2019: All-PAC Second Team. Adams capped his W&J career by ranking second in the league in passing yards (2,591), passing touchdowns (23) and total offense per game (245.0). The senior signal caller tossed for a program record 499 yards in a 27-20 loss to Westminster on Oct. 26. Adams did well distributing the football to his receiving corps, as five different Presidents recorded at least 20 receptions and at least 200 receiving yards. With Adams' help, two W&J receivers surpassed 700 yards receiving in 2019. Adams will enter his final game Saturday at Ithaca with 503 completions, 6,509 passing yards and 63 touchdowns during his collegiate career.



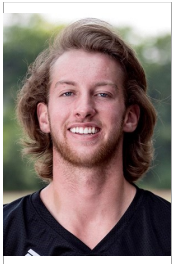
ZACH EDWARDS

2019: Took part in the sixth annual FCS Bowl. Edwards concluded his CSS career with three straight Upper Midwest Athletic Conference (UMAC) First Team honors. Edwards led the conference in passing yards (3,105), passing touchdowns (32), points responsible for (238), completions per game (28.2) and total offense per game (329.6). Edwards also ranked in the top 10 in NCAA Division III in each of those categories. Edwards broke single-game program records this season for completions (36-twice), passing yards in a game (509) and total offense in a game (529). He set single-season program records for completions (282) and touchdowns responsible for (39). Edwards finishes his career with the most completions (696), passing yards (9,024), passing touchdowns (90) and touchdowns responsible for (101) in program history. 2017, 2018: First Team All-UMAC.



JACKSON ERDMANN

Transfer from Penn State. A 2019 Gagliardi Trophy finalist and the award's recipient in 2018, Erdmann earned his third consecutive All-MIAC first-team honor and currently leads Division III in passing yards (5,040) and passing yards per game (360.0), is second in total offense (364.3 ypg.), third in passing touchdowns (47), fifth in both pass-efficiency rating (178.2) and points responsible for (290), sixth in yards per pass attempt (10.31) and eighth in yards per completion (16.10). Erdmann fell 28 passing yards shy of the NCAA Division III single-season record of 5,068 set by Joe Callahan of Wesley (Del.) in 2015. He owns MIAC and SJU records for passing touchdowns (139) and passing yards (11,639), as well as the school record for season pass attempts (489), season pass completions (313), career touchdowns responsible for (143), game passing yards (496), touchdown passes in a game (7), touchdown passes in a season (47), season passing yards (5,040), yards of total offense in a game (563), yards of total offense in a season (5,100), yards of total offense in a career (11,976), 300-yard passing games in a season (11) and 300-yard passing games in a career (15). Erdmann ended his career second in school history in pass attempts (1,188), career pass completions (754) and wins as a starting quarterback (37).



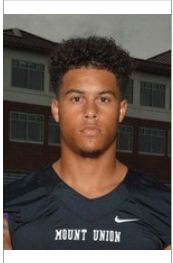

In eight games played this season (all starts), Kalosky has compiled 2,159 passing yards (269.9 yards per game) and 25 touchdown passes on 188 completions (262 attempts, 71.8%). Kalosky currently ranks first in the league in completion percentage, touchdowns, and yards per game, second in pass efficiency (166.4), fourth in completions, and fifth in yards and attempts. Kalosky, who also has scored three rushing touchdowns this season, has thrown for three or more touchdowns in a game five times this fall. Kalosky's play behind center has also played a pivotal role in the Gulls' offense ranking second in the league in points (405) and points per game (40.5), and third in yards per game (403.7) and total offense (4037). 2018: 2018 CCC Football All-Conference Second Team.



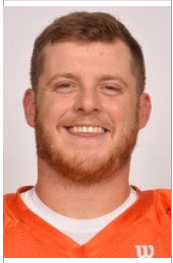

McFadden wrapped up his career ranked eighth all-time in ONU history with 4,671 passing yards and second with a 61.9 completions percentage. His career passer efficiency rating of 164.7 shattering the long-standing mark of 150.64 set by Joe Zarlinga from 1995-98. He also had 51 touchdown passes with only nine interceptions in his 25-game career.

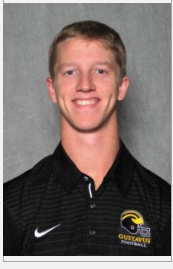
