PRESTON ADDO

STEVENSON

5-10 180 WR/RS

2017: Repeated as a First Team selection both as a wide receiver and returner. On offense, Addo hauled in 64 passes for 1,177 yards and 11 touchdowns, ranking 10th nationally in receiving yards and 13th in receiving yards per game. Addo had 10 catches for a program-record 230 yards November 4 at Wilkes, including three touchdown grabs. As a returner, Addo averaged 22.1 yards on 14 kick returns and 11.1 yards on 21 punt returns, including his and the program's second punt return touchdown at FDU-Florham on September 16.

DEONTEZ ALEXANDER

FRANKLIN COLLEGE

6-3 180 WR/

2017: Collected his second consecutive First Team All-HCAC honor. Hauled in 50 passes for a league-leading 1,137 yards, and his 18 touchdown catches are the second most among all players in Division III.

GARRETT ARMSTRONG

WILKES

6-4 215 WR/TE

2017: Third All-MAC selection being named to the first team for the second straight year as an undersized TE. Topped all players at the position with 60 receptions for 608 yards and six touchdowns. He set career-highs in all three categories ranking seventh in the MAC in receptions, 13th in yards and 8th in touchdowns.

MICHAEL ASHWELL**SHENANDOAH****5-11 180 WR/**

Dynamic receiver with great hands. 2017: One of the Hornets co-captains. Named first team All-ODAC, first team All-State by VaSID. Was on the receiving end of a program-record 80 receptions with the senior gaining a team-leading 797 yards and nine TDs. Had at least three receptions in all 10 games and hit double-digits in four of the 10 contests.

TAREK BEAUGARD**EAST TEXAS BAPTIST****5-10 175 WR/**

2017: Received his first All-ASC honor after receiving 30 passes for 496 yards and seven touchdown receptions.

JAMETRIUS BENTLEY**WESTMINSTER (PA)****6-0 185 WR/RS**

2017: Was second on the team with 312 receiving yards, while his three touchdown receptions tied for first. He added 198 yards on the ground with three scores. Bentley also averaged 20.67 yards on kicked returns. Earned his second First Team honor (2016 & 2017); he was Second Team in 2015.

DAMON BLACK, JR.**ST. VINCENT****6-3 190 WR/RS**

2017: Awarded with All-PAC Second Team laurels for the 2nd year in a row, was honorable mention in 2015. Started all 10 games at receiver, setting several single season and career receiving records. Led the PAC in catches (73) and ranked fourth in receiving yards (777). His 73 receptions established a new career-high. Also served as the team's punt returner, with 18 returns for 217 yards (12.1 yards per return). Amassed a career-high 997 all-purpose yards. Recorded at least four catches in nine of 10 games. Finished his Bearcat career with 23 total touchdowns.

COLE BLACKBURN**UNIVERSITY OF REDLANDS****5-11 185 WR/**

Finished off his outstanding career at Redlands with his third All-Conference award with a spot on the 2017 Second Team. As Redlands' top target, this team captain tallied 525 yards on 40 receptions for three touchdowns in SCIAC competition.

6-2 185 WR/

2017: D3football.com All-America Honorable Mention, NESCAC Player of the Year, was also named a First Team All-NESCAC selection, a First Team D3football.com All-East Region selection, the Joe Zabilski Award winner, and a New England Football Writers Division II/III All-New England Team honoree. At 6-2, Breuler was a mismatch for opposing defensive backs all season as he amassed 1,172 yards and 87 catches while hauling in 10 receiving touchdowns in just nine games. He broke the NESCAC and Wesleyan single-season records for yards and catches and finished the year ranked No. 2 in the country in receptions per game (9.7) and third in receiving yards per game (130.2).

2017: 1st Team All-IIAC. Had 83 receptions for 1315 yards, a 15.8 average and 14 TDs.
2016: Had six carries for 57 yards and two TDs, 59 receptions for 743 yards and five TDs. Had eight punt returns for 82 yards and 22 kickoff returns for 478 yards. Second-team All-Conference (wide receiver and kick return).

DANIEL BRONSON

ROCHESTER

6-0 200 WR/ATH

1st Team All-Liberty his 3rd All-Liberty League honor (H.M. 2016, H.M. 2014, Rookie of the Year 2014); Did a little bit of everything for the Yellowjackets this season, moving to a utility role after a shoulder injury preventing him from being the teams quarterback. Played in six games, accumulating 29 receptions for 328 yards and three TDs. Added 31 rushes for 106 yards and one TD, also chipping in six kick returns for 118 yards. Ranked 3rd in the Liberty League in all-purpose yards per game (92.0), was 5th in receptions per game (4.8) and 6th in receiving yards per game (54.7). Also, was 8th in receptions, 9th in receiving yards and tied for 6th in receiving TDs. Finishes his career 2nd in school history in TDs responsible for with 47 and was 4th in total offense per game (166.2) and total offense per play (5.97).

RAYMOND BURTNICK**ROSE-HULMAN****6-3 210 WR/**

2017: First-team all-Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference. Tied a school record and ranked in the NCAA Division III national top 10 with 15 touchdown receptions this season. He hauled in 48 receptions for 766 yards, increasing his career totals to 73 receptions for 1,004 yards and 20 touchdowns.

BRETT CAGGIANO**JOHN HOPKINS****6-3 210 WR/**

2017: A repeat first team selection, one of four players in the league to earn first team honors in 2016 and 2017. He ranks second on the team in receptions (48), receiving yards (757) and touchdown receptions (7); his marks for receptions and receiving yards are both career highs.

TREY CIRESI**BERRY****6-2 180 WR/**

2016: First Team All-Conference.

Broke the Berry College single season record for TDs in a year (11). 2015: 2nd Team All-SAA. 2014: SAA Honorable Mention.

TREY CIRESI**BERRY****6-2 180 WR/**

2017: Second Team All-Conference. Competed in all 12 games. Finished with 51 receptions for 777 yards. Added 10 touchdowns on the year, averaging 64.8 yards per game. Holds program record for most career receiving yards (2837). 2016: First Team All-Conference. Broke the Berry College single season record for touchdowns in a year (11). No. 3 in the SAA in yards (975). Caught 57 passes and averaged 97.5 yards per game. 2015:

2nd Team All-SAA. Tied for 4th in the SAA and led the Vikings in receiving touchdowns with six. Caught 42 passes for a total of 537 yards. 2014: SAA Honorable Mention. Recorded 548 yards on 35 receptions. Scored five touchdowns on the year.

EVAN CLARK **ST. JOHN'S**

5-10 190 WR/

2017: 2nd Team All-West Region, the third for Clark, who achieved the distinction as a returner in 2014. A two-time All-MIAC first-team honoree, Clark led SJU in all three receiving categories this fall for the second straight year. He appeared in 10 of the Johnnies' 11 games and caught 29 passes for 496 yards (17.1 avg.) and six touchdowns, and finished third on the team with 202 rushing yards and two touchdowns on 13 carries. Clark ended his career with 29 total touchdowns (23 receiving, four rushing, two kick returns), the 15th-most in school history, and tied for ninth in receiving touchdowns and 14th in receiving yards (1,701). Eighteen of Clark's 29 career touchdowns covered 25 yards or more, including 14 over 40 yards. His 1,185 career kick-return yards are good for second in school history.

JAMES COBBS **CARTHAGE**

6-0 200 WR/

Four-year starter. 2016: Named Most Valuable Performer (Offense), All-College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin First Team, Started all 10 games at wide receiver, led the Red Men with 39 receptions for 730 yards and 7 touchdowns.

MARCAUS COOPER **EARLHAM**

6-2 175 WR/

2017: 1st team All-HCAC recipient. Appeared in 10 games with 62 receptions for 578 yards averaging 57.8 yards per game, finished season with nine touchdowns. 2016: Second team All-HCAC recipient; 2015: Honorable Mention All-HAAC.

DYLAN CUMMINGS **METHODIST**

5-10 190 WR/

2017: Team's leading and go-to receiver - 62 receptions. Also led in yardage (692) and TD receptions (7).

SHEDRICK DAVIS **LOUISIANA COLLEGE**

6-2 210 WR/

Earned his second straight postseason honor from the ASC, the senior receiver battled through injuries during the back half of the season, limiting his playing time, but still

finished as the Wildcats top receiver for the second year in a row. Davis caught 54 passes for 851 yards and nine touchdowns, all team highs. He also finished second in the conference in both receptions and receiving yards per game and in touchdown receptions.

MARK DIETRICH **WESTERN NEW ENGLAND**

6-2 195 WR/

An All-New England Football Conference (NEFC) selection each of the past two seasons, Dietrich capped his career with his third All-Conference honor following a productive senior campaign. The senior wide receiver led CCC Football with 695 yards during the regular season, while his eight touchdowns and 41 receptions ranked second and fifth, respectively. Dietrich topped the 70-yard mark on six occasions, with his season-high of 123 yards coming in Saturday's 55-14 victory over Nichols. Surpassed the program record for career TD catches with 21.

BRANDON EHRKE **CARROLL UNIVERSITY**

6-3 190 WR/

2nd Team All-CCIW. Led the Pioneers receiving corps in yards per game (17.69), yards on the season (743) and touchdown catches (6). Ehrke's numbers also placed him amongst league leaders in the CCIW. His 17.69 yards per catch placed him second, while his 4.20 catches per game placed him fourth in the conference.

SHAQ ELLIS **BETHANY COLLEGE (WV)**

5-9 180 WR/

2017: Earned his first all-PAC nod after leading the team and ranking eighth in the PAC with 36 receptions. He finished the season with 398 yards and two touchdowns. Played two seasons at Dakota College where he was all-conference.

JOSEPH FANIEL **MORRISVILLE STATE**

5-10 180 WR/RS

2017: Led the team in receptions with 48. Gained 553 yards for an 11.5 average/catch and 3 TDs.

VINCENZO FERRARO**ST. LAWRENCE****6-0 185 WR/**

2017: First-Team All-Liberty League selection set records for receptions in a season (64), career receptions (188) and career receiving yards (2,499). 2016: Ferraro was one of the top receivers in the league and country ranking second in the league in yards (831), receptions (55), yards per game (103.9) and receptions per game (6.9). 2015: Ferraro was the top receiver for the Saints in his sophomore year leading the team with 58 receptions, 750 yards and six TDs and the longest reception of the season with a 77-yard catch and run against RPI.

BRAEDEN FRISS**MOUNT UNION****5-10 175 WR/**

2017: All-OAC second team. Team captain. Started all 15 games. Had 52 catches for 714 yards and 11 touchdowns.

BRAD GARCIA**HARTWICK****6-1 199 WR/**

2017: Empire 8 Conference First Team. Led the E8 in touchdown receptions with 14 and he was second in both reception yards (914) and reception yards per game (91.4). 2016: Named a Sports News Preseason All-American, received Empire 8 Conference Honorable Mention. 2015: Selected to HERO Sports All-America Team, named to ECAC North First Team, tabbed D3Football.com All-East Region Second Team, selected to Empire 8 Conference First Team.

ALLANTE GARDNER**LAKELAND****5-8 180 WR/**

2017: Transfer from Saginaw Valley. Received All-NACC second team recognition. Set a new school record with 79 receptions, also leading the NACC in catches. He also paced the team and was third in the conference with 849 receiving yards and added seven touchdowns, all in his first year with the team.

XAVIER GRAY EAST TEXAS BAPTIST

5-10 180 WR/

2017: Picked up his first All-ASC Award after catching 35 passes for 877 yards including nine touchdown receptions.

KYLE GRITSCH CENTRAL

6-1 205 WR/RB

2017: All-Iowa Conference, first team. The team's hybrid s-back, Gritsch lined up in the backfield, tight end and as a wide receiver. He finished with 32 catches for 512 yards and four scores. He finished top-15 in the league in all three categories. His one and only rushing attempt of the season was a one-yard touchdown against Dubuque.

DEMETRIUS HARPER COE

6-0 215 WR/

2017: 2nd Team All-IIAC. Really excels in the red zone. Tough receiver with good hands. 2017 Stats: 73 rec, 1073 yds, 14.7 avg, 9 TDs.

DUSTIN HARRISON PUGET SOUND

5-10 183 WR/

2017: Named to the All-Northwest Second Team. Finished the season as the NWC leader in both receptions (66) and receiving yards per game (74.8). He concluded the 2017 campaign by matching a single-game career-high 14 receptions against George Fox (Nov. 11), and totaled at least 90 receiving yards in four games this fall.

JODY HARRISON LAKELAND

5-9 180 WR/

2017: Received All-NACC second team recognition. Caught 68 passes for 703 yards and seven touchdowns in receiving all-conference recognition for the first time. He finished second for Lakeland and tied for second in the NACC in receptions and tied for fifth in the conference in receiving yards and receiving touchdowns.

DERSHONE HAYMAN**SHENANDOAH****6-0 190 WR/**

Reliable, sometimes overlooked WR. Averaged 19 yds/rec. Caught 22 passes for 418 yards and 6 TDs.

MONTRELL HICKS-TAYLOR**WIDENER****5-11 175 WR/**

2017: 1st Team All-MAC, his third appearance on an All-Conference team after receiving Second Team accolades in 2014 and Honorable Mention last year. He leads the Pride and is fifth in the MAC in receiving yards (879) and touchdowns (7), while ranking second on the Blue and Gold with 42 catches. All seven of his scores this season have gone for 35 or more yards with a long of 82 at Wilkes

NATE HODAPP**HENDRIX****6-0 193 WR/**

2017: Second in the nation in total receiving yards and receiving yards per game. In the SAA Hodapp led in receiving yards per game with 137.4. He has had 86 receptions for 1374-yards and 15 touchdowns. D3football.com All-America Third Team and D3football.com All-Region. Hodapp also made the SAA All-Conference First Team. 2016: All-Southern Athletic Association First Team, 2015 All-SAA Honorable Mention.

NICK HOLCOMB**WISCONSIN-LA CROSSE****6-2 190 WR/**

Semifinalist for the 2017 Gagliardi Trophy. Led Division III in receptions (80), receiving yards (1,401) and touchdowns (20), which are all single-season school records. Set a school record with 15 receptions for 190 yards and two touchdowns against Wisconsin-Oshkosh in 2017. Had four games with 10 or more receptions, caught a touchdown reception in nine of 10 regular-season games, and had at least two TD catches in six games, posted a four-touchdown, 263-yard receiving game against Ripon (Wis.). Set a school and WIAC single-game record with five receiving touchdowns against UW-River Falls this fall.

MARCUS HUDSON**WISCONSIN-WHITewater****6-1 210 WR/**

2017: First team All-WIAC. Finished with 27 receptions for 590 yards, good for an average of 21.9 yards per catch, and seven touchdowns (one rushing) in eight games this season. He ranks fifth in the WIAC with 73.8 receiving yards per game, sixth in scoring touchdowns with seven and ninth with 3.38 receptions per contest.

JACOB ISRAEL**CHAPMAN****5-8 180 WR/RS**

Earned First Team All-SCIAC honors, also etched his name in the Chapman record books in his final season. Only the second wide receiver to receive All-Region honors in school history, he set the school record for most yards in a single season with 1,050 receiving yards in the 2017 season. He is just the third Panther to record a 1,000 yard season. Also destroyed the previous single season and career average yards per game records, leading the conference with 137.7 yards per game in SCIAC games. His nine TDs in conference games also led the conference. Isabel averaged 99.1 yards per game in his two-year career as a Panther, breaking a previous school record from 1999-2001, and was the first receiver in Chapman history to haul in 10 TDs in a single season. He caps off a historic career with 11 career 100-yard games – the most of any player in Chapman history. 2016: ALL-SCIAC, 2nd Team (RS); 2nd Team (WR).

MALIK JACKSON**ALBRIGHT****6-1 200 WR/**

2017: First-Team All-Conference. He had 801 receiving yards which led the team and ranks seventh-best in the conference. Jackson finished second on the team with 51 receptions and five touchdown catches.

CAM JOHNSON**HAMPDEN-SYDNEY****6-3 185 WR/**

2017: Second Team All-American, Second Team All-South Region (d3football.com), Lanier Award Finalist, First Team All-ODAC, and ODAC Offensive Player of the Year. Wrapped up his career with an impressive 219 receptions for 2,740 yards and 27 touchdown catches. His senior season was his best of all as he led the nation with 110 catches to go with 1,261 yards and 12 touchdowns – all marks which led the ODAC.

HUNTER JOHNSON**GUSTAVUS ADOLPHUS****5-9 185 WR/RS**

Played four 2017 games at QB. 2016: MIAC All-Conference Second Team Offense; Led the Gusties in receiving and all-purpose yards.

STEVEN JOHNSON**BUFFALO STATE****5-11 215 WR/FL**

Deep threat receiver who averaged an incredible 24.75 yds/rec on 32 catches for 792 yds and 7 TDs.

DAMON JONES**MUSKINGUM****6-2 205 WR/RS**

2017: Set the school record for receiving yards in a season with 875 yards on 49 receptions. The old mark was 805 yards set by current Minnesota Vikings wide receivers coach Darrell Hazell in 1983. Jones gathered 974 all-purpose yards (35 rushing, 875 receiving, and 64 punt return yards) and logged seven receiving touchdown passes, all of which ranked first on the team. He finished the season ranked fourth in the conference in receiving yards-per-game (87.5), 11th in touchdowns, and was named to the All-Ohio Athletic Conference Second Team. Throughout his career, he saw action in 39 games, registered 14 receiving touchdowns and had 1,818 receiving yards which ranks fourth all-time.

HUNTER JOSEPH**OTTERBEIN****6-0 193 WR/**

2017: Earned second-team All-OAC honors in a crowded league of talented wide receivers after attracting first-team honors last season. He caught 45 passes for 711 yards and nine touchdowns, all top-10 in the OAC, while also returning some kickoffs and punts. Joseph went over the 100-yard plateau three times this season and ends with 89 grabs for 1,488 yards and 15 scores in his two Otterbein seasons following a transfer from Ohio Dominican.

NICK KIOURKAS**WHITWORTH****6-3 216 WR/**

2017: Second team All-NWC offense for the second year in a row after earning first team recognition as a tight end in 2015. He caught at least one pass in every game of his Whitworth career (41 games) and finished this season with 27 receptions for 290 yards and two scores.

MATT KNAPP **WISCONSIN-EAU CLARE**
6-0 186 WR/RS

2017: 2nd Team All-WIAC on offense and on special teams. Played a key role for the Blugold offense, both as a wide receiver and return specialist. The senior led Eau Claire with 37 receptions for 642 yard and eight touchdowns. Knapp also had 37 kick returns for 813 yards and 11 punt returns for 173 yards. In addition, he also rushed for 108 yards on 26 carries. Knapp's 1,736 all-purpose yards were a team-high as were his 48 points. In the WIAC, Knapp led the conference in all-purpose yards (1,642), was third in kick return average (19.4).

BRIAN KORNOWSKI **JOHN CARROLL**
6-0 190 WR/

2017: In the D3 Senior Classic in Myrtle Beach, was named Offensive MVP of the South Team. Go-to receiver, solid possession guy. Led the JCU offense with 707 yards receiving on 60 receptions. Has registered eight receptions on three occasions.

AARON LACOMBE **CAL LUTHERAN**
6-3 205 WR/

2017: Earned All-SCIAC First Team for the second year. Led the Kingsmen in receptions for the second straight year. He pulled down 45 receptions for 952 yards and seven touchdowns. His 952 yards were the fifth-most for a season in program history. His 119 yards per game were tops in the SCIAC. Played one year of football at Moorpark College and earned 1st team All-Conference honors in 2015. University of Arizona - attended and played two years of football.

T.J. LINT **BUENA VISTA**
6-1 230 WR/

2017: First Team All-IIAC. Closed out a standout career by ranking second during league

play in 2017 in receptions per contest (7.8), third in yards per contest (111.0) and sixth in all-purpose yards per game (126.9). He set career-highs with 12 catches and 191 yards during the team's 44-41 win at Dubuque. The 12 grabs marked the second-highest single-game total in school history while his 191 yards was the fourth-highest total.

JULIAN LOWE OTTERBEIN

5-11 190 WR/

A three-time All-OAC selection, including two nods to the first team, after making 63 grabs for 844 yards and 10 touchdowns in 2017. Transferred to Otterbein from Akron before his sophomore year of eligibility and blossomed into a three-year standout, attracting a pair of selections to the All-OAC first team in a league filled with talented wide receivers. He finished as Otterbein's new all-time leader in touchdown receptions (30), second in catches (196) and third in receiving yardage (2,318). Also three-year standout sprinter, who represented multiple points and graduated with indoor school records in the 200, 400, 4x2 and 4x4. His 200-meter best of 22.19 seconds is also an OAC record.

BEN LUEDKE HENDRIX

6-1 195 WR/

2017: Was off to a great start when injury ended his season early in game five. In only 4 full games, he had 15 rec, 321 yds, 21.40 avg, and 5 TDs. 2014 All-Southern Athletic Association Second Team, 2015 & 2016 All-SAA Honorable Mention, 2014 USA College Football Freshman All-Stars. Redshirted at NCAA Division II member Colorado School of Mines.

DEMETRIUS MAGEE HEIDELBERG

6-2 210 WR/

2017: Was selected 1st Team All-Region for the second straight season. Leaving HU with the most receiving touchdowns in school history (27), he concluded his career with a remarkable senior campaign. Magee had 14 touchdown grabs this season and had over 1,000 receiving yards. 79 rec, 1089 yds, 13.8 avg, 14 TDs. 2016: Received All-American honorable mention and All-Region accolades by D3football.com, Named OAC's Ed Sherman Award recipient, given to conference's top receiver, All-OAC First Team honoree, Caught 53 passes for 633 yards and 11 touchdowns. 2015: Named second team All-OAC, Made 39 receptions on the year for a team-high 684 yards and seven touchdowns.

SAM MARKHAM**CENTRAL****6-2 170 WR/**

2017: All-Iowa Conference, first team. Markham piled up 116.8 yards per game. He also had 11 touchdown catches, tied for the most in the league. In total, he had 53 catches for 934 yards. 2016: D3football.com All-American, third team, D3football.com All-West Region, first team, All-Iowa Conference, first team (2015, 2016, 2017), All-Iowa Conference, honorable mention (2014).

BRYCE MARQUARDT**BETHEL (MN)****5-11 192 WR/Slot**

2017: Received his third career All-Conference honor after recording 26 catches for 544 yards and four touchdowns in a shortened senior season. Marquardt, who was on pace to break Bethel's all-time record for career receiving yards, caught 19 passes for 383 yards and two touchdowns in a three game against conference opponents, but injury sidelined him during the Gustavus game and the fifth-year player was unable to play the final four games. Marquardt did, however, break the all-time record for career receiving touchdowns with 29. Two-time All-Conference honors in football and baseball.

TYLER MARRONI**KING'S COLLEGE****6-4 185 WR/**

2017: Named to All-MAC Team as a second team selection. Capped a record-breaking career with a banner senior season in which he established King's single-season records with 73 receptions and 1,089 yards. He scored a career-best eight touchdowns through the air and averaged a team-high 14.9 yards per-catch. He finished his career with a school-record 159 receptions and stands second in program history with 2,277 yards while scoring 12 touchdowns.

MICHAEL MCKEOWN**WHITWORTH****5-11 182 WR/**

2017: Finished with 55 receptions for 580 yards and six touchdowns in 2017. He was second in the NWC in receptions and third in receptions per game (5.5). McKeown's 2nd Team All-NWC selection means all four Pirate starting receivers earned All-NWC recognition in 2017.

SAM MENTOWSKI**WISCONSIN-OSHKOSH****6-1 195 WR/**

2017: The first UW-Oshkosh wide receiver to earn All-America laurels from D3football.com, finished his senior season with 67 receptions for a program-record 1,477 yards and 13 touchdowns. His receiving yardage led the country while his 22.04 yards per catch ranked 17th nationally. Mentkowski had 23 receptions that gained at least 20 yards this season, including 11 of his touchdown catches.

PJ MEYER**WILMINGTON****5-11 190 WR/**

2017: voted a member of the 2017 All-OAC Second Team Offense. This is Meyer's second All-OAC honor. Last year (2016) he received Honorable Mention. Meyer, who played in all ten games this season for the team, finished the year with 712 yards- averaging 71.2-yards per game- and 13 touchdowns. Didn't play a snap of high school football, but built himself into a player that is recognized as an All-OAC receiver and selected for the D3 Senior Classic.

JUSTIN MONTGOMERY**LUTHER****6-5 215 WR/**

Solid, tall receiver on a run-first team. Had 30 more receptions than nearest teammate. 2017 Stats: 43 rec, 588 yds, 13.7 avg, 3 TDs.
