For his career Meyer averaged a school record 39.4 yards/punt. He also established the single season record of 41.7 yards in 2018.

Due to his outstanding play this season, Moreno has been named an All-American by all five outlets at the Division II level. Moreno has become the most decorated football player in Minot State history at this level. Moreno has become one of the most decorated Beaver football players in history thanks to his outstanding year. Moreno was near the top of the nation in every statistical category for punting at the division two-level. Moreno finished second in the nation in punting yards (3,118) and sixth in the country in punting average (42.70). Moreno had 22 punts land inside the 20-yard line on the season and booted 23 punts 50 yards or more. 2018: NSIC North Division All-Conference First Team at punter and kicker. 2017: First Team All-NSIC honors as a punter.

2019: All-American. For the 2019 season, Brown averaged 1.72 field goals per game in 2019, succeeding on 19-of-23 attempts. He added in a school-record 52 PAT makes for 109 points on the season. He racked up 232 points over two years, making 47 field goals and 91 PAT tries as the Tigers' kicker. In 2018, Brown had one of the most successful kicking seasons in NCAA Division II history, converting 28 field goals out of 33 attempts. His 28 field goals in 2018 were second most for a season in Division II history, only two shy of the record 30 set by Jeff Glas from the University of North Dakota in 2005. Brown broke the MIAA record of 25 made by Simon Mathieson in 2015, but Mathieson set that record in 15 games played compared to just 12 for Brown. Brown also broke Mathieson's MIAA record for attempts in a season. His 123 points in 2018 set a new FHSU single-season scoring record. Even with his impressive accolades at kicker, Brown was also an All-America selection at punter in both 2017 and 2018 for Fort Hays State. He served as both the team's kicker and punter in 2018, earning All-MIAA First Team accolades at both positions. He averaged 41.4 yards per punt in 2018 with 14 attempts going for more than 50 yards. He tied the school record for longest punt with an 84-yard boot. In 2017, he served solely as the team's punter and averaged 43.5 yards per attempt, which included 21 attempts going for more than 50 yards. Over the two years in a punting role, he averaged 42.4 yards per attempt, second best in FHSU history.

He earns his second consecutive first team honor as a placekicker after breaking the all-time PSAC record for scoring by a kicker earlier this season. Chapla already owns the all-time SRU records for scoring (369 points), field goals made (49) and extra points made (222). He ranks first among all active players at any position in Division II in scoring and made PAT kicks and ranks in the top five among all active players at any level of college football in both categories as well. This season, Chapla has booted 64 PAT kicks and made 10 field goals, including a 31-yarder in the fourth quarter that helped lift SRU to the PSAC title last week at Kutztown. As a punter, Chapla has attempted just 16 punts this season and is averaging 35.6 yards per punt with two over 50 yards and four inside the 20. 2018 D2CCA All-Super Region 1. 2019: Haite earned All-Region honors for the first time in his career with his third team selection by Don Hansen's Football Gazette. The two-time All-NE10 kicker, earning first team honors this season, collected NE10 Special Teams Player of the Week accolades twice this fall. Haite was named to The Fred Mitchell Award "Watch List" five times over his career, with preseason honors as a sophomore, junior and senior, while also receiving September honors this fall. The William V. Campbell Trophy® semifinalist by the National Football Foundation has earned NE10 Academic All-Conference accolades as a junior. Haite finished second on the team this fall in scoring with 75 points (4th NE10), leading the NE10 with a 59.5-yard average on kickoffs and 20 touchbacks. He converted a school-record 13 field goals this season to lead the NE10 and rank 13th nationally in Division II, leading the Conference (32nd nationally) for field goal percentage (76-percent), while his 36 PATs are the second-highest single-season total in program history, one shy of the record. Haite capped his career as the program's all-time leading scorer with 244 points, finishing with school records for career PATs (118) and made field goals (42). He ranks second in program history for career field goal percentage (71.2%) and PAT% (92.9%).

He was fourth in the NSIC in field goals made and seventh in kicking points and was tied with Luke Williams of Minnesota State for the fewest missed kicks in the NSIC this season (three). Knudson became Wayne State's all-time field goal leader this season (38-49) and finished second in career kicking points with 226.

Ortiz also handled the punting duties for WSU in 2019, averaging 38.82 yards/attempt with eight punts sailing over 50 yards and 17 of those landing inside the opponent 20-yard line. Ortiz was named First Team All-Conference (kicker & punter) in 2019, earned First Team All-Region accolades by the D2CCA and Don Hansen Football Committee on top of his now All-American season.

He booted 41 of his 42 extra point attempts through the uprights and went 13 for 17 on field goals as he finished sixth in the LSC with 82 total points. Connected on a season-long 47-yard field goal against Western New Mexico on Oct. 19 and nailed a pair of field goals, including the game-winner, in the Hounds OT win over Angelo. Vargas was a dual-threat special teams standout and also handled punting duties for the Hounds, averaging 39.7 yards and placing eight punts inside the 20-yard line. 2018: D2CCA All-Super Region 4, Third Team. 2019: Racked up four All-America honors this postseason. Walters had a record-breaking campaign as a senior with the Warriors, tying the ESU single-season program record with 16 made field goals on the year while also setting a new ESU and PSAC record with a 56-yard field goal at West Chester on October 26. Rounded out his ESU career with 188 points, good for fourth-most by a kicker in program history. Walters finished the year 16-for-19 on field goal attempts for an 84.2-percent conversion rate, and was also perfect on extra points, converting all 40 of his attempts on the season. In addition to his kicking duties, Walters also served as the team's punter. The senior averaged 41.2 yards per punt, which was the third-highest in the PSAC. He pinned opponents inside their own 20-yard line a league-high 17 times on the season.
