REGGIE BELL **FERRIS STATE**

6-3 200 QB/ATH

Transfer from NCAA Division I Eastern Michigan. 2017: Athletic QB who can throw but is most effective on the run. Threw for 1246 yards and 7 TDs, while running for 547 yards and 6 TDs. 2016: HM All-GLIAC.

DEMETRIUS CARR **MSU-MOORHEAD**

6-2 215 QB/

Three-year starter. 2016: Earned NSIC North honorable mention recognition after throwing for 31 touchdowns and 2,710 yards and was only intercepted seven times in 323 attempts.

ZAC CUNHA **MINOT STATE**

6-3 230 QB/

Three-year starter. 2017: Had a record-breaking career at Minot State where he started 46 games for the Beavers. He holds the Minot State career records for completions (687), passing attempts (1,312), yards passing (8,222) and total offense (7,829) and ranks second in school history with 52 career touchdown passes. He also holds the Minot State single-season record for completions (212) and pass attempts (397) and owns four the top 10 single-season yards passing records.

NICK DUCKWORTH**WESTERN OREGON****6-6 225 QB/**

2017: Honorable Mention All-GNAC. Good-sized QB with solid management skills. Completed 204 of 378 passes for a 54.0 average, 2471 yards, 20 TDS and 11 Ints.

ANDREW EIFFERS**AZUSA PACIFIC****6-3 220 QB/**

2017: All-Great Northwest Athletic Conference first team selection. Started in 10 games this season and earned all-GNAC first team selection for the second straight year. He completed 62.8 of his passes this year for 2,568 yards, throwing for 23 touchdowns against seven interceptions. Elffers was second in the GNAC for passing yards and completion percentage along with third for passing touchdowns. He led the GNAC in total offense with 3,148 yards from 580 rushing yards and eight rushing touchdowns. 2016: GNAC Offensive Player of the Year

JAKE FABER**ANGELO STATE****6-4 225 QB/**

2017: Provided the Rams with reliable, solid play at QB. Completed 149 of 256 passes (58.20%) for 1905 yards and 17 TDs with 7 INTs.

MATT FOLTZ**STONEHILL****6-7 230 QB/**

2017: National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame William V. Campbell Trophy Semifinalist. Finished the season with 2,458 yards, the single-season program record of 2,266 yards, while also finishing off the program's career record with a 61.8-percent completion percentage and ending up with a program-best 7,300 career yards. n 2017 had 226 completions, 349 attempts, 64.8%, 2458 yds, 22 TDs, 6 INTs.

TANNER GARRY**SLIPPERY ROCK****6-2 215 QB/**

Lettered three times in football at Youngstown State University. 2017: All-PSAC West 2nd Team. Garry played just one season at Slippery Rock but lit up the record books by leading the nation in passing with 3,522 yards. He broke SRU single-season program records for

completions (268), touchdowns (32) and passing average (320.2 yards per game) and his yardage and attempts (437) rank second all-time at SRU. Despite only playing one season, Garry ranks seventh all-time at SRU in career TD passes and eighth in yardage and completions. He also broke the SRU record for career 300-yard games, throwing for more than 300 yards in eight games this season, including two games with more than 475 passing yards.

YIANNI GAVALAS

LIU-POST

6-2 200 QB/

2017: Northeast 10 Conference Offensive Player of the Year. Through 10 starts, Gavalas averaged a league-best 308.7 passing yards per game on a .708 (257-of-363) completion rate. Furthermore, he has thrown the most touchdowns (37) in the NE10 and ran for a pair of scores. Four-year transfer from Saint Anselm College, earned NE-10 All-Rookie honors in 2013.

BLAKE GIMBEL

SOUTHWEST MINNESOTA

6-4 214 QB/

2017: Started first four games missed remainder of the season due to injury. Passed for 285 yards and two touchdowns vs. St. Cloud State. Completed 32 of 44 passes for 389 yards and five touchdowns at MSU Moorhead. 2016: honorable mention All-NSIC South, team captain, broke his own school record with a 69.2 completion percentage, ranking third in Division II, completed 287 of 415 pass attempts for 3,030 yards and 24 touchdowns, tossed a touchdown pass in 10 of 11 games, ranked fourth in Division II in completions per game, ranked 21st in Division II in passing yards per game. 2015: Started all 11 games, named honorable mention All-NSIC South, named SMSU Offensive Player of the Year, team captain.

MALIK GROVE

NOTRE DAME COLLEGE

5-11 200 QB/ATH

2017: Started all 11 games. Threw for 1,934 yards and 21 touchdowns while rushing for 799 yards and eight scores. Only player in MEC to rank in the top 10 in passing (5th) and rushing (6th). Had fewest passes intercepted (three) of all qualifying quarterback in MEC. Holds NDC records for career yards (9,845) and MEC record for career touchdowns (103). Ends career ranking third in NDC career rushing yards (2,198), second in passing (7,647). Hold NDC records for career pass efficiency (145.5), yards/pass (7.6) and yards/completion (12.8). Broke NCAA Division II record for best interception ratio (1.29%) with 13

interceptions in 1,008 pass attempts. Named First Team All-MEC. 2016: Earned First Team All-MEC honors. 2015: Earned Second Team All-MEC honors, NCAA Division II All-Super Region One squad.

JAVIA HALL **WESTERN NEW MEXICO**

6-1 200 QB/

Transfer from UTEP. 2017: LSC Honorable Mention. Continued his prolific passing this year as he completed 255-458 for 3,006 yards and 24 touchdowns. He had a long pass of 86 yards that went to Bowie. He started 10 games at quarterback. He ranked high in several categories including second in the conference in both passing yards and passing yards per game (300.6). He came in 14th and ninth nationally in both categories. He was third in passing touchdowns, 21st nationally, second and 13th nationally in total offense per game (306.6) and third and 26th nationally in points responsible for (162). He nearly led the nation in completions per game at 25.50 coming in fourth and second in the conference.

JORDAN HEIN **BEMIDJI STATE**

6-2 220 QB/

2017: Selected as team captain. Played and started at quarterback all 11 games during his senior season as a Beaver. Totaled 271 rushing yards and one rushing touchdowns on 103 carries. Passed for 2,082 yards completing 159 of 296 passes and totaled 26 passing touchdowns with a season long of 76 yards. Finished in the top quarterbacks in the NSIC in: total offense with 213.9 yards per game (4th), passing with 189.3 yards per game (5th) and total passing yards with 2,082 (1st). Led the third ranked BSU offense in the NSIC with 2,227 rushing yards and 2,134 passing yards. Named to the 2017 NSIC North Division All-Conference First Team Offense. Finished career atop BSU's all-time leaderboard in passing yards (8,459), passing attempts (1,117), pass completions (611), touchdown passes (89), 250-yard passing games (16), total offensive yardage (10,104), total touchdowns responsible for (110), total offense per game (235.0), 300-yard total offense games (15). 2016: Selected as team captain. Named on the 2016 NSIC All-Conference Second Team Offense. Selected to the 2016 Don Hansen NCAA Division II All-Super Region Three team. Awarded Offensive MVP in the 2016 Mineral Water Bowl. Redshirted at NCAA Division I University of Northern Iowa in 2013. 2015: Was named to the All-NSIC First Team, Team Offensive MVP.

CONNOR JESSUP **SHEPHERD**

6-5 220 QB/

2017: All-Super Region 1 Team. Finished fourth in the Harlon Hill award balloting, completed 240-of-294 passes for 3,532 yards and 40 touchdowns. He also rushed 61 times for 355 yards and six scores. He set Shepherd single-season marks for total offense (3,887), passing touchdowns, touchdowns responsible for (47), and points responsible for (282). Jessop ranks second nationally in passing yards per game (321.1), points responsible for (282), and points responsible for per game (25.6) while ranking third in passing yards, passing touchdowns, and total offense (353.4). He ranks sixth in passing efficiency (167.4).

MICHAEL KEIR

CALIFORNIA (PA)

6-2 215 QB/

2017: Added another solid season to his Vulcans' career. Completed 264 of 453 passes with 20 TDs, 11 INTs, 58.28 % completions, for 3332 yards. 2016: Named Football Gazette All-America Honorable Mention, D2CCA Second-Team All-Region, Football Gazette Second-Team All-Region, All-PSAC West First-Team.

MATT KINNICK

WEST VIRGINIA STATE

6-0 190 QB/

2017: 1st Team All-MEC. Not only holds several WVSU career records but set singles season marks this season for completion percentage (67.0), touchdown passes (28), and total yards (3.329). He finished this season ranked 11th nationally in completion percentage and 8th in completions per game (23.82, best in MEC).

MACK LOWRIE

BENTLEY

6-4 220 QB/

Transfer from BC and URI (where he was a starter until injury). 2017: Had his final season cut short by injury. in six games this past fall, completed 61 percent of his passes for 1,310 yards, 11 touchdowns and four interceptions. His season featured five TD passes in a 40-21 win over then nationally-ranked LIU Post. One of the Falcons' captains.

ZACH MARTIN

NORTHWEST MISSOURI

6-3 205 QB/

2017: All-MIAA honorable mention. Completed 211-of-355 passes for 2,331 yards and 15 touchdowns.

JOHNATHAN MCCRARY**CLARK-ATLANTA****6-5 220 QB/**

2017: 1st Team All-SIAC. Led a Clark Atlanta team that finished first in passing and total offense. McCrary was the conference's top passer, throwing for 2,230 yards and 18 touchdowns, averaging 247 yards a game. He also rushed for 112 yards and three touchdowns.

MARC MONKS**ASSUMPTION****6-4 220 QB/**

2017: Was a second-team All-NE10 selection for the second straight year after throwing for 1,574 yards and 15 touchdowns with only four interceptions while completing 59.2 percent of his passes.

DAQUAN NEAL**ELIZABETH CITY STATE****6-3 200 QB/**

2017: All-CIAA Second team. Ended his senior campaign as a Viking with 684 total yards rushing and 2318 total yards passing, including 25 total touchdowns. He finished ranking second among Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association in passing yards per game, third in passing touchdowns with 19, and tied for seventh in rushing touchdowns on the season with six.

PATRICK O'BRIEN**CATAWBA****6-4 225 QB/**

2017: 1st Team All-SAC. The graduate quarterback threw for 2,546 yards on the season, competing 63.3% of his attempts. O'Brien tossed 24 touchdown passes and was intercepted just five times. His 157.7 efficiency rating topped the SAC.

ZACH OSBORN**WAYNE STATE (NB)****6-1 180 QB/ATH**

Four-year starter. 2017: First Team All-NSIC selection on offense after completing 108 of

192 passes for 1,480 yards and 14 TD's with just five interceptions in a season limited to just seven games due to injury. At the time of his season-ending injury at Winona State, Osborn led the NSIC in passing yards per game, was second in passing TD's, fourth in total offense and fifth in pass efficiency. He finished his WSC career as the all-time leader in touchdown passes (86) while ranking second in passing yards (9,866) and total offense yards (10,569). 2016: Completed 224 of 405 passes (55.3%) for 2,666 yards and 25 touchdowns with 15 interceptions, had four games with over 300 yards passing and had at least one touchdown passing in all 11 games, also ranked second on the team in rushing with 410 yards on 130 carries with four TD's. 2015: Earned medical redshirt after suffering season-ending injury early in second game of the season. 2014: Named All-NSIC South Division Honorable Mention.

LUIS PEREZ

TEXAS A&M-COMMERCE

6-3 220 QB/

2017: The winner of the 2017 Harlon Hill Trophy, awarded the top Division II college football player in the nation. He completed 421-of-596 passes for 4,999 yards, 46 touchdowns, and 11 interceptions. The 4,999 yards are the fourth-most by a quarterback in a single Division II season. He also set a Division II Championship records for pass completions (144), pass attempts (211) and passing yards (1,570). He became the first quarterback to pass for over 300 yards in the National Championship game since 2005 and tied a Lone Star Conference record for the most 200-yard passing games in a season with 14. He became the first Harlon Hill Trophy winner to also win a Division II National Championship since 2002 and only the sixth overall in the 32-year history of Division II's premier football award. For his career, Perez completed 665-of-985 passes for 8,325 yards, 78 touchdowns, and 16 interceptions. He was the starting quarterback for 28 games, leading the Lions to a 25-3 record, two NCAA Division II playoff appearances, and a Lone Star Conference championship. He completed his collegiate career leading the Lions on a 10-game winning streak, which is the longest active winning streak in Division II. He was previously named a First Team All-American by the Division II Conference Commissioners Association and the Associated Press, and a Second Team All-American by the American Football Coaches Association. He was also named the Ron Lenz Offensive Player of the Year by the D2CCA. He won the J.W. Rollins Award as the Lone Star Conference's Offensive Player of the Year and is a two-time First Team All-Lone Star Conference selection at quarterback. 2016: Nominated for the Harlon Hill Trophy, awarded to the Division II College Football Player of the Year, Don Hanson Division II All-American Honorable Mention, Second Team All-Super Region Four, First Team All-Conference selection,

TY REASNOR**ARKANSAS TECH****6-2 204 QB/**

Transfer from Emporia State. 2017: Academic All-America of the Year award for Division II football in addition to being an Academic All-America® First Team. 2nd Team All-GAC. Threw for 2,483 yards in 12 games. His 21 passing touchdowns were third in the GAC this season. Reasnor rushed for 377 yards and eight touchdowns to rank fourth in total offense in the GAC. Reasnor and his Arkansas Tech teammates led the GAC in scoring with 39.8 points per game.

GRANT RUSSELL**OHIO DOMINCAN****6-4 225 QB/**

2017: D2Football.com Honorable Mention All-American. G-MAC Player of the Year. First Team All-Great Midwest. Harlon Hill Trophy Candidate. Don Hansen Football Gazette Second Team All-Region 1. Two-time G-MAC Player of the Week. Led Division II in completion percentage (72.5 percent) and passing efficiency (190.6), the seventh-best efficiency number in Division II history. Ranked fifth in Division II with 318.2 passing yards per game, second with 10.4 yards per pass attempt, seventh with 327.8 yards of total offense per game and 10th in passing touchdowns (30). Had six 300-yard passing games. Completed at least 64 percent of his passes in every game. 2016: Honorable Mention All-GLIAC. Harlon Hill Trophy Candidate.

DAVID SALMON**MARS HILL****6-2 210 QB/**

2017: Earned a spot on the All-Super Region Two third team offense. The Raleigh, North Carolina native led the SAC in several passing categories, including yards (2,766), yards per game (276.6) and attempts (314). He placed second in touchdowns with 23, one behind fellow third team selection, Catawba's Patrick O'Brien.

BLAKE SISSON**EDINBORO****6-0 220 QB/**

Started the last three seasons for the Fighting Scots and played a large role in Edinboro's resurgence the last two years. Edinboro finished 9-2 in 2016 and 7-4 a year ago. Sisson threw for 2,413 yards and 27 TDs a year ago. As a junior, he threw for a school-record 41 touchdowns. Sisson concluded his four-year career ranking among Edinboro's career leaders in virtually every career passing and total offense category. He is second in career

touchdown passes (85) and third in career passing yards (8,313), career total offense (8.673 yards), career pass completions (702), and career pass attempts (1,243). 2016: Don Hansen Football Gazette Super Region One third team.

CHAS STALLARD **CENTRAL OKLAHOMA**

6-0 210 QB/

2017: Earned Third Team All-MIAA recognition. Stallard this season has had the best season of any quarterback in school history. Threw for 3,209 yards and 28 touchdowns – both school records. He set more than a dozen UCO marks in passing and total offense. Statistically one of the best quarterbacks to ever play at Central, Started all of 2014 as a freshman, the first half of 2015, and the second half of 2016

BRAD STRAUSS **WILLIAM JEWELL**

6-0 195 QB/ATH

Transfer from NW Missouri, Member of 2015 NCAA II National Championship team. 2017: All-GLVC second team. Closes his Cardinal career as one of the most consistent players behind center for Jewell in program history. The senior posted a completion percentage of nearly 59 percent while leading the Cards in passing with 2,741 yards and running 551 yards.

TYLER SWART **MISSOURI S&T**

6-4 260 QB/

2017: Established new S&T career records for passing yards (5,860) and total offense (5,538) in a year where he became the third Miner to throw for more than 3,000 yards with 3,165, was named honorable mention All-GLVC. Had 22 TDs/13 INTs.

TRAVIS TARNOWSKI **ASHLAND**

5-11 218 QB/

In 2017, Tarnowski threw for 3,044 yards and 31 touchdowns to just five interceptions, and completed 59 percent of his passes. He threw for two or more touchdowns in a game 10 times this fall, rushed for 156 yards and a score, and averaged 36.9 yards on 36 punts. Tarnowski's senior-season plaudits include being a finalist in the Male Collegiate Athlete of the Year category for the 18th Greater Cleveland Sports Awards, first-team American

Football Coaches Association (AFCA) All-America, second-team Associated Press and D2CCA All-America, D2CCA Super Region 3 Offensive Player of the Year, GLIAC Player of the Year, first-team All-GLIAC and a nomination for the Harlon Hill Trophy. 2016: Named second-team All-Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference and landed on the third team of the Don Hansen All-Super Region Four team.

AUSTIN WARFORD

OUCHITA BAPTIST

5-10 200 QB/ATH

2017: Honorable Mention All-GAC. Led the GAC and ranks 10th nationally in passing efficiency. He's completed just over 67 percent of his passes this season and has racked up 2,076 passing yards with 13 touchdown tosses. He ranks third in the league in total offense as he also ran for 643 yards, a 5.8 average and 6 TDs.

ZED WOERNER

TARLETON STATE

6-2 210 QB/

2017: Four-year starter, last three as sole starter. In 2017 completed 182 of 309 passes for 58.90% and 2466 yards with 22 TDs and 11 Ints. No. 1 all-time in career touchdown passes.

RYAN ZAPOTICKY

SHIPPENSBURG

6-1 205 QB/

2017: Don Hansen Football Gazette NCAA Division II All-Super Region 3rd Team. PSAC East First Team honors and ranked second in the league in yards per completion (14.12), third in points responsible for (192), and fourth in passing yards (2,952) and passing touchdowns (25). All of those totals rank among the Top 25 players nationally. Zapoticky also rushed for 396 yards and a career-high seven touchdowns. A semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy, Zapoticky finished his career with a 23-7 record as a starter. Zapoticky ranks second all-time at Shippensburg in career passing yards (7,102) and career total offense (8,361). He is SU's all-time leader for rushing yards as a quarterback (1,259), a total that ranks seventh in PSAC history.
