Georgia transfer, 2017: 2nd All SoCon. Three-year starter who moved to center as a senior. Started all 11 games at center. 2016: 2nd All SoCon.

BEN HARTMAN FORDHAM 6-5 290 OC/OG

2017: 2nd All Patriot. Started ten games this fall, displayed his versatility by playing at three different positions on the offensive line in 2017 as the line was hit by the injury bug. 3yr starter. Helped pave the way for the Crusaders to average 397.5 total yards, 143.4 rushing yards and 23.1 point per game on the season.

ALEX THOMPSON MONMOUTH (NJ) 6-4 300 OC/OG

Previously attended West Virginia as a wrestler, 2016: 1st All Big South. 2017: 1st All ECAC, College Gridiron Showcase, 1st All Big South, 3rd AP All American, 2nd Phil Steele All American, 3rd STATS All American. Anchored an offensive line that produced one of the most potent offenses in all of the FCS. The senior started every game at center for the Hawks and closed his career starting 44 of 45 games and earning all-conference honors three consecutive years. The First Team All-Big South and First Team All-ECAC selection guided a Hawks offense that scored 32.8 points per game and counted a 2,000 yard passer and 1,000 yard rusher among its ranks.
