WESTERN NEW MEXICO

6-0 237 ILB/

2017: LSC Second-Team. D2CCA Second-Team All-Super Region 4. has been one of the top tackling linebackers in the nation the past two years as he added 118 more this year to lead the team. He was third in the LSC and 14th nationally in total tackles per game (10.7), fourth in tackles for loss per game (1.4), sixth in sacks per game (0.50) and ninth in solo tackles per game (4.3). He also led the team in tackles for loss with 15.5 and sacks with 5.5. In addition he added a pass breakup, a forced fumble, eight quarterback hurries and 47 solo stops. He had at least 10 tackles in seven games. Over just the past two seasons alone he piled up 221 tackles and if you include his numbers since his redshirt freshman year in 2014 he amassed 327 tackles. The tackles for loss also increased in the past two years as he compiled 23. 2016: 2nd Team All-LSC.

2017: First Team All-LSC. Had a standout year for the Hounds in 2017. He led the Hounds with 8.5 tackles for a loss which included four sacks. Equally adept in coverage, Blue broke up five passes. In a hard-fought win over Angelo State, he forced a fumble early in the second quarter of a game ENMU won by 10 points. Blue had a strong game at Tarleton State with two sacks in addition to a quarterback pressure. 2016: Second Team All-Lone Star Conference.

2017: Had 82 total tackles (37 solo, 45 assisted), with 13 tackles for loss totalling 60 yards. Recorded four sacks for a loss of 33 total yards. Forced one fumble and had one pass breakup. Set single-game career highs with 14 total tackles, eight solo tackles, and one forced fumble against Minnesota Duluth (Oct. 26), three tackles for loss at Augustana (Sep. 16), 1.5 sacks at MSU Moorhead (Nov. 11), and one pass break up at Northern State (Oct. 21). Tied a career single game high with eight assisted tackles against SMSU (Sep. 23). Chosen to play in the 2017 FCS Bowl National Team.

2017: 1st Team All-NE10. Had 38 tackles with 2.5 sacks, 4 TFL, one interception and three pass breakups.

ETHAN FUGITT**PITTSBURG STATE****6-2 236 ILB/**

2017: PSU team captain. Third-team All-MIAA. Made 45 tackles (24 solo) with 3.5 tackles-for-loss and 2.0 quarterback sacks. Played running back as a freshman.

BRYCE GAGNON**SOUTHWEST BAPTIST****6-0 245 ILB/**

2017: All-GLVC honorable mention. A very good linebacker, hard-hitting, alert, aware of the situation. Made 89 tackles, 11.0 TFLs, 0.5 sack, PBU, 2 FR (2 TDs). 2016: 2nd Team All-GLVC.

ANTHONY HARDY**MILES COLLEGE****6-3 225 ILB/**

2017: Earned his first All-SIAC honor after leading the Golden Bears in total tackles (87), which is third in the SIAC. 2017: Saved his best year for last and adds to his list of accomplishments for 2017 that includes G-MAC Defensive Lineman of the Year, first team all-G-MAC, and second team all-region from the D2CCA. Hopkins recorded 50 tackles, 13.5 tackles for a loss and 5.5 sacks during his final season at Findlay.

LUKE HRAPCHAK **CALIFORNIA (PA)**

Three-year starter. 2017: Second-Team All-America honoree. Earned first-team all-region status for a consecutive season from Football Gazette. He led the team and tied for fifth in the region, which is comprised of 45 schools, with a career-high 118 tackles (58 solo). Hrapchak posted double-digit stops in six games this year and made at least eight tackles in the last nine games of the season. CODY LINDSAY **MISSOURI WESTERN**

6-2 245 ILB/OLB

2017: Named first team All-MIAA linebacker. The three-time honorable mention All-MIAA selection led all MIAA linebackers with 17.5 tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks. Lindsay, a senior, led Missouri Western with a career-high 97 total tackles while also returning his lone interception for a touchdown, breaking up four passes, recording seven quarterback hurries and two fumble recoveries. 2014, 2015, 2016: Honorable Mention All-MIAA

ANFERNEE MOFFETT **NEWBERRY**

6-2 230 ILB/

2017: Started nine games at inside linebacker and played in all 11. Newberry's fourth-leading tackler with 49 stops, including 29 solo efforts. Had a sack, a quarterback hurry, and five tackles for loss on the season. Intercepted a pass and broke up two others.

TREVOR MYKLEBUST **WEST TEXAS A&M**

6-0 244 ILB/

Plays the SAM. 2017: Despite just 8 tackles short of 100 and being team's leading tackler, did not receive post seasons honors. Finished with 92 tackles, 3.5 TFLs, 1.5 sacks, INT, 2 PBU, QBH, FF. 2016: Early season injury; 2015: HM All-LSC.

TRYSTEN ROSS**BEMIDJI STATE****6-2 232 ILB/**

2017: Played in all 11 games for BSU. Recorded 59 total tackles (25 solo and 34 assisted), 10 tackles for loss totalling 39 yards, and three sacks for 27 yards. Had one fumble recovery, two interceptions and two pass breakups. Recovered one fumble against Minnesota Duluth (Oct. 26). Chosen to play in the 2017 FCS Bowl National Team. 2016: North Division All-Conference First Team Defense.

KEITH SCHWICKERATH**UPPER IOWA****6-0 225 ILB/OLB**

2017: All-NSIC South Division Honorable Mention. Led the Peacock defense in tackles with 81, which ranks 15th in the NSIC, in his final season. The senior linebacker blocked three punts, the fifth most in the nation and tops in the conference, including a pair in the season opener at UMC; both led to touchdowns, one of which was scored by Schwickerath after he picked up his block. He was named the NSIC Special Teams Player of the Week for his efforts against the Golden Eagles. Schwickerath registered 7.5 tackles for loss including 2 sacks and forced 5 fumbles, which tied for the conference lead with two other players, as well. He registered a career-high 19 tackles in UIU's loss to the No. 13 University of Sioux Falls.

CRAIG SZYMANSKI**ST. CLOUD STATE****6-2 235 ILB/**

2017: Second Team All-NSIC North selection on defense. It was the second All-NSIC selection for Szymanski, who was a First Team choice during his sophomore season. He played and started all 11 games between linebacker and defensive end and put up 27 tackles, five tackles for loss, three sacks, a pass breakup and a blocked kick.

FE'AO VUNIPOLA**EASTERN NEW MEXICO****6-0 230 ILB/**

2017: Honorable Mention All-LSC. Garnered his first All-LSC selection with a standout season for the Hounds. He finished with 45 tackles, which included six for a loss. Vunipola also recovered a fumble in ENMU's win over Southwest Baptist. He registered a season-high eight stops in wins over SBU and West Texas A&M.

GABE CLEVELAND EMPORIA STATE

6-1 221 MLB/

2017: All-Region. Was a First-Team All-MIAA linebacker for the Hornets. He had 112 tackles on the season with 67 of them solo and three interceptions. He was fifth in the nation in solo tackles this season and eighth in total tackles per game, ranking second in the MIAA in both categories.

DAKOTA EVERETT EAST STROUDSBURG

6-3 255 MLB/

Transferred from Stony Brook. 2017: All-PSAC East 2nd team. Ranked third in the PSAC in tackles per game (10.1), with 101 tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks, two forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and four blocked kicks. He posted double-digit tackles in six of his final seven games, and at least seven tackles in all but one of his 10 starts.

2017: HM All-GLIAC. Team's leading tackler with 99. Added 0.5, 11 TFLs, and 2 PBU's.

EVAN PATRICK LIMESTONE

6-1 240 MLB/

2017: Second-Team All-SAC honoree, Patrick was a four-year starter for the Saints and graduates with 221 career tackles, including 102 solo stops, 16.5 tackles for loss, and 3.5

sacks. He posted a 15-tackle performance against Carson-Newman during his junior season.

MARCUS PORTER **FAIRMONT STATE**

6-2 240 MLB/

2017: All-Super Region 1 2nd Team. Ranked sixth in the league and led the team in tackles with 95 on the year - including 55 solo and 12.5 for losses. Porter also tallied three sacks, three pass break-ups and recovered a fumble this season to lead the FSU linebackers.

Porter wrapped up his career in sixth place in school history with 336 total stops as a four-year starter for the Falcons at middle linebacker. Porter led the Falcons in tackles in each of the last four seasons. 2016: First team All-MEC, 3rd team FB Gazette Super Region 1. 2015: Second Team All-MEC. 2014 MEC Honorable Mention.

Transfer from Jacksonville U. 2017: Invited to compete in the annual FCS Bowl. One of the top tacklers in the GSC, it came as no surprise that Slater was voted in as a First-Team All-Region selection. Slater led the Gulf South Conference with an average of 8.3 tackles per game. Thirty-seven of his tackles were solo takedowns, and 5.5 were for loss. In addition, the senior added a breakup, a quarterback hurry, a forced fumble, and a sack.

CANNON THOMAS **FORT VALLEY STATE**

6-2 245 MLB/

2017: Selected to play in the 4th Annual FCS Bowl. Played for the Wildcats in 2016 and 2017 and played in 17 games, had 96 tackles, 11.5 tackles-for-loss, three pass breakups, two quarterback hurries, one fumble recovery and forced one fumble

LANDRY TULLO **DELTA STATE**

6-1 220 MLB/

2017: 2017 (SENIOR): Named All-Gulf South Conference (Second Team). Played in all 13 games for the Statesmen, making 13 starts at linebacker. Helped the Statesmen to a 9-4 overall record and a second round appearance in the NCAA Division II Football Championship Playoff. Recorded 101 tackles with 14.0 tackles-for-loss (42 yards) and 6.0

BILLY BROWN **CONCORDIA-ST. PAUL**

6-2 235 OLB/

2017: Good LB with strong ability and upside. Made 56 tackles, 3.0 TFLs, a sack, PBU, 2 hurries and a recovery.

L'KEITH BROWN **TUSCULUM**

6-2 215 OLB/

2017: Recorded double-digit tackles in three of his last four games and has accounted for a tackle for loss in eight of his 10 outings this season. He finished his senior campaign with 88 tackles and his 8.8 tackles per game average is the second-highest in the league. Brown led the conference with his three forced fumbles, which are 21st in the country. For 2017, he tallied nine tackles for loss and two interceptions while earning All-SAC second team honors. Ends his collegiate career with 336 tackles, which are the third-most in Tusculum history. His 38 career tackles for loss are seventh in the TC record book, while his eight forced fumbles are third and his three fumble recoveries are eighth in school history. In 2014, he was tabbed the SAC Defensive Freshman of the Year.

JOE BRUNO **ASSUMPTION**

6-3 245 OLB/DE

2017: Named to the first team All-NE10 after earning second-team honors a season ago. He is second on the team among d-linemen in both tackles (47.0) and sacks (6.5), to go along with 10 TFL.

KARL CALHOUN**VIRGINIA UNION****6-0 235 OLB/**

2017: First Team All-CIAA. Selected to play in the Fourth Annual FCS Bowl. Was second on the Panther football team with 63 tackles while collecting three sacks. He also returned an interception for 26 yards.

KIESTON CARTER**TEXAS A&M-COMMERCE****5-11 280 OLB/**

2017: Earned second team all-conference honors as a senior. He was named the LSC Defensive Player of the Week against Tarleton State in the final week of the regular season. 2017: Graduate transfer from West Virginia State. Selected finalist for Cliff Harris Award (Small College Defensive Player of the Year) and nominated for the Harlon Hill Trophy as DII Player of the Year in 2017. Named to four All-American teams, including D2Football.com, DII Associated Press and DII Conference Commissioner's Association First Team Defense and the second team defense on the American Football Coaches Association squad. Was named first team All-NSIC and NSIC Defensive Newcomer of the Year in 2017. Had 14 sacks, which ranked second nationally. Recorded a team-best 75 tackles, including two double digit tackle games and nine in the playoff loss. Led the NSIC in sacks and TFLs while also recovering a fumble, forced two fumbles and recorded a safety.

KEVIN HAYNES **CENTRAL WASHINGTON**

2017 All-GLIAC Second Team. Ranked 2nd on the team with 83 tackles and 7.5 tackles per game. Finished career with 403 tackles, ranking 3rd all-time at Saginaw Valley. Third straight All-GLIAC Second Team honor. 2016: Second Team All-GLIAC.

ZACK JUDE**LAKE ERIE****6-1 245 OLB/MLB**

2017: Was off to a stellar season before injury cut his season short. In only 4 games he totaled 35 tackles, a sack, 3 TFLs, 2 FF and a recovery.

KYLE KITCHENS**CATAWBA****6-2 205 OLB/SS**

Superstar, undersized LB. 2017: Fourth Division II player to ever be named to three consecutive AFCA All-America teams, received second team honors from the AP and the CCA. Kitchens had also been named to the Little AP All-America team and the CCA All-America team in 2015 when he was both the South Atlantic Conference and CCA Super Region Two Defensive Player of the Year. He was a three-time all-region selection and a three-time first team All-SAC pick. In 2017, Kitchens led the league with 12.5 sacks and ranks sixth nationally. He recorded a sack in eight of 11 games. Kitchens eclipsed his season high of 12 which he had in 2015. Kitchens posted 216 career tackles, with 71 of those going for losses. LEO MARIN **WESTERN NEW MEXICO**

6-3 240 OLB/DE

2017: LSC Second Team as a DE. Marin put together another strong season with 40 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks, four quarterback hurries, a forced fumble, a blocked kick and a pass defended. He started all 11 games and went for a high in tackles with six twice versus Eastern New Mexico and UT Permian Basin. He collected 1.5 sacks against Fort Lewis, a blocked kick against Eastern New Mexico and had a big pass breakup this past week to help seal the victory against West Texas A&M on fourth down.

ERIC MERCER **ST. ANSELM****5-10 230 OLB/**

2017: Posted 34 solo and 43 assisted tackles to rank fourth in the NE10 in total tackles (77). Averaging 7.7 tackles per game to rank fifth in the league, Mercer forced and recovered a fumble in his team's 35-34 victory over Pace on Oct. 21. He racked up 13 tackles at American International on Sept. 30, equaling a career-high. Mercer exits a four-year career with 270 tackles, ranking 30th among active NCAA Division II student-athletes in takedowns. His 148 career assisted tackles are the 21st most in Division II and 74th nationally when compared to football players across all divisions. He finishes with the fourth-most career tackles of any Saint Anselm student-athlete since the program's modern-day inception in 1999. An All-Rookie team selection at linebacker in 2014

SCOTTY PENOLA **HILLSDALE****6-3 236 OLB/**

2017: Appeared in only 6 games due to injury. Had 26 tackles. .5 TFLs and a PBU. Is an hard-hitting and intense linebacker who makes plays all over the field. 2016: Honorable mention all-GLIAC.

RAY SARKODIEH **ASSUMPTION****6-2 245 OLB/DE**

2017: Was named the NE10 Defensive Lineman of the Year. The senior led the conference and ranks fifth in the nation 12.5 sacks overall. He also had 56 total tackles and 14.5 stops for a loss while forcing a pair of fumbles and blocking a kick. His 12.5 sacks are the 4th highest single-season total in program history and he was part of a defense that finished the regular season ranked third in the nation in scoring defense, third in sacks per game and first in redzone defense.

COLLIN SCHLOSSER **GRAND VALLEY STATE****6-1 230 OLB/**

2017: Don Hansen Football Gazette Super Region 3 First-Team. Ranked second on the team in tackles with 80, while also turning in 8.0 tackles for loss and 2.5 QB sacks during a senior campaign in which he moved into the number 10 spot in career tackles with 290.
