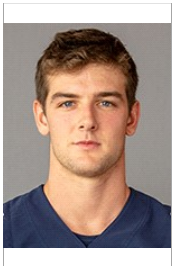
ADAM **AMBROGLIO**

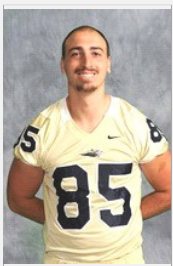

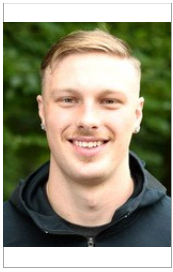

Herink ranked fourth in the conference standing for receptions per game and second for reception yards per game.

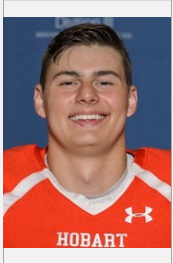

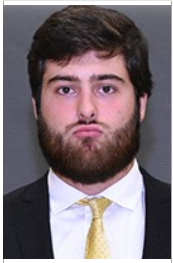
