2017: Named to a pair of All-America teams, as well as first team All-Region Two and first team All-Gulf South Conference laurels. His 76 receptions led the GSC, along with his 5.8 receptions per game and 950 receiving yards. Armstrong finished a two-year career at UWA with 177 receptions, tied for second on the UWA all-time list. 2016: All-Gulf South Conference, All-Region and All-America selection, Had a Gulf South Conference leading 91 receptions.

Three year starter. 2017: MIAA Honorable Mention in his fifth year with the program. Has been a steady performer for the Tigers as a slot receiver the past two years. The senior has 36 catches for 376 yards this year and two touchdowns. He has 813 receiving yards on 84 receptions in his career.

2017: Invited to compete in the annual FCS Bowl. 2nd Team All-GSC. Made the first All-GSC appearance of his career after a senior season at wide receiver that included 347 receiving yards and two touchdown receptions. The fourth-year Blazer finished his career with 1,244 receiving yards, 89 receptions, and 12 touchdowns.

BRANDON BEAN**GRAND VALLEY STATE****6-3 214 WR/**

2017: Don Hansen Football Gazette Super Region 3 Third-Team. Led the GLIAC in receptions with 68, 20 more than anyone else in the GLIAC, for 886 yards and a GLIAC best 11 touchdowns. He broke the 100-yard receiving mark four times and closed his career with a GVSU single-game record for receptions with 14 versus Tiffin in the 2017 season finale. Bean finished his career ranking sixth in GVSU annals in receptions with 140 and became the 11th receiver to go over the 2,000-yard receiving mark (2,163).

Transfer from Fresno State. Arizona State: 2012 – Redshirted. 2017: In just eight games had 18 rec, 409 yards, 22.7 avg, 5 TDs.

DOMINIC BONNER**MINNESOTA-DULUTH****6-0 195 WR/**

2017: All-NSIC North Division 2nd team. Led team in TD receptions with 9. Caught 41 passes for 534 yards and a 13.0 yds/rec average.

D'ANGELO BOWIE**WESTERN NEW MEXICO****5-11 180 WR/**

2017: LSC 1st Team. Bowie started the season off right when he set a new LSC single game reception mark with 19 against the University of San Diego in the season opener. He also added a career-high 263 receiving yards in that game, which is the most in the conference this year and he earned LSC Offensive Player of the Week honors that week. He ranked first in the conference in receptions per game (7.6) and receiving yards per game (98.1), second in receiving touchdowns (10) and receiving yards (883). Nationally he is 12th in receptions per game and 16th in receiving yards per game. In nine games this year he caught 68 passes, averaging 13 yards per reception and had a long play of 86 yards.

SAM BOYD**ST. AUGUSTINE****6-4 250 WR/**

2017: All-Super Region. Caught a team-high 42 passes at wide receiver for the Falcons. He tied for second in the conference in touchdown receptions (9) to earn All-CIAA first-team honors. The Falcons' senior is drawing considerable attention from NFL pro scouts. 2016: 2nd Team HBCU Gameday NCAA Division II All-American.

HUNTER BRAATEN**MSU-MOORHEAD****5-9 175 WR/**

2017: NSIC North Division Second Team. Was third in the NSIC in receptions per game (6.64) and fifth in receiving yards per game (68.7). He finished the season with 73 receptions for 756 yards and a score. Braaten leaves MSUM as fourth all-time in receptions with 182. 2016: Named to NSIC North Division All-Conference honorable mention.

CANARD BROWN**WINSTON-SALEM****6-0 205 WR/RS**

2017: Earned second-team All-CIAA. Had a great season cut short by injury. He finished the season ranked second in the CIAA with 164 yards and a touchdown in punt returns. As a receiver in a supbar passing attack, he had 21 rec, 351 yards, a 16.7 avg and 2 TDs. 2016: HBCU All-American as a RS.

JUSTIN BUREN**SIMON FRASER****6-1 200 WR/**

2017: All-GNAC Honorable Mention. Finished with 42 receptions for 483 yards and 1 TD. He was fourth in the conference averaging 4.7 yards per catch and fifth with 53.7 yards per game. 2016: All-GNAC Second Team.

TRENTON CANNON**VIRGINIA STATE****5-11 180 WR/RS**

Excellent athlete, solid runner and receiver. 2017: Super Region Two Offensive Player of the Year, Super Region Two Special Teams Player of the Year, Touchdown Club of Richmond Offensive Back of the Year, 2018 NFLPA Collegiate Bowl. earned CIAA Offensive Player of the Year. Cannon led the CIAA in overall rushing yards this season (1,638) and rushing yards per game (154.1). He also produced 17 rushing touchdowns on the season. Receiving he had 21 rec, 225 yds, 10.71 avg, and 3 TDs. In the return game, he had 25 KOR, 821 yards, 32.84 average and 2 TDs. Would need to moved from RB to WR.

WILLIS CHAMBERS**DELTA STATE****6-4 200 WR/**

2017 : Played in 11 games for the Statesmen at receiver. Helped the Statesmen to a 9-4 overall record and a second round appearance in the NCAA Division II Football Championship Playoff. Caught 22 passes for 235 yards and a touchdown. Averaged 10.7 yards per catch.

ADAM CONNETTE**MINNESOTA-CROOKSTON****5-10 195 WR/**

2017: Ended his career as the all-time leading receiver in Minnesota Crookston football program history with 242 receptions for 2,781 yards and 23 receiving touchdowns. All three marks were career marks for the Golden Eagles. He was a three-time All-NSIC pick, earning All-NSIC First Team honors as a senior. Connette also goes down as second all-time in NSIC history with his 242 receptions and eighth all-time in receiving yards with his 2,781 yards. As a senior, he had 65 catches for 718 yards and nine touchdowns. Connette also holds all the single-season receiving marks for the Golden Eagles. 2016: All-NSIC Honorable Mention.

D'ARTHUR COWAN**TEXAS A&M-COMMERCE****6-3 185 WR/**

Transfer from Arkansas. 2017: All-LSC honorable mention. Ranked 13th in the conference, averaging 54.5 yards per game receiving. He had 42 receptions for 545 yards and eight touchdowns.

JOSH CROCKETT**CENTRAL OKLAHOMA****6-4 195 WR/RS**

2017: Third Team All-MIAA. Had 46 receptions for 710 yards and eight touchdowns. He helped the Bronchos create a lethal combination on either side of the field alongside Luper this year. Prime target for the Bronchos. 2016: Doubled his career numbers in one season on his way to grabbing an All-MIAA Honorable Mention nod. Multi-talented speedster also returns kicks for the Bronchos and had more than 500 yards in the return game as a junior.

LOUIS DAILEY**EMPORIA STATE****5-11 180 WR/**

2017: Honorable Mention All-MIAA. Had his best season while showing ability to get down field. Caught 36 passes for 588 yds a 16.3 avrage and 7 TDs.

ANDREW DATHER**HARDING****6-1 190 WR/**

2017: Solid receiver for a team that only threw 94 passes all year. Ability to get deep. Good blocker. Had 12 rec, 275 yds, 22.9 avg, TD. 2015: All-GAC (honorable mention); 2016 All-GAC (honorable mention)

COREY DAVIS**WEST ALABAMA****6-2 210 WR/**

2017: 2nd Team All-Gulf South Conference. Good hands, tough, guy you look for in the red zone. Caught 49 passes 554 yards, 11.31 avg, 8 TDs. 2016: 2nd Team All-Gulf South Conference

TY DENNIS**MINNESOTA STATE****6-4 220 WR/**

2017: NSIC South Division All-Conference Second Team. Started in all 11 games at wide receiver this season for the Mavericks. Caught 38 passes for 477 yards and three touchdowns. 2016: Started in 10 games for the Mavericks, Led the MSU receiving corps with 39 catches and 630 receiving yards, Caught eight touchdown passes, Named to the NSIC South Division Second Team. 2015: Played in all 12 games, including starts in the final 10 games of the season, Led the MSU receiving corps with 793 receiving yards and six touchdown catches, Surpassed 100 receiving yards in three games, including a season-high 153 receiving yards and two touchdown catches against Augustana, Named to the All-NSIC Second Team.

TREVOR DESCHEPPER**AUGUSTANA****6-3 190 WR/**

2017: Took home all-NSIC second team honors after leading the Vikings with 40 receptions and 515 yards. The Harrisburg High School graduate caught a trio of touchdowns in 10 games. He leaves Augustana with 77 receptions for 966 yards and five touchdowns over 33 career games played.

DARVIA DUBOSE**CARSON-NEWMAN****6-0 192 WR/**

Converted QB. Smart, reliable receiver. 2017: Caught 17 passes for 285 yards, a 16.8 yds/rec average and 2 TDs.

JARRED EDMONDS**UPPER IOWA****6-3 205 WR/**

Transfer from University of Northern Iowa. 2017: All-NSIC South Division Honorable Mention. Started all 11 games for the Peacocks and hauled in 61 catches, which ranks fourth in the NSIC, for 897 yards, the second-highest total in the conference this season and fifth-best single season mark in UIU history. His 6 touchdowns tie Parmely for the team lead in scores. The senior wide receiver had huge back-to-back weeks at Northern State University and at home against the University of Mary; Edmonds collected 19 passes for

303 yards and 3 scores. Closed his career in style with 9 catches for 132 yards and a touchdown in UIU's last game at Wayne State College. During his three-year career at UIU, Edmonds collected 173 catches, eighth all-time at UIU, for 2,213 yards, which tie with Lucas Hefty (2011-14) for sixth all-time at Upper Iowa. His 20 career touchdowns are sixth most in the program's history.

EIAN ELSASS **MALONE**

6-1 200 WR/

2017: Was the Pioneers' only offensive player recognized as G-MAC Honorable Mention. The senior wide receiver finished second on the team with 32 receptions for 379 yards. Team only threw 12 TD passes - 10 to one receiver.

D'ANTA FLEMING **LIMESTONE**

5-10 175 WR/

Program's all-time leader in receptions, receiving yards, and receiving touchdowns. Four-year starter who was never named all-conference. The Rodney Dangerfield of receivers - no respect - but consistently performs at a high level. 2017: 50 rec, 671 yds, 13.4 avg, 9 TDs.

DAMON GIBSON **MSU-MOORHEAD**

6-4 236 WR/TE

2017: Moved to tight end for East-West Shrine Game and added 13 pounds to 249. Third all-time in receptions at MSUM and was an All-American as a junior in 2016. He is a two-time All-NSIC North First Team selection. He had one of the best receiving seasons in Dragon history in 2016, catching 90 passes for 1,459 yards and 17 touchdowns on his way to AFCA All-American honors. He led all of Division II in receiving yards and yards per game and was third in receptions per game. He holds school records for receiving yards, receiving touchdowns and tied the single-season mark for receptions with 90. 2016: Led the Dragons this season with 90 catches for 1,459 yards, an average of 140.8 yards per game, .scored 17 touchdowns, ranked first in the nation in both receiving yards and yards per game, was third in receptions per game (8.2), and fourth in the nation in receiving touchdowns, also set MSUM records for receiving yards, receiving touchdowns, and tied the single-season record for receptions with 90, tied the single-game record with 237 receiving yards in the Dragons season-finale win over Northern State, named to the Don Hansen Super Region 3 team, the All-Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference North Division First Team, the AFCA All-American Second Team, and the All-Super Region 3 first team. He was also nominated for the Harlon Hill Trophy, which goes to the Division II College Football Player

of the Year. 2015: Named NSIC North Division honorable mention selection, started all 11 games at wide receiver and led team with receptions (37), yards (821) and touchdowns (six), averaged 22.6 yards per reception to lead the team as well, had three 100-yard receiving games, had four catches for season-high 166 yards against Bemidji State (10/17/15), also served as punter and averaged 37.7 yards per punt with 10 inside the 20-yard line, named to NSIC All-Academic Team for fall season.

2017: All-GSC 2nd Team. Ranked seventh in the GSC with 501 receiving yards on 37 receptions. The Miami native caught three touchdown passes this season and averaged 45.5 yards per game in his junior season, eighth-best in the league.

2017: All-Super Region 2. Earned All-GSC honors for the third time in his four years at UNA. Hall caught 32 passes for 381 yards and two touchdowns in 2017 while also rushing for 169 yards and four TDs. For his career, Hall caught 201 passes for 3,144 and 25 touchdowns - all UNA records. 2016: Broke numerous receiving records at UNA as a junior in 2016 while becoming the first receiver in school history with more than 1,000 yards in a season, Earned first-team All-Gulf South Conference, second-team D2CCA All-Super Region 2 and second-team Don Hansen All-Super Region 2 honors, Selected as the team's co-Offensive Most Valuable Player. 2015: First-team All-Gulf South Conference selection and second-team Don Hansen All-Super Region 2 pick.

2017: Second-team All-LSC. Finished the season with 47 catches for 681 yards and six touchdowns to tie Thomas for the team lead. He boasted two 100-yard receiving games for Tarleton, including a season-high 121 yards on nine catches at Western New Mexico. 2016: First-team All-LSC.

2017: Played in six games this season for the Beavers. Totaled 301 receiving yards on 20 receptions for three touchdowns. Averaged 15.1 yards per catch. Returned one kick for 19 yards. Recorded a season-high 120 receiving yards and tied career high with two

touchdowns vs Minnesota Crookston (Sep. 30). 2017 Fall Academic All-NSIC Team. Transfer from Northern Illinois. 2014: An All-NSIC First Team selection

2016: Don Hansen NCAA Division II All-American Team; D2football.com All-American; First Team All-GLIAC. One of the top pass catchers in the GLIAC, finishing 1st in receptions, 2nd in yards and yards per game, and 6th in touchdowns. Holland trails only one former player in most team receiving categories - Nate Washington, who spent 12 seasons in the NFL.

6-5 215 WR/

2017: He posted his best season in the Blue and Gold during the 2017 season, finishing with 291 yards and a pair of touchdowns, including a breakout game of 109 yards on five catches against Catawba.

NATE HUOT

SOUTHWEST MINNESOTA

6-2 219 WR/

2017: Named team's MVP. Earned All-NSIC accolades for the fourth straight season. A first team honoree this season, he was named honorable mention All-NSIC South the past three seasons. Huot led the NSIC this season in both receptions (85) and yards (949), while finishing with six touchdowns. In his final collegiate game at Concordia-St. Paul, he tied a school single-game record with 19 receptions. The 19 catches are tied for the most in Division II this season. Huot closed his career setting both the NSIC and school record for career receptions with 269. His 3,304 career receiving yards ranks second in team history, while his 30 receiving touchdowns ranks third in team history. He also finished eighth in program history in all-purpose yards (3,946) and ninth in points scored (182). 2016: Named honorable mention All-NSIC South. 2015: Named honorable mention All-NSIC South. 2014: Named honorable mention All-NSIC South, named SMSU offensive player of the year.

2017: Appeared and started in all 13 games. Named honorable mention all-G-MAC. Made 21 catches for 455 yards. Scored six touchdowns. Had 21 punt returns for 181 yards. Transfer from Miami of Ohio.

2017: 1st Team All-GNAC. Showed perseverance as he came back from a season-ending injury to secure First Team honors. Transfer from NC A&T. 2017: Became the all-time leader in receptions in school history as a junior. He finished with 147 total receptions. Long concluded his senior campaign with 41 receptions for 445 yards and two touchdowns. He averaged 4.1 catches a game and 10.9 yards per outing. His best game this season came against New Haven where he hauled in 121 yards on five catches. Chosen for the FCS National Bowl and HBCU Spirit of America Bowl.

CHRISTIAN LUNDE**BEMIDJI STATE****5-10 185 WR/**

2017: Played in 11 games for the Beavers this season. Totaled 476 receiving yards on 34 receptions and four touchdowns. Averaged 14.0 yards per catch and 43.9 all-purpose yards per game. Recorded first career passing touchdown vs MSUM (Nov. 11). Set a career high with 119 receiving yards and a career long 55 yard catch vs Minnesota Crookston (Sep. 30). Named to the 2017 NSIC All-Conference Honorable Mention Team and 2017 Fall Academic All-NSIC Team.

T.J. LUPER**CENTRAL OKLAHOMA****5-9 175 WR/RS**

Elusive runner with great speed and an excellent receiver capable of turning short catches into long gains, May be even more dangerous on returns and is a threat to go the distance every time he touches on ball. 2017: Super Region Three Offensive Player of the Year. MIAA Offensive Player of the Year as well as All-Region honors from the Conference Commissioners Association and the National Football Coaches Association. Both of the other All-Region accolades propelled Luper to grab a pair of All-American honors from the respective organizations. He also brought home All-American honors from The Associated Press and D2Football.com. Last fall, Luper caught 110 passes for 1,593 yards and 12 touchdowns. All three are school records. He led Division II in yards receiving and was second among all college football players including Division I (FBS & FCS) and Division III. Sat out in 2016. In 2015, Was a second-team All-MIAA selection at kick return and third-team pick at receiver while also earning third-team All-Region honors from Don Hansen. Missed two games to injury and still racked up 1,425 all-purpose yards in 103 plays, averaging 13.8 yards a touch
