017: ASC All-Conference First Team, 13-14 on field goals and has hit 47-50 extra points to lead UMHB with 86 points this season. 2016: D3football.com All-South Region Third Team selection, All-ASC First Team pick. Hit all 87 of his extra point attempts and connected on

9-17 field goals for 114 total points, had a season-long kick of 42 yards, set an ASC record with 87 consecutive PAT's converted. Averaged 56.5 yards on kickoffs and recorded eight touchbacks.

---

## **MATTHEW MURPHY**

**SUNY-MARITIME**

**6-1 195 PK/P**

Earned ECFC Special Teams Player of the Year honors after a successful 2017 campaign. Murphy led the league in nearly every kicking category, including field goals made, field goal long (48 yards), extra point conversion rate (98%) and total points scored at 80. He also assumed punting duties for the Privateers in which he averaged 40.1 yards per punt on 29 attempts, six of which landed inside the 20.

## **JACOB NEWTON**

**SHENANDOAH**

**5-9 185 PK/**

Strong, accurate leg. 2017: Named first team All-ODAC, second team All-State by VaSID, selected to ODK national leadership honor society. Led the team in scoring this season, putting up 67 points on 43-of-45 on PATs and making 8-of-10 field goals. The senior had a program-record four field goals in a week six win over Emory and Henry and his 43 successful PATs is a new program record.

---

## **MASON QUIGLEY**

**LORAS**

**5-9 160 PK/P**

Received both Second Team honors as a place kicker and honorable mention as a punter. The senior totaled 3,832 yards on kickoff, averaging 62.8 yards per kick, and aided the defense's field position with 24 touchbacks. He was also 13-for-18 on field goals with a season and career-best of 45 yards. For punting, the Washington native had 1,907 total yards, off 46 attempts, five kicks of 50 or more yards and a career long of 68 yards.

## **BRETT RENZI**

**BROCKPORT**

**5-11 199 PK/**

2017: Empire 8 Co-Special Teams Player of the Year. Led the Golden Eagle offense in scoring with 76 points, all coming off his foot. The senior was a perfect 49-49 on extra points in the regular season.

---

**JACOB STYTZ                      AUGUSTANA**

**5-10 175 PK/P**

A repeat first team selection at kicker. Set a school record for field goals this season, drilling 12 in 15 attempts. On September 16 at Carroll, he tied a school record with four field goals, including a 52-yarder that is the second-longest in school history. His 27 career field goals (in 37 attempts) are also second in school history and include seven successful kicks of over 40 yards.

**RYAN TRAVIS                      EAST TEXAS BAPTIST**

**5-10 191 PK/P**

2017: Collected his second All-ASC award, was named All-ASC Second Team offense and defense as a kicker and a punter. Travis converted 62-of-68 extra points while making eight field goals for a total of 86 points. 2016: All-ASC Honorable Mention

**JORDAN WATKINS                      BLUFFTON**

**5-10 155 PK/P**

Leaves the Beavers as the most decorated kicker in Bluffton football history. He is the all-time leading kick scorer and 10th overall with 199 career points. Watkins also tops the career charts with 136 PAT's, a 95.1 PAT percentage (136-of-143) and a 70.0 FG percentage (21-of-30). The Honorable Mention All-HCAC honoree is also 4th all-time with 161 punts, serving as Bluffton's jack of all trades on special teams. Watkins has served as Bluffton's kicker for kickoffs, field goals and extra points while also moonlighting as the punter.
