

MALIK ADAMS *North Carolina Central* **5-9 175 WR**

Earned his second All-Region award for the talented Adams, a preseason All-American who recently earned his third straight First Team All-Conference honor. Adams caught a league-leading 11 touchdowns this season and ranked first in receiving yards per game (97.9). He will graduate as N.C. Wesleyan's career-leader in every receiving category, while his 47 career TD catches are also a USA South best.

KYLE ALLEGRINI *Rochester* **5-10 185 WR**

2nd league accolade; Allegrini was one of UR's top receiving threats in 2016, pulling in 24 passes for 366 yards and a team high five TDs. He also added 10 rushes for 55 yards and one TD and was a key return man for the Yellowjackets, with 38 kick returns for 818 yards and one TD there as well. His seven total TD's ended up leading the Yellowjackets in scoring. Allegrini recorded multiple catches in eight of nine games and had a season best five catches with two scores against WPI on Nov. 5.

REED ALLEN *Ohio Northern* **6-1 205 WR RS**

A two-time First Team All-OAC honoree as a receiver. He started 32 games over the past three season and led the Polar Bears with 44 receptions for 617 yards and six touchdowns this season. Allen ended his 33-game career ranked seventh all-time at ONU with 100 receptions and is sixth with 1,738 receiving yards. He also caught 19 touchdown passes and ranks 10th with 40 kickoff returns and 822 kickoff return yards.

TYLER AMBUSH *Bethany College* **5-7 184 WR**

1st Team All-PAC. Caught 3 times more passes than nearest teammate. Finds holes in defense and elusive after the catch. 2016 Stats: 72 rec, 863 yds, 12.0 avg, 7 TDs. National Bowl selectee.

DAN ARNOLD *UW-Platteville* **6-6 220 WR**

First team all-American. Caught 65 passes for 1,176 yards and 16 touchdowns. The Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference offensive player of the year set a Pioneer record with his 16 receiving receptions and tied the school mark with 16 total touchdowns. He caught multiple passes in all 11 games and reached the end zone in nine different contests. In seven of the games, Arnold scored twice. He surpassed the 100-yard receiving mark in six games, including a stretch of three straight.

KEVIN BARNES, JR. *Waynesburg University* **5-11 224 WR**

Good sturdy receiver, nice hands and ability to absorb contact. 2016 Stats: 46 rec, 688 yds, 15.0 avg, 5 TDs. National Bowl selectee.

CHRIS BEALS *Susquehanna* **5-10 190 WR**

Durable, talented receiver who led team in TD receptions (6). Also gained 702 yds and averaged 14.6/rec.

THEO BELHOMME *Wisconsin Lutheran* 6-2 197 WR

Named Second Team All-NACC. Belhomme led the team with 47 catches for 778 yards, both team highs, and was fifth in the NACC averaging 77.8 yards per game. He also caught five touchdown passes.

DEON BISHOP *Hamline University* 6-3 190 WR

Honorable Mention All-MIAC. Good height, target and hands go with some decent speed. 2016 Stats: 44 rec, 571 yds, 12.98 avg, 3 TDs.

KIRBY BREAUULT *Juniata* 5-10 181 WR

Named to the Centennial Conference First Team last month and was the first Juniata wide receiver to be named to the First Team since 2007. Breault led the conference in receiving yards (1,325), receptions (84), touchdowns (11), receptions per game (8.4) and yards per game (132.5). He was second in all-purpose yards with 170 per contest. Breault had 100+ receiving yards in all but one game in 2016. His 84 receptions are the most in a season in Juniata history with his 1,325 yards the second highest.

BRENDAN BUISCH *Alfred University* 6-4 210 WR

Was named recipient of the Hal Brown Award as the team's Offensive MVP for a second straight year. Buisch set a new school single-season record with 16 TD catches and tied the school single-game mark with four touchdown receptions at Morrisville. He led the team in catches (64) and receiving yards (1,056, two yards off the school record). Buisch was a First Team Empire 8 All-Star and was also a First Team ECAC North All-Star and Third Team D3football.com All-East Region honoree.

QUINN BUSCHBACHER *UW-Platteville* 5-10 185 WR RS

WIAC co-Special Teams Player of the Year. Led the WIAC with 73 catches for 688 yards and eight touchdowns. He also leads the conference with a 31.3-yard kick return average on 14 returns. Buschbacher has also rushed for 140 yards this season and is third in the league with 126.6 all-purpose yards per game.

CODY CARLSON *Northwestern (MN)* 6-2 190 WR

Had a monster year for UNW, made big play after big play on the perimeter to lead the receiving corps. Carlson hauled in 57 receptions for 805 yards – finding the end zone four times in his final campaign. He averaged over 14 yards per catch and better than 73 receiving yards per contest. He also turned in three 100-yard receiving games.

DEVON CARRILLO *Wesleyan* 6-1 197 WR

Named Connecticut's 2017 Male Athlete of the Year joining Dick Jauron (Yale football, 1973), Steve Young (NFL Hall of Fame quarterback, 1985), Craig Janney and Brian Leetch (US Olympic hockey, 1987), Marlon Starling (1988 World Welterweight Boxing Champion), Rob Dibble (Cincinnati Reds pitcher, 1990), Dwight Freeney. Has excelled on both the football field and the wrestling mat for the Cardinals. This season, he was named First Team All-NESCAC Offense at wide receiver/running back, and Second Team All-NESCAC Specialist as a punt returner. The all-conference accolades mark the second of his career, as he was named a second team punt returner as a freshman in 2013. This year, the versatile senior excelled in multiple areas as he amassed 807 all-purpose yards, and averaged 100.9 per game to rank ninth in the NESCAC. He also led the league in punt return yards (267), finished second in the conference in rushing touchdowns (12), and finished 12th in receiving yards (349). Carrillo went 2-for-3 passing for 51 yards and two touchdowns as well, including a 48-yard score, and finished the season with 15 total touchdowns. On the wrestling mat, Carrillo has excelled in two seasons with the program and has qualified for the NCAA Tournament both years. He currently boasts an incredible 22-1 record at 197, and returns to the national championships after placing second in the regionals.

JOHNNY CARROLL *Linfield* **6-3 200 WR**

Transfer from Oregon State. All-NWC emerged as one of the most dangerous receivers in the NWC, pulling in a team-high 37 receptions, including 11 for touchdowns and a total of 494 yards.

JAKE CAWLINA *Curry* **6-0 185 WR**

2016: First Team All-NEFC Offensive selection. Played and started in all nine games. Recorded 60 receptions for 945 yards and 13 touchdowns, averaged 105.0 receiving yards per game, second in the NEFC. Tied for the conference lead in touchdown receptions (13). Led the team in scoring with 78 points. recorded 10 tackles on special teams (eight solo, two assisted). Tallied 38 kickoffs for a total of 1,819 yards.

EVAN CLARK *St. John's* **5-10 185 WR RS**

Led SJU with 43 catches for 892 yards and 13 touchdowns, and his 20.7 yards per reception was the fifth-best in a single season in school history. He led the MIAC with an average of 22.6 yards per reception (28 catches for 633 yards) and finished second with eight receiving touchdowns in conference play, though his

OWEN COSTELLO *Hampden-Sydney* **5-11 185 WR**

ALL-ODAC. Costello had the best season of his career, leading the Tiger receivers with 62 catches for 866 yards and eight touchdowns. He averaged 86.6 yards-per-game and 14.0 yards-per-catch while hitting the 100-yard mark four times, including a 154-yard performance against Catholic. Additionally, he rushed 14 times for 113 yards.

RYAN CRAWFORD *St. Vincent* **5-7 198 WR ATH**

Was the lone Bearcat to receive All-PAC First Team laurels as a terribly undersized H-Back/TE. Crawford earned the honor at H-Back/Tight End, hauling in 34 catches for 323 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Crawford put together a career-best performance against W&J on Oct. 29, recording eight catches for 101 yards.

ZACH CREIGHTON Carleton 6-1 181 WR QB

All-MIAC despite not transitioning from quarterback to wide receiver until midseason, he immediately gave opposing defenses problems. Creighton totaled at least nine receptions and 68 receiving yards in each of his six games at the new position. He finished the season with 65 receptions, tops among MIAC players. Creighton averaged 10.83 receptions per game at receiver, a figure that would have led Division III and been second among all NCAA players had he played the full season at the position. He totaled 554 receiving yards in his half-dozen contests at wideout, the most in the conference since Oct. 1 and an average of 92.3 yards per game. He also five touchdown receptions, ranking eighth overall on the year and the MIAC's fourth-best total after Oct. 1. Creighton also paced the Knights' ground game, leading the squad in rushing yards (273), yards per attempt (4.4), and rushing touchdowns (3).

JUSTIN CRUZ Oberlin 5-9 170 WR

One of the most prolific pass catchers in school history, Justin Cruz earned All-NCAC honorable-mention honors this fall, catching 67 passes for 767 yards and three touchdowns. Cruz departs Oberlin with 20 total touchdowns, throwing for one, while catching 19. He also posted the best single-game in school history, recording 242 receiving yards in a 48-9 win over Allegheny in 2014. In his career he registered 2,259 receiving yards, which ranks third all-time in school history.

NORMAN CUPICCIOTTI North Park 5-10 180 WR

Real blue collar receiver. Very good after the catch, fearless. 2016 Stats: 25 rec, 418 yds, 16.7 avg, 3 TDs.

JORDAN DABNEY UW-Stout 6-0 180 WR

Underrated receiver on a poor passing team. Good hands, solid after the catch, can get deep. 2016 Stats: 35 rec, 661 yds, 18.9 avg, 5 TDs.

ANTHONY DiMARSICO William Paterson 5-11 175 WR

Selected to the New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) Football All-Second Team. A 2014 first-team all-NJAC pick, DiMarsico started nine of 10 games this fall, catching 40 passes for 600 yards and a team-best seven touchdowns. He also added a TD on the ground, and finished 6-for-9 for 149 yards and a score through the air. In the league statistics, he ranks seventh in receptions/game (4.0) and receiving yards/game (60.0), eighth in scoring/TDs (5.0 points/game) and 12th in overall scoring.

QUINN DONALSON Johns Hopkins 6-0 200 WR

All-CC second team. Ranked second on the team in receptions with 39 for 550 yards and six touchdowns. His 550 yards are also second on the team, while his six touchdown catches are 2nd on the team. He ranks among Johns Hopkins' career receiving leaders with 127 receptions (12th) for 2,021 yards (11th) and 22 touchdowns (T5th).

KADEEM EDGE *Husson University* **6-5 180 WR**

Earned second team All-ECFC honors for the first time in his career after recording career-highs in receptions (24), yards (547) and touchdowns (7) in 2016. In 28 career games, he has recorded 37 catches for 811 yards and nine scores. The Boston, Mass. native broke the single-game school record for most receiving yards (158) at Becker on Oct. 29, 2016 en route to setting the school record for the most receiving yards in a single-season.

DANTE EDWARDS *Concordia (WI)* **6-0 210 WR**

Named All-NACC Second Team as a wide receiver. Appeared in and started nine games. Led the team with 59 receptions, 850 receiving yards and 10 receiving touchdowns. Ranked fourth in the NACC for receptions and receiving yards. Ranked third in the NACC for receiving touchdowns. Had three multi-touchdown performances

BRANDON EHRKE *Carroll* **6-3 187 WR**

All-CCIW 2nd Team. Sure-handed receiver with decent speed and very good movement after the catch. 2016 Stats: 35rec, 555 yds, 15.86 avg, 11 TDs.

GARRETT EICHHORN *Macalester* **6-5 197 WR**

All-Midwest Conference. Eichhorn caught 40 passes for a team-best 697 yards, which ranked fifth in the Midwest Conference. He had three 100-yard receiving games this year, including an eight-catch, 136-yard performance in the victory over Carleton. 17.43 yds/rec and 3 TDs.

AUSTIN ELLSWORTH *Illinois College* **6-2 210 WR SS**

Missed time due to injury but excelled when he was on the field. Voted to the first team All-MWC as both a wide receiver and defensive back. Despite getting very little time on the sidelines during the game, Ellsworth still managed to haul in 35 catches for 564 yards and four touchdowns. He also lined up in the backfield and had six carries for 109 yards, including an 81-yard burst for a score in the home opener against Simpson College. As a defensive back for the Blueboys, Ellsworth was in on 26.5 tackles (20 solo) and he led IC with four interceptions. He also led the team in passes defended with eight.

CHARLES ENSLEY *Hamilton* **5-10 181 WR**

2nd Team All-NESCAC, Ensley was Hamilton's top pass-catcher, finishing the season with 39 receptions for 557 yards. A team captain this year, he ranked third in the NESCAC in receiving yards and yards per catch (14.3) and fifth in catches. In 27 games as a Continental, Ensley caught 100 passes for 1,457 yards and nine touchdowns. He is fourth on the program's all-time list in career receiving yards.

COLLIN FEILLA Kalamazoo 6-3 195 WR

All-MIAA Second Team. Feilla caught 55 balls for 833 yards and found the endzone five times. He recorded two 200-yard performances in 2016, including a 215-yard day against Alma in which he found the endzone two times.

ALEC FISHER Rose-Hulman 6-2 210 WR

Alec graduates as one of the top receivers in Rose-Hulman history. First-team all-HCAC selection in 2014 and 2015. Second-team all-HCAC in 2016. third-team d3football.com all-North Region selection in 2014. Member of HCAC Championship Teams in 2013 and 2016. Starter for the first NCAA Division III Playoff Team in school history in 2016. Career school record holder for receiving yards (2,555) and receiving touchdowns (35). Ranks second in school history with 210 pass receptions. single-season school record holder with 15 touchdown catches in 2014. The only receiver in school history with two games featuring three receiving touchdowns each (Illinois College in 2014 and Hanover in 2015).

ALEX FOSTER Wisconsin Lutheran 6-0 190 WR

Received Honorable Mention recognition. Foster, a Honorable Mention selection a season ago as well, was second on the team with 34 receptions for 396 yards. He also led the team with six touchdown catches and 880 all-purpose yards.

ZAC FRANTZ Rowan 5-11 185 WR

Led the Profs with 593 receiving yards and five touchdowns on 33 catches. He ranked eighth in the NJAC in receiving yards (59.3 ypg) and tied for ninth in receptions (3.3 pg). Frantz caught four passes for 141 yards and two scores against Salisbury (Oct. 8) and made six receptions for 78 yards against Kean (Nov. 5). It was his first All-Conference selection.

MATT GILLEN Southwestern University 6-4 195 WR

SCAC Co-Offensive Player of the Year. Shared the league's co-offensive player of the year award with Texas Lutheran running back Marquise Barrolle. Gillen, a senior from Coppell, led the SCAC in almost every receiving category, including yards (951), yards per game (95.1) and receptions (73). He also ranked second with seven receiving touchdowns and third in yards per catch (13.0). Gillen had a streak of five consecutive games with at least seven catches and at least 135 yards receiving, including a 14-catch game against Wisconsin-River Falls on Sept. 24, which made him the only receiver in conference history to record multiple 14-reception games in a career. He set an SCAC single-game mark with five touchdown receptions in Southwestern's 48-0 win at Trinity on Oct. 15. Gillen, who also is a four-time, first-team all-league honoree, collected conference offensive player of the week honors two days later. He finishes his career at SU with 187 receptions for 2,523 yards and 18 touchdowns.

JEREMY GOMEZ Iowa Wesleyan 5-8 175 WR

Was the lone Tiger to be named to the UMAC First Team All-Conference Offense. Gomez led the conference with 910 yards receiving and 56 receptions. He averaged 91.0 yards per game and finished the season with 13 touchdown receptions, which was fourth in the UMAC in scoring.

MATT GREENMAN Mt. Ida 5-11 170 WR RS

Earned his fourth All-Conference selection and his third straight first team nod, and for the second consecutive year, Greenman was named both at the Wide Receiver and Return Specialists positions. Was second in the conference in receiving yards, yards per game, touchdowns (8) and receptions. He led the Mustangs with 40 receptions for 583 yards on the season, averaging 14.6 yards per catch and was consistently a deep threat, with longs of 75, 65 and 81 yards. As a returner, Greenman racked up 419 yards on 19 returns, and averaged 8.3 yards per punt return, capping of the year with an 85-yard touchdown kickoff return against Husson.

EVAN GUFFY Minnesota-Morris 6-2 180 WR

Was a First-Team All-UMAC selection in 2016 after recording career-highs in receptions (49), receiving yards (655), and total touchdowns (13).

CHRIS GUY Ferrum 5-11 193 WR

Caught 38 passes this year for 624 yards and five scores. His receiving yards and touchdowns led the team this year. He earned All-Conference second team honors in the USA South this season

NICK HAAS Huntingdon 6-1 181 WR

1st Team All USA South All-Conference, 2nd Team in 2015. Just the fourth Huntingdon player to catch at least 100 career receptions. 2016 Stats: 46 rec, 682 yds, 14.8 avg, 8 TDs.

SHANE HAGGERTY Mass Maritime 6-1 185 WR RS

First-team all-MASCAC accolades, as he set school single-season records for receptions (66) and yards (915) this fall while hauling in five touchdown passes. Haggerty averaged 20.5 yards on 18 kickoff returns in 2016 and chipped in with a 36.2 yard average on 24 punt attempts, as Shane also led the Buccaneers in all-purpose yards with 1,387 on the year.

KEVIN HAMMARLUND *Washington (MO)* **6-0 185 WR**

AFCA Second-Team and D3football.com Honorable-Mention All-American. D3football.com Second-team all-South Region. First-team all-SAA and all-UAA. Led the SAA and UAA with a WashU single-season school record 100 receptions for 1,365 yards. Led both leagues with 13 touchdowns. Ranked sixth in NCAA Division III in receptions per game (9.1) and receiving yards per game (124.1), and was also 12th in receiving TDs. Had nine games with over 100 receiving yards, including a career-high 10 catches for 171 yards and two touchdowns at Rhodes.

JOSH HARDRICK *LaGrange College* **5-9 170 WR**

While his teammates got the attention, Hardrick led the team in receptions for the second year in a row. 2016 Stats: 48 rec, 568 yds, 11.8 avg, 5 TDs.

JORDAN HARGROVE *Mount Union* **6-0 195 WR**

2016: Played in 7 games. Had 22 catches for 355 yards with two touchdowns. Had 3 catches for 96 yards with a TD against Marietta. 2015: All-OAC Second Team, Played in 15 games. Had 46 catches for 704 yards with 7 TDs.

JOSIAH HARRIS *Hamline University* **6-0 195 WR RS**

Named to the All-MIAC second team offense. Was listed a tight end but played several roles on offense. He caught the ball (54 times for 603 yards and nine TDs). He ran the ball (18 carries, 119 yards, 2 TDs) and also returned kickoffs (9-153).

TREVOR HEITLAND *Coe* **5-11 196 WR RB**

WR who in his only season as a RB Picked up his third All-American honor of the year, being named to the AP Little All-American First Team. was also the runner-up for the Gagliardi Trophy, awarded to the top player in NCAA Division III football and was named to the D3football.com All-West Region First Team and was the Iowa Conference Offensive Player of the Year. 2016 Stats: 317 carries, 1913 yds, 6.0 avg, 14 TDs; 42 rec, 494 yds, 11.8 avg, 5 TDs.

JALEN HENNINGSEN *Buena Vista* **5-10 192 WR KR**

Henningsen, who missed all of 2015 due to injury, responded nicely in his third full season of play by leading the team and the Iowa Conference during league play in receptions (50), receptions per game (7.1), yards (757) and yards per game (108.1). His five touchdowns were tied for the second-most against IAC foes. He tied school records with 15 catches and four touchdowns on Homecoming against Loras while setting a new school mark with 308 yards. Henningsen earns First Team honors for the first time in his career after landing Second Team accolades as a sophomore in 2013.

ETHAN HOPPE *Hendrix* **6-5 225 WR**

Had 48 catches for 716 yards and five touchdowns while averaging 14.9 yards per catch and 71.6 per game. He ranked sixth in the SAA in yards per catch, 10th in yards, 11th in receptions and tied for 11th in touchdowns. Hoppe was a 2015 & 2016 Honorable Mention All-SAA.

MARSHALL HOWELL *John Carroll* **5-11 170 WR**

Was the top pass catcher for the Blue Streaks in 2016, hauling in 43 throws for 379 yards and seven touchdowns -- all of which were team highs. The senior is the all-time leader at JCU with 2849 yards and 36 touchdowns, and became the second player in school history with 200 receptions with his final catch in JCU's NCAA playoff win over Olivet this past Saturday. A three-time all-league selection, Howell was a second team All-OAC choice in 2014 and first team last season.

BRIAN HUNCA *Kenyon* **5-10 182 WR**

D3football.com All-North Region team. Was the focal point of the Kenyon offense throughout the season. He started all ten games and wound up setting a program single-season record with 99 receptions. He took those receptions for 1,283 yards and eight touchdowns. His yardage total ranked first among all players in the North Coast Athletic Conference (NCAC) and sixth among all players in NCAA Division III football. Additionally, his average of 9.9 receptions per game ranked first in the conference and second in the nation. Hunca established Kenyon's single-game record with 18 receptions. He racked up a season-best 207 yards in that game, extending his streak to four games in which he tallied 150 or more receiving yards. A three-time All-NCAC honoree, Hunca exits the Kenyon football program ranked second all-time in career receptions (241) and career receiving yards (3,294). His total of 21 career touchdowns ranks tied for fourth in program history.

MARSALIS JACKSON *LaGrange College* **5-8 170 WR RS**

Finished his career as the school's all-time receiving yards leader with 2,378 and touchdowns scored receiving and overall with 27. He is third on the career list with 147 catches. This season, Jackson led the team for the third time in four years with 619 receiving yards. He had 43 receptions and scored six touchdowns. As a freshman, Jackson was the USA South Offensive Rookie of the Year after setting school records with 902 receiving yards and 12 TD catches. National Bowl invitee.

BLAKE JACKSON *Mary Hardin-Baylor* 6-0 205 WR QB

Named the ASC Offensive Player of the Year. A dual offensive threat, Jackson led the ASC with 35 touchdowns and ranked fifth in the ASC in passing (230.2) and 10th in rushing (47.9). Jackson anchored a UMHB offense that led Division III in scoring at 56.3 points per game.

NICK KAMPA *Hamline University* 5-11 180 WR

Named to the All-MIAC second team offense. Kampa led the Pipers with 56 catches for 770 yards and 10 touchdown receptions. The scoring number was second in the MIAC with the other two stats ranking third among all league receivers.

TIM KENNEDY *Mount Union* 5-10 180 WR

Finishes career has Mount Union all-time leader in punt returns and punt return yards. 2016: All-OAC First Team returner. Started all 14 games at receiver. Had a team-best 62 catches for 715 yards with 5 TDs. Had 2 100-yard receiving games. Had 11 catches for 105 yards at Alfred. Team Captain.

MATT KNAPP *UW-Eau Claire* 6-0 186 WR

All-WIAC. played a key role for the Blugold offense, both as a wide receiver and return specialist. The senior led Eau Claire with 37 receptions for 642 yard and eight touchdowns. Knapp also had 37 kick returns for 813 yards and 11 punt returns for 173 yards. In addition, he also rushed for 108 yards on 26 carries. Knapp's 1,736 all-purpose yards were a team-high as were his 48 points. In the WIAC, Knapp led the conference in all-purpose yards (1,642), was third in kick return average (19.4).

RYAN KOLB *Salisbury* 5-7 175 WR SLOT

ECAC South All-Star and starter at the slot position, scampered for 863 yards and four touchdowns, while catching six passes for 104 yards and a pair of scores.

NICK LAMB *Muhlenberg* 5-10 186 WR

Earned the unique distinction of being named to the first team at two positions. Muhlenberg's all-time leader in receptions, he is second in the CC in receiving yards (1015) and receiving touchdowns (10) and is third in catches (77). Lamb also is averaging a league-best 33.1 yards per kickoff return, scoring 2 return touchdowns.

DERRICK LEDET *East Texas Baptist* **6-6 185 WR**

Played 10 games in 2016. Had 36 receptions for 432 yards, including 168 yards on 11 receptions at Louisiana College (10/29/16). Longest reception was 60 yards at Louisiana College (10/29/16). Caught a touchdown at McMurry (10/08/16) and at Louisiana College (10/29/16). Named All-ASC Honorable Mention

DUKENS LEON *Bridgewater State University* **5-9 193 WR RS**

2ND Team All-MASCAC. Led the Bears with 58 catches and 606 receiving yards, He has also hauled in a pair of touchdowns and has rushed for another 64 yards and score. National Bowl selectee.

BOONE LEWIS *Johns Hopkins* **6-3 215 WR**

Good size and reliable receiver. Very good hands, solid red zone target. Caught 32 passes for 388 yds and six TDs on a team with multiple potntial targets.

CHRIS LIPSCOMB *Endicott College* **6-2 200 WR**

2016 NEFC All-Conference Second Team Wide Receiver. Lipscomb hauled in 40 catches for 647 yards and six touchdowns to cap his stellar career for the Gulls. Lipscomb also averaged 16.2 yards per catch, 64.7 all-purpose yards per game, and had two games with a pair of touchdown catches in addition to accumulating 899 punting yards on 24 attempts (37.5, 60 long, two touchbacks, six fair catches, three 50+, seven inside-20). Lipscomb finishes his career with 112 receptions for 1,622 yards (45.1 yards per game/14.5 average), and 11 touchdowns in 36 games played. Forward on basketball team as well.

RASHAD LOFTON *Concordia-Chicago* **5-10 185 WR RS**

Was honored twice with a first-team honor as a wide receiver and a second-team honor as a return man. Lofton caught 62 balls for 966 yards (15.6), and his 16 touchdowns both led the conference and set a new school season-record. As a return man, Lofton averaged 9.5 yards on 10 punt returns and 24.0 yards on 30 kickoff returns. Fast and shifty, very hard to tackle.

DANIEL LOPERA *Birmingham-Southern* **6-6 205 WR**

Super red zone target. Good after the catch. Uses height very well, but more than just a tall target. 2016 Stats: 16 rec, 309 yds, 19.3 avg. 5 TDs.

TAYLOR LOUDAN Christopher 5-10 170 WR RS
Newport

VaSID Offensive Player of the Year, was also named the Offensive End of the Year by the Richmond Touchdown Club for the second straight season as well as the New Jersey Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year this season. Loudan set the program record for receptions in a season in 2016 with 82. He also led the league in receiving yards per game (101.7 ypg) and scored nine touchdowns including eight through the air. He earned first team All-NJAC honors and was tabbed as the league's top offensive player after leading the Captains back into the national rankings and amid a playoff race with the top of the league. In addition to his pass-catching skills, Loudan was also the league leader in punt return average and ranked third in the NJAC in all-purpose yardage. With 82 catches for 1,017 yards this season, Loudan became the first player in program history to record multiple 1,000-yard receiving seasons. Along the way, he set a new school mark for career receptions and single season receptions, and also registered five 100-yard receiving performances.

BRENDON LYNCH Case Western 5-8 185 WR

Selected to the All-PAC and All-UAA First Teams during his senior year. Named to the CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team and the Academic All-District Team. Started all 10 games in 2016. Finished the year with 67 receptions (fourth in school history) for 1,049 yards (second in school history) and 12 touchdowns (second in school history). Recorded just the fourth 1,000+ yard receiving season in program history. Was 22nd among Division III players in receptions, 23rd in receiving yards per game (104.9), 24th in receiving yards, 40th in receptions per game (6.7), and 62nd in all-purpose yards per game (133.3) during the year. Scored at least one touchdown in six of the team's games, and two or more touchdowns on five occasions. Eclipsed 100 receiving yards four times during the year. Had at least four receptions in every CWRU game, and seven or more receptions in six games

SAM MARKHAM Central (IA) 6-2 170 WR

D3football.com all-America squad's third team. A first-team all-Iowa Conference selection this season, Markham led all of Division III with 10.5 catches per game after snaring 105 passes. After racking up 1,215 receiving yards, Markham finished ninth nationally in that category. He also had 12 touchdown receptions on the year, giving him the 22nd most in the country.

ZACH MARTINELLI Central (IA) 5-8 185 WR RS

Caught 33 passes for 438 yards and four touchdowns. He was also a first team all-conference selection as a return specialist.

JOHN McFARLAND Allegheny College 5-11 205 WR

Was selected to the NCAC Second Team, McFarland was the Gators' full-time starter at tight end for the fourth consecutive season, and turned in the finest campaign of his career. Amassed a team-leading 48 receptions for 552 yards and a touchdown. He posted at least two catches in all 10 games, including six games with at least five grabs, highlighted by a seven-catch, 115-yard performance in week seven at Denison. He also made seven receptions on Sept. 24 at Kenyon, while he picked up six catches in each of the Gators' final two games of the season. For his career, McFarland totaled 96 receptions, good for seventh all-time in program history, and second among tight ends, just six behind 1999 graduate Nathan Six, a three-time First Team All-NCAC honoree. McFarland closed his career by making at least two catches in 18 consecutive games, while he hauled in at least one catch in 26 of 30 games dating back to his sophomore campaign of 2014.

LAVELL MEEKS LaGrange College 6-1 190 WR

Had 38 receptions for 521 yards and a team-leading eight TD catches. Meeks had 938 yards and 79 receptions in two seasons with the Panthers. Chosen to play in the FCS National Bowl.

DUNCAN MERCER Centre 6-6 222 WR

Second Team All-SAA, paced the Colonels and ranking sixth in the SAA with 61 receptions on the season for 778 yards and four touchdowns. The senior finished with a career-high 143 receiving yards in a 66-28 win at Rhodes in week nine.

ESAUN MOBLEY FDU-FLORHAM 6-2 180 WR

Second Team All-MAC Freedom, Mobley was second on the team with 49 catches and 683 yards, while also pulling in four touchdowns. His game came against Wilkes, where he had nine catches for 145 yards and three touchdowns.

LUCAS MORLEY Catholic University 6-3 203 WR

Numbers were down from 2016 due to freshman QB and 2 games missed but in 2015, was national leader in receptions per game with 10.0 catches. Was named All-Region, First Team All-ODAC and played all 10 games. Caught 100 passes, nearly totaled 1,000 yards receiving (967) and caught 14 touchdowns. 2016 Stats: 33 rec, 407 yds, 12.3 avg, 10 TDs.

TRACEY MORRISON HOWARD PAYNE 5-9 170 WR RS

Finished the 2016 season ranked 19th in D3 as a kick returner. With 326 yards on 42 receptions for the Jackets this season, Morrison also had kickoff duties for HPU totaling 665 return yards. He became just the 5th player in American Southwest Conference history to have a 100 yard kickoff return for a touchdown. Starting all ten games for the Jackets this year, Morrison was also named to ASC Player of the Week and the HERO Sports D3 D/ST Player of the Week this season.

BRADLEY MUNDAY Johns Hopkins 5-8 175 WR

Earned first team All-Centennial honors for the 3rd time. Led the team in receiving with 77 receptions for 683 yards and 7 touchdowns. He now counts career totals of 258 receptions for 2,903 yards and 25 touchdowns.

ANTHONY NASTASI Curry 5-9 190 WR

2016: NEFC All-Conference Second Team Offensive Selection. Played in all nine games at wide receiver. Caught 82 passes for a total of 772 yards averaging 85.8 yards per game. Pulled in four touchdown passes. Had a season high in receptions (14), yards (165) vs. MIT.

MIKE NOLDEN Beloit 6-2 215 WR

A three-time First Team All-MWC selection, the first Buccaneer Football player to be so honored since 2008-10, led the Bucs in receiving with 60 catches for 889 yards and nine touchdowns. The nine touchdown receptions were the second-most in the MWC and are the third-most in a season in Beloit history while the 60 catches are tied for the fourth-most in a season at Beloit and the 889 yards receiving were fifth-most in a season. For his career he finished as the all-time leader in receptions (193) and receiving TDs (30), was second in receiving yards (2,605) and fourth in all-purpose yardage (3,464). In his career he had eight 100-yard receiving games and two games with three touchdown catches, which ties for the most ever for the Bucs.

GABRIEL NOYCE Cornell (IA) 6-0 215 WR P

Team's leader in receptions. Really good hands guy. 2016 Stats: 53 rec, 573 yds, 10.8 avg, 4 TDs. Very good punter as well. 2016 Stats: 59 punts, 2247 yds, 38.1 avg, 75 long, 4 TB, 19 FC, 20 (i20), 7 (50+), 2 BLOCKED.

CALEB OLIVER Texas Lutheran 6-2 180 WR

Oliver picked up his third straight All-SCAC First Team selection. The senior receiver concluded his Bulldog career with a 2016 campaign that included 30 catches for 428 yards and three touchdowns. Oliver's 22 receiving touchdowns are the third-most in school history. He ranks in the Bulldogs' DIII-era Top 10 for total scoring and receiving yards.

TERRANCE OWENS, II Averett 6-3 185 WR

Played in all 10 games as a senior. Made 59 receptions for 926 yards and seven touchdowns. Notched five 100-plus games, including a longest reception of 57 yards. Finished his career with 2,118 receiving yards, ranking him second all-time in program history. Finished second all-time in program history for touchdown receptions with 17. Named to the USA South All-Conference First Team as a wide receiver. Selected to the Roanoke All-State First Team as a wide receiver. Earned VaSID All-State First Team honors.

JOEL OXTON UW-La Crosse 6-1 170 WR

1st Team All-WIAC. Starting all 10 games, Oxton led UWL in receptions (72), receiving yards (951) and receiving touchdowns (10) in 2016. Oxton also had one rushing touchdown. He averaged 13.2 yards per catch while finishing with at least one catch in all 10 games (seven games with at least five receptions). Oxton ranks second in the WIAC in receptions, receiving yards, touchdowns, receptions per game (7.20) and receiving yards per game (95.1). He is also tied for fourth in total touchdowns (11), eighth in all-purpose yards per game (95.4) and tied for eighth in scoring (6.6 points per game). His 72 receptions are tied for third in single-season school history while his 951 receiving yards ranks fourth. Oxton's 10 receiving touchdowns is third-most in UWL single-season school history.

JARED PANKOW UW-Stevens Point 6-0 180 WR

Picked up second team all-conference honor as he was named to the All-WIAC honorable mention squad a season ago. This year, Pankow led UWSP in receiving yards with 891, more than 400 yards over his junior season. Pankow caught at least one pass for 30 or more yards in eight of the Pointers' 10 games this season. Had 5 TDs.

ALEX PASIEWICZ Lake Forest 6-0 200 WR RS

Wide receiver and returner, was named First Team All-American. He tied for the national lead with a school record three kickoff return touchdowns and two scores on punt returns this season and ranked third in the country with 997 combined kick return yards and 192.9 all-purpose yards per game. Pasiewicz ranked 10th in the nation with 29.9 yards per kickoff return and 20th with 12.9 yards per punt return. He finished his career with 10 program records, including the highest career kickoff and punt return averages. Was also team's leading receiver with 53 rec, 865 yds, 16.3 avg, and 11 TDs.

SOREN PELZ-WALSH Castleton 6-0 185 WR

Honored as a First-Team CoSIDA Academic All-American & as a member of the ECFC All-Academic team. Selected to ECFC First-Team All-Conference. Selected as team MVP. Led ECFC in receptions (61), and yards (785). Tied for first in the conference with nine receiving touchdowns. Leaves Castleton second all-time in receiving touchdowns with 18, third in career receptions with 175 and receiving yards with 2,355.

REED PETERSON Linfield 5-10 177 WR

All-NWC. Peterson caught a club-best 12 touchdowns among his 36 receptions, averaging 73.3 yard per game and a team-high 18.3 yards per catch.

JAKE PFOHL Hobart 6-3 210 WR

ECAC North All-Star first team. All-Liberty League first team. NFF Hampshire Honor Society. Started all 11 games. Finished second on the team in receptions (58), receiving yards (705), and receiving touchdowns (9). Caught a Hobart game record tying 12 passes for 197 yards and two touchdowns at WPI, scoring the game-winning touchdowns with just three seconds remaining in the game. His performance against the Engineers earned him the Liberty League and ECAC North offensive player of the week awards.

JOSHUA PHILANDER *Hiram College* 6-0 176 WR

Proved himself to be a key component of the Terrier offense while breaking school records and posting new career-highs in the process. The first time All-NCAC honoree finished his senior season with ten touchdown receptions, breaking the school's previous single-season record (9). Seven of his ten receptions came in the last two games of the season, including a school-record four TDs in a season-ending victory over Oberlin. In his final ten games at Hiram, Philander finished with 1064 receiving yards on 67 receptions, falling just 31 yards short of the school record for single-season yardage.

Started all 12 games at wide receiver. Led team with 70 receptions for 1,051 yards, scoring nine touchdowns. Caught season-high 11 passes in 35-14 win at North Park and established season high of 164 yards in 35-21 win at Robert Morris-Chicago. Ranked first in CCIW in receiving yards per game and second in receptions per game. First Team All-CCIW. D3football All-North Region Third Team selection.

DYLAN WARDEN North Central (IL) 6-1 192 WR
