He recorded 13 tackles for loss which tied for fifth in the CIAA in addition to forcing two fumbles. A 2014 CIAA All-Rookie selection as a freshman, Cosby won five CIAA Defensive Player of the Week awards in his career including three this season.

2017: G-MAC Honorable Mention. Recorded 46 tackles on the season, including 6.0 tackles for loss. Johnson, who added a forced fumble and a pass breakup, led the Pioneers with 2.5 sacks.

SAM JOHNSON HENDERSON STATE

2017: A two-time First Team All-GAC selection for the Reddies during his final two seasons in 2016 and 2017, and finished his career at Henderson with 106 total stops, 24 for lost yardage and 13.5 sacks. This past season, Johnson had 50 tackles and led HSU and was fourth in the GAC in tackles for loss with 13.5 stops behind the line of scrimmage. 2016: First Team All-GAC, second in the GAC in sacks with 6.0.

Martin led the nation in sacks (15.5) and tackles for loss (26.5), despite being the only returning starter on a defense that featured 16 players that made their first career starts during the year. He broke the NCAA all-division record for career sacks, finishing with 56.0 sacks over his 48 consecutive games played. Martin also shattered the Division II career record for tackles for loss, finishing with 92.5 to top the former record by more than 15 (77.0).

Schwartz earned his second first team selection after accumulating 27 tackles, including 5.0 tackles for loss and one recovered fumble. 2016: All-Great Northwest Athletic Conference first team, tied for the GNAC lead in total sacks with 9.0

ZACH SIELER FERRIS STATE

6-6 290 DE/

2017: Will forgo his final season of eligibility and enter the 2018 National Football League Draft. A consensus All-America choice each of the past two seasons and twice received the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) Defensive Lineman of the Year honor along with being chosen in both 2016 and 2017 as the Division II Conference Commissioners Association (D2CCA) Super Region Defensive Player of the Year. He began his FSU career as a walk-on before becoming one of the nation's top defensive linemen over the last two seasons. his past fall, Sieler led the Bulldogs with 21 tackles for loss (-74 yards) and seven quarterback sacks (-46 yards) despite consistently drawing multiple blockers while ranking third in total tackles (79) in addition to forcing two fumbles, recovering two fumbles, breaking up two passes and blocking a kick. Along with being a consensus first team All-American, he was also chosen as a national finalist for the Cliff Harris National Small College Defensive Player of the Year honor for the second consecutive season. Sieler was also a three-time GLIAC All-Academic Team honoree. As a sophomore in 2016, Sieler set new school records with 29.5 tackles for loss (-164 yards) and 19.5 sacks (-138 yards) while helping FSU to the school's second-ever NCAA Division II National Semifinal appearance. He ranked among the nation's top five players in both categories and led the GLIAC while also ranking as FSU's third-leading tackler with a personal career-high 80 stops, including 37 solo hits. Sieler added a team-high five forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, a blocked kick and a pass breakup while starting all 15 games in 2016. In 2016, Sieler was tabbed as the Football Gazette National Defensive Player of the Year.

2017: All-NSIC North Division first team. Had 20 tackles, 7.0 TFLs, 3.5 sacks, 2 QBHs, FR.

RONNY TOMASETTI **KUTZTOWN**

6-3 255 DE/

2017: All-PSAC East First Team. Tomasetti excelled as an edge-rusher throughout his four-year career, earning his second All-PSAC selection in his senior season. On Sept. 2 versus Assumption, the Dickson City-native delivered a career-best performance, registering six tackles, two sacks and a forced fumble. For the season, Tomasetti recorded 10 tackles-for-loss and 4.5 sacks, racking up 23 tackles for a stingy KU defensive unit which surrendered 19.5 points per game, third best in the PSAC. A 2017 team captain, Tomasetti rushed twice for four yards and a touchdown against Cheyney on Nov. 4. Ends his illustrious career in Maroon and Gold starting 42-of-44 games, including 25 consecutive starts, racking up 35 tackles for loss and 19.5 sacks, tied for fifth all-time.

2017: Played in all 11 games for the Beavers. Totaled 43 tackles including 18 solo and 25 assisted. Tallied three sacks and five tackles for loss. Recovered one fumble vs Minnesota Duluth (Oct. 26). Blocked one field goal vs Winona State (Aug. 31). Named to NSIC All-Conference Honorable Mention Team in his final season with the Beavers. Selected to participate in the 2017 FCS Bowl National Team. 2016: All-NSIC Second Team Defense. 2015: All-NSIC Honorable Mention Team.

LUKE WRIGHT **FORT HAYS STATE**

2017: Earned his first all-conference nod now in his fifth year with the program. He has started all games this year, putting together 12 tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss, two sacks, and two pass break-ups.

ANTHONY APPLETON**AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL****6-0 320 DT/**

2017: NE10 All-Conference First Team Defense honors. Appleton recorded a career-high 38 tackles this season in 10 games, including 14 for a loss of 64 yards.

NICK AUMUA**CENTRAL WASHINGTON****6-3 285 DT/**

2017: Strong, great push, very disruptive at line. 1st Team All-GNAC. Had 24 tackles 9.0 of which were TFLs with 4.5 sacks. Also had a PBU and 2 hurries.

JEMAL AVERETTE**INDIANA (PA)****6-2 288 DT/**

2017: Finished his collegiate career as a three-time Don Hansen All-Super Region One selection, earning third team honors in 2015 and 2016 in addition first team this year. He totaled 168 tackles in 43 games (32 starts) with 29.5 tackles-for-loss and 12.5 sacks. 2016: All-Super Region One (Don Hansen, 3rd team), All-PSAC West (2nd team). 2015: All-Super Region One (Don Hansen, 3rd team), 2015 All-PSAC West (1st team). Suffered through several injuries as a junior and still earned all-region and all-conference honors despite playing just seven of IUP's 12 games in 2016

KEANE BELCHER**GRAND VALLEY STATE****6-3 290 DT/**

2017: First-Team All-GLIAC. Tallied 24 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss and a QB sack despite missing the final two games with a lower body injury.

TRUETT BOX**CHADRON STATE****6-2 285 DT/**

2017: D2CCA All-Super Region Second Team. Had the top statistical season of any RMAC interior lineman and was nominated for the Gene Upshaw Award this fall, which goes to the nation's top senior offensive or defensive man in the trenches. His three forced fumbles tied for first in the nation among interior linemen, his 11.5 tackles for loss were the best in the region at his position, and his four sacks were among the leaders as well for defensive tackles. Box recorded 64 total tackles, finishing fourth on the team. He also recovered a

fumble, broke up two passes and intercepted a third, and had three quarterback hurries on the season. Three-technique defensive lineman for the Eagles.

2017: Don Hansen All-Super Region Three Third Team. Finished third on the team with 57 tackles and added a blocked kick, a fumble recovery, 2.0 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. He had nine solo stops but led the team with 48 assists. Busse has been a two-time first-team all-conference selection in his career after earning second team honors in 2015 and honorable mention honors in 2014. Busse was All-NSIC North First Team the past two seasons. He finished his Dragon career with 173 tackles, 18.5 sacks and 29 tackles for loss. 2016: Named to All-NSIC North First Team, named to Don Hansen All-Super Region 3 third team. 2015: Named to All-NSIC North Division Second Team.

JOSH GANZELLI**WEST CHESTER****6-0 285 DT/**

2017: Produced a strong year on the interior of West Chester's defensive line as he registered 25 tackles, five tackles for a loss and two sacks on the year. Ganzelli is a three-time All-PSAC East selection being honored with his second postseason honor this fall, 3rd Team All-Region. He graduates with 132 career tackles to his credit, including 21 for a loss, which also includes seven career sacks. He was a force on the interior, providing a pass rush up the middle while showing the ability to stuff the run. 2016: earned PSAC Eastern Division All-Conference Defensive First Team honors, earned Don Hansen FB Gazette All-Super Region One Team honors.

AUSTIN JASPER**TIFFIN****6-4 285 DT/**

2017: GLIAC's Honorable Mention. Had a stellar season on the defensive line, finishing with the most tackles on the defensive line with 34. Jasper also posted 8.5 tackles for loss, and 2.0 sacks.

VINNY JONES**TIFFIN****6-4 280 DT/**

2017: GLIAC's Honorable Mention. Was a mainstay at defensive line for Tiffin, logging 24 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss, and one fumble recovery.

AUNTRELL MACK**WINGATE****6-2 310 DT/**

2017: First team All-SAC. After missing the 2016 season due to injury, Mack enjoyed a break-out 2017 campaign. He had 40 tackles with 5.5 tackles for loss (16 yards). Mack had

two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and three quarterback hurries. In Wingate's historic 31-27 victory over Carson-Newman, Mack had career-high totals of 13 tackles and two forced fumbles. Wingate's defense held the C-N Eagle offense to three second-half points. In 2013, Mack led the NCAA and the SAC with four fumble recoveries.

CHRIS OKOYE FERRIS STATE

2017: Football Gazette All-Super Region Three Second-Team. He closed the year with 25 total stops and added two tackles for loss and a forced fumble while plugging the middle for one of the nation's top defensive units. This year, Okoye helped lead the Bulldogs to their fourth consecutive NCAA Division II Playoff appearance. FSU reached the D2 National Quarterfinals for the second consecutive campaign following a national semifinal berth in 2016.

Finalist for 2017 Cliff Harris Award, tying for most votes among NCAA Division II finalists. Invited to compete in the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl and Reese's Senior Bowl. Transfer from Simon Fraser. Canadian.

2017: G-MAC Honorable Mention. Led Malone with 7.0 tackles for loss. Shreve finished the season with 53 tackles, 2.0 sacks, and two pass breakups.

2017: All-MIAA Third Team. MIAA Scholar Athlete. Appeared in 11 games. Finished with 37 tackles with 7.5 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks, had two fumble recoveries and three quarterback hurries

2017: Was one of the league leaders in sacks this season with seven sacks, the third-highest total in the NSIC and a career-best. Pittsley had a string of five straight games where he reached the opposing signal caller, including games with 2.5 sacks against Bemidji State and 2.0 sacks against MSU Moorhead. He finished the season with 31 tackles and 8.0 tackles for loss.

2017: All-Super Region 2. 1st Team All-GSC. Earned All-GSC honors for a third straight year after being a second-team selection in 2015 and 2016. He was fifth on the team with 44 tackles including 10 tackles for loss of 37 yards and 3.5 sacks for 25 yards. 2016: second-team All-Gulf South Conference honors, Third-team Don Hansen All-Super Region 2

TRIPHINUE TAYLOR**CENTRAL MISSOURI****6-3 310 NG/**

2017: Honorable Mention All-MIAA. Had 35 tackles including five for a loss and two sacks. 2015: Earned Third Team All-MIAA honors.

DEVONTE WEST**FORT VALLEY STATE****6-2 315 NG/**

2017: Contributed with 30 tackles, 5.5 were TFLs, 3 QBHs, FF and FR.

TRAVIS WILLIAMS**SOUTHERN ARKANSAS****6-0 283 NG/**

2017: After claiming All-GAC First-Team honors as a junior transfer from Southwest Mississippi Junior College last season, Williams again earned First-Team honors in his senior campaign after once again anchoring a defensive front that dominated offensive lines all season long. Williams' presence along with his dominance last season at the nose guard position was more than enough to force opposing coaches to try and scheme around him, but the savvy senior delivered statistically anyway by registering 42 total stops, five quarterback hurries, 2.5 tackles for loss, a half sack, and one fumble recovery, while picking off his first career pass after jumping a screen play in the season finale against Arkansas-Monticello. Williams was an imposing fixture for a Mulerider defense that finished the season ranked in the top four in total defense (2nd | 346.5 ypg), rushing defense (2nd | 140.9 ypg), sacks by, (2nd | 23), opponent first downs (2nd | 18.7), opponent third-down conversions (2nd | 38.7%), and scoring defense (4th | 26.7 ppg).

Williams, who spent a majority of his time handling opponent double teams, concludes his playing career for the Muleriders after starting in all 23 games for SAU the past two

seasons where he totaled 86 tackles, 10.5 TFL and 1.5 sacks. 2016: Second team All-Super Region Three; All-GAC First-Team.

BRIAN MAYBERRY SIOUX FALLS

6-3 283 NT/

2017: Was named All-NSIC honorable mention for the second straight year. He had 29 tackles, including 13 solo stops, three tackles for loss, a sack, pass breakup and fumble recovery. Mayberry a powerful inside tackle on the league's top-ranked defense, has 80 career tackles, seven tackles for loss, three sacks, two pass breakups, a forced fumble and fumble recovery. Twice, he has been Academic All-NSIC. 2016: Named Honorable Mention All-NSIC.

DAKOTA MONTOYA EASTERN NEW MEXICO

2017: Honorable Mention All-LSC. Garnered Honorable Mention All-LSC in 2016 and followed with an extremely strong season. He consistently was a disruptive force in opposing backfields and led the Hounds with 11 quarterback hurries. When needed, Montoya showed the ability to make the big play for the Hounds, as his interception return for a touchdown at third-ranked Texas A&M-Commerce displayed. He continuously hampered UT Permian Basin with five quarterback pressures, which limited the Falcons to a 36.3 completion percentage in a three-point win.
