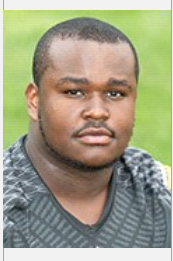

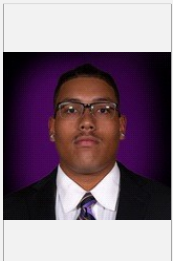
D'ANDRE	BROWN

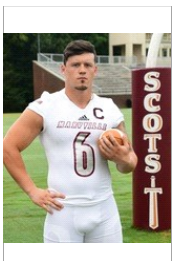
