As a member of the offensive line, Carver helped the Huskies rush for 1560 total yards in 2018, which ranked seventh overall and fourth amongst teams in the North Division.

Stonehill leads NE10 in total offense (415.8 yds/gm), completion percentage (62.5%) and third down offense (47.1%), ranking second for rushing offense (193.7 yds/gm), fewest sacks allowed (1.60/gm) and pass efficiency (141.04), third in scoring (31.9 ppg) and red zone offense (86%) and fourth in passing offense (221.1/gm). Skyhawks 21st nationally for third down offense and 38th in red zone offense. Recorded 22 receptions for 296 yards and three touchdowns in 27 career games played.

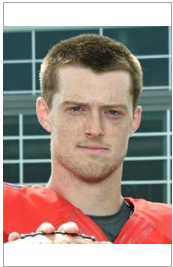

Was also named to the AP All-America Second Team and PSAC East Second Team this past season.

For the entire season, Widmer battled multiple injuries to remain on the field and serve as one of the team's most valuable leaders. Along with the Don Hansen All-Region selection, Widmer also was chosen as a All-GNAC first team selection. 2018: 1st team All-GNAC.
