2019: Alberts attained consensus all-America status. Alberts is the most accurate kicker in school history. A three-time first-team American Rivers all-conference pick, he was a perfect 59-of-59 on extra points this year while connecting on 11 of 13 field goals (84.6%) with a long of 48 yards. He was 33 of 38 for his career on field goals while hitting 143 of 148 extra-point tries. Of his 84 kickoffs, 20 went for touchbacks. He set a school season record for most extra points (59) and ranked fifth in field goals (11) after setting the school season mark of 14 in 2017. He ranked third in season field goal percentage (84.6%) after setting the school record of 87.5% in 2017. On the school career charts, Alberts is first in field-goal percentage (86.8), third in field goals (33), fifth in field goal attempts (38), third in extra points (143), second in extra-point percentage (96.6%) and sixth in scoring (242). His 55-yard field goal at Wartburg College in 2018 was also a school record. All-American Rivers Conference, first team (2017, 2018, 2019). Fred Mitchell Award finalist (2018). 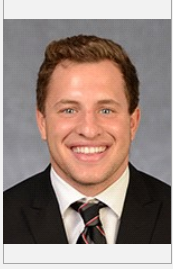

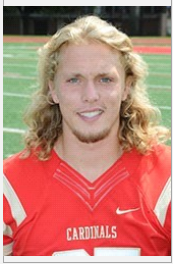

2019: 2nd All North Region. 1st team All-CCIW. Davidson led the CCIW and ranks 16th in NCAA Division III in punting average at 40.4. He punted 55 times for 2,220 yards, with a long of 59 yards and had land 15 inside the 20. Davidson was named to the D3football.com Team of the Week on Nov. 12, and concluded his career as the WashU all-time leader (40.7). He started all 10 games at QB and completed 218-of-338 passes for 2,358 yards and 22 touchdowns. He finished the regular season second in the CCIW in passing yards per game (235.8) and fourth in total offense (238.2). Davidson completed 26-of-38 passes for a career-high five TDs in the 43-7 win at Chicago on Sept. 7. He finished his career second all-time in passing yards (7,400) and TDs (64). 2018: Second-Team all-CCIW (QB). Completed 276-of-399 passes for 2,992 yards and 26 touchdowns. Second in the CCIW in passing yards per game (299.2) and total offense (303.5). Punted 29 times for 1,135 yards and was third in CCIW

2019: DiCairano put together another stellar year for the Gulls as the senior placekicker paced the Commonwealth Coast Football (CCC Football) conference in field goals made (13), field goal attempts (19), longest field goal made (47 yards), PATs made (57), PAT% (100%), and points (96). He also ranked second in the league in PAT attempts (57) and third in field goal percentage (68%). Meanwhile, among all NCAA Division III kickers, DiCairano currently ranks No. 11 in field goals made per game (1.18, leads conference), No. 30 in total points scored, No. 35 in field goal percentage, No. 42 in scoring (8.7), and No. 165 in points responsible for. 2018 Associated Press (AP) Division III All-America Second Team. 2018 D3football.com All-America Third Team Transfer from Pace University. 2018: D3football.com All-Region First Team (K); New England Football Writers College Division All-New England Team (Place Kicker); CCC Football All-Conference First Team (K); 2018 Noontime Sports Special Teams Player of the Year.

LGL ends his career at Otterbein third all-time in net average (39.8) and sixth in punting yards (4,774) despite only being a two-year starter. He placed 42 total attempts inside the 20 and also holds the program record for most yards in a single game (490). 2019: 3rd All North. A 2x All-OAC performer, Green-Lauber picked right back up this season by leading the league and ranking 18th nationally with a 40.3 net average. He also finished top-five in the nation for both attempts and yards, placing 21 of his 63 kicks inside the 20-yard line. 2018: Second team All-OAC honors. Led the league with 63 punts and downed 20 of those inside the 20-yard line. Ranked second in the OAC (and top-25 nationally) at a 39.3 net average.

Broke the USA South Conference record for career field goals after making three against Brevard and finishing his career with 36 makes. Tied the program record for longest punt with a 69-yard punt against Hampden-Sydney. Named to the D3football.com Team of the Week as a punter on Sept. 10 and Nov. 5. Selected to the USA South All-Conference First Team as a punter. Played in the FCS Senior Scout Bowl.

2018: Named to the D3football.com Preseason All-America First Team at kicker. Played in all 10 games as a junior. Punted 43 times for a total of 1,731 yards with an average of 40.3.
