

KANE'ALA ATCHINSON- UW-Stout 6-3 305 OG
KEOLANUI

D3football.com All-West Region team. Allowed no sacks for the second consecutive season and led the Blue Devils in pancake blocks with 14. The 6-3, 305, lineman was a second team all region selection last season.

VINCENT BASILE UW-Oshkosh 6-2 295 OG OC

All-American. Basile, a D3football.com All-West Region second team performer this season, anchors an offensive line that has paved the way for UW-Oshkosh to rank 13th nationally with 263.9 rushing yards per game, 16th with 0.86 sacks allowed per contest and 17th with 4.36 tackles for loss allowed per game. Basile, a two-time All-WIAC choice, has started 28 straight games and 36 of the Titans' last 37.

ZACH BENNINGTON Capital 6-6 290 OG OT

Four-year starter appeared in and started all 10 games in 2016 for a rushing attack that produced 1,162 yards and pass blocked for 2,138 yards.

BROOKS BILLINGS Hendrix 6-3 300 OG

All-South Region Team. Was the starting left guard and helped the Warriors to NCAA Division III record 600 yards of total offense per game. The Hendrix offense also ranked third in the nation passing offense, seventh in scoring and eighth in first downs. The Warriors led the SAA in rushing, passing and scoring. Billings was an All-SAA First Team selection this year and an All-South Region Third Team pick in 2015.

CODY CAMPBELL DePauw 6-3 293 OG

Earned honorable mention All-NCAC. The offensive line helped the backfield with 490.9 yards per game and 51 total touchdowns on the year. They also allowed just eleven sacks.

IVAN CAMPOS Cal Lutheran 6-5 315 OG

Originally from Sweden. Helped the CLU offense average 436.6 yards per game. The Violet and Gold totaled 1,299 rushing yards and 1,757 passing yards to rank third in the conference in each category. Overall, the Kingsmen averaged 33.6 points per game against the SCIAC and had a season-high of 560 yards in a 53-36 win over Occidental.

RILEY CANNON Salisbury 6-2 315 OG

Named a Third Team All-American. Cannon helped the Sea Gulls earn the honor as one of the top rushing offenses in the nation during the 2016 season. Cannon helped pave the way to 376.7 rushing yards per game during the season which ranked second in the NCAA – across all divisions, trailing only Washington and Lee University (390.3 yards per game). Salisbury's offensive line also allowed only 1.18 sacks per game, good for 35th in Division III football, while leading the New Jersey Athletic Conference.

CALEB CHIAIA Christopher Newport 6-4 300 OG

Two-year starter. Help anchor a solid line that protected a pretty balanced offense.

PATRICK CUSACK Dubuque 6-4 285 OG

D3football.com All-West Region, All-Iowa Conference First Team, three-year starter. Offense rolled up 398 points and 4,357 yards of offense.

JUSTIN DIJULIO Hobart 6-3 280 OG

He played in seven games this season, missing four due to injury. A versatile offensive lineman, DiJulio started five games, three at right tackle, one at right guard, and one at left guard. DIII Senior Classic.

NOAH DRAKE Salve Regina 6-4 280 OG

2015 NEFC Lineman of the Year. Part of an offensive line that helped Salve Regina finish the season nationally ranked ninth in rushing offense (274.3 YPG), sixth in rushing touchdowns (35), seventeenth in the country in scoring (41.2 PPG), and tied for first for the fewest sacks allowed all season (3).

CHIJOKE EZENYILIMBA SUNY-Cortland 6-5 305 OG

Ezenyilimba started 11 games at offensive guard this fall and started on the offensive line in all 12 games last season. He helped Cortland's offense average 414.9 yards per game, including 137.7 rushing yards per contest. The Red Dragons averaged 5.9 yards per play from the line of scrimmage.

DANIEL FOGLEMAN Hampden-Sydney 6-3 295 OG

ALL-ODAC. Fogleman was part of an offensive line that helped the Tiger offense to nearly 390 yards-per-game, including over 100 rushing yards-per-game.

CONNOR HELGESON Augsburg 6-3 290 OG

Part of an Augsburg offensive line that produced 2,539 yards of total offense this season, a 253.9 yards per-game average. The Auggies rushed for 516 yards and passed for 2,023 yards this season. Has also punted and lined up at FB and TE.

MATTHEW HLAVINKA Franklin & Marshall 6-4 291 OG

Helped anchor a line that paved the way for 1,716 yards. Hlavinka grades out at 89-percent with 55 knockdowns at left guard.

CHRIS HOFFMAN Muskingum 6-3 313 OG

First Team All-OAC. Anchored the offensive line and helped the Muskies churn out 260.6 yard of offense per game.

AUSTIN JONES UW-Whitewater 6-3 300 OG

Jones started 10 games at guard for UW-Whitewater. He earned All-American honorable mention, second team all-conference and all-region honors after helping the Warhawks average nearly 35 points and 200 rushing yards per game.

KEVIN LaMARQUE Alfred University 6-2 335 OG OT

A four-year starter and a team captain in 2016, LaMarque was a First Team Empire 8 All-Star, a First Team D3football.com East Region All-Star; and a First Team Hero Sports All-American. He anchored a line that helped the Saxons set new single-season records for rushing yards and scoring.

ANDREW MANEVAL Chicago 6-3 280 OG

1st Team All-SAA, 2nd Team All-UAA. Starter at left tackle for a record-setting offense that set 21 school records this year, including season passing yards, season passing touchdowns, season completions and total offense. UChicago's offense ranked 4th in NCAA Division III in passing offense (381 YPG), 22nd in total offense (485.6 YPG) and 10th in first downs (257).

JOSH MARONSKI Hardin-Simmons 6-2 320 OG

All-ASC. Called up to the varsity as a freshman.

OTIS MILLER, III Thomas More College 6-2 308 OG

Named to the D3football.com All-South Region teams. Miller was a second team selection by the internet website. He helped anchor the offensive line that blocked the way for the Saints to rush for 3,018 yards and only allowed 23 sacks. Miller also helped protect the Saints' quarterbacks to pass for 2,529 yards and 26 touchdowns. He was named first-team All-Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC) last month by the conference's head coaches.

AUSTIN MITAL Lycoming 6-3 290 OG

Was named the MAC Scholar Athlete after also earning Second Team Academic All-American accolades and picking up Academic All-MAC honors for the second time in his career as a senior. He was also an Honorable Mention All-MAC offensive lineman, an Academic All-District selection and he was the team's candidate for the National Football Foundation's National Scholar-Athlete Award. He earned three MAC Academic Honor Roll accolades in his career.

COLIN MOOG Christopher Newport 6-3 290 OG OC

Anchored the offensive line for the last three seasons since he was just a sophomore. Moog was a first team All-Conference

McFARLAND MURPH Emory & Henry 6-2 310 OG

2016: First Team All-ODAC honoree. Named to the All-Region Third Team. Started all ten games at right guard. Graded out at 92%. Posted seven pancake blocks.

DERRICK ROMANO Monmouth College 6-3 320 OG

Second team MWC honoree. Helped the Scots rush for nearly 250 yards per game and score 34 rushing TDs. They were also part of the unit which allowed just eight sacks on the season.

MAX SCHUMANN Chicago 6-3 280 OG

Honorable Mention All-UAA, Honorable Mention All-SAA.

Starter at right tackle for a record-setting offense that set 21 school records this year, including season passing yards, season passing touchdowns, season completions and total offense. UChicago's offense ranked 4th in NCAA Division III in passing offense (381 YPG), 22nd in total offense (485.6 YPG) and 10th in first downs (257).

ANTHONY TUFANO Hartwick 6-3 300 OG

One of four captains. Started all 10 games on the Hawks' offensive line and helped Hawks' offense rank tenth in the country and lead the Empire 8 Conference in passing offense (342.3).
