Despite being avoided by opposing quarterbacks on a regular basis, Searles still tied for the conference lead in passes broken up (11) in 2017. Searles also led UD in fumbles forced (2), was third in solo tackles (42) and was fifth in total tackles (58). Searles, who was also named the Pioneer Football League Special Teams Player of the Year, was also Dayton's special teams captain this season. He ranked seventh in the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision with 825 combined kick return yards in 2017.
