Ranks eighth in Gardner-Webb history in career rushing yards, regardless of position. Is the program's all-time leader in rushing yards for a quarterback. Also the top rushing quarterback in Big South Conference history 2016: 1st All Big South (OPOY), Stats-1657 yds pass, 965 yds rush.

Led the nation in total offense as the Coyotes quarterback with 373.4 yards a game, along with ranking second in total passing yards (4,134) and third in total touchdowns with 43 (32 passing, 11 rushing). He won the Missouri Valley Football Conference Offensive Player of the Year Award while setting single-season league records in passing yards and total offensive yards (4,854). Streveler helped lead the Coyotes to their first FCS playoff appearance and playoff win in school history. He is now second in career passing yards at UCA, as well as pass completions (560), pass attempts (887) and total offense (7,988). 1st All Southland (POY), 3rd HERO All American, 3rd Phil Steele All American, 2017 Stats-67%, 3129 yds, 29 TDs-9 INTs, 260.8 y/g, 93 yds rush, TD. 2016: 2nd All Southland, STATS-60.4%, 3051 yds, 19 TDs-10 INTs, 216 yds rush.

2017: 2nd All Ivy, ADA Academic All Star, Stats-63.4%, 2407 yds, 16 TDs-10 INTs, 135.7 eff, 240.7 y/g, 143 rush yds, 3 TDs. Set a school-record for season completion percentage (63.4 percent) while completing 206 of 325 passes for 2,407 yards and 16 touchdowns. He also led the Lions in total offense with 2,550 yards and rushed for 143 yards on 118 carries and three touchdowns. Overall, he was responsible for 19 of Columbia's 31 touchdowns on the year. Among national FCS statistical leaders, he ranks No. 17 in completion percentage (63.4%), No. 17 in completions per game (20.6), No. 23 in passing yards per game (240.7) and No. 26 in total offense (255.0). In addition, Hill ranked No. 2 in the Ivy League in total

offense (255.0 per game), No. 2 in passing yardage per game (240.7) and No. 5 in passing efficiency (135.7). Hill concludes his career after having started 18 consecutive games and led Columbia to an 11-7 overall record, the best record for a Lions starting quarterback in over 70 years. Over his four-year, 31-game collegiate career, Hill ranked among Columbia's all-time career leaders in several statistics: No. 5 in pass completions (399), No. 5 in passing yardage (4,612), No. 6 in touchdown passes (27) and No. 5 in total offense (5,777). He completed 399 of 645 career passes for 4,612 yards and 27 touchdowns. A team captain. 2016: STATS-53.7%, 1651 yds, 10 TDs, 258 yds rush.

Became Princeton's 11th Bushnell Cup winner as the Ivy League Offensive Player of the Year after record-breaking season; unanimous first-team All-Ivy League quarterback. Broke the Princeton career record for passing yards with 7,510. Moved into sixth place in the Ivy League career passing yards list. Broke the Princeton AND Ivy League record for single-season passing yards with 3,474; previous Ivy mark was Jeff Mathews (3,412, 2011). Broke the Princeton AND Ivy League record for single-season completion percentage with 73.2%; previous Ivy mark was Gavin Hoffman (70.5, 2000) and previous Princeton mark was Jason Garrett (68.2, 1988). Finished second in the Princeton rankings and fourth on the Ivy League rankings in career completion percentage (64.5%). Broke the Princeton pass efficiency single-season record and finished third on the Ivy list with 168.4; previous Princeton mark was 151.64, set by Quinn Epperly in 1983. Broke the Princeton record for single-season completions and finished third on the Ivy League single-season list with 284; previous Princeton mark was 224. Broke the Princeton record for career completions and finished fourth on the Ivy League

career list with 655; previous Princeton mark was 542. Broke the Princeton record and finished second on the Ivy League list for passing touchdowns with 29. Finished second on the Princeton career touchdown passes list with 43 (Butler threw 47). Set Princeton record and finished sixth on the Ivy League list with 11 consecutive games with at least one touchdown pass. Tied the Ivy League record for most 400-yard passing games (three) and 300-yard passing games (eight) in a single season. Handed Harvard its worst home Ivy loss in 50 years (52-17) by going 31 for 35 for 421 yards and two touchdowns. Added 454 passing yards and four touchdowns against eventual Ivy champion Yale.

Named second team All-Patriot League this year, marking the third time he has earned All-Conference honors. He was previously named to the All-Patriot League first team in 2015 and the second team in 2014. Pujals started all 11 games at quarterback for the Crusaders in 2017, connecting on 238 of 430 passes for 2,776 yards and 17 touchdowns. He also rushed the ball 82 times for 151 yards and three scores, while finishing the year with 2,927 yards of total offense. Pujals ranked second in the Patriot League in both passing yards and yards of total offense, while standing third in pass efficiency (119.4 rating). Over the course of his Holy Cross career, he hit on 1,071 of 1,796 attempts for 11,695 yards and 84 touchdowns, while rushing 511 times for 1,756 yards and 19 scores. Pujals ranks first all-time at Holy Cross in career games played (48), career games started (46) and career pass attempts; while standing second in career passing yards, career completions, career yards of total offense (13,451) and career touchdown passes.

Completed 271-of-417 pass attempts for 3,222 yards and 26 touchdowns, with 14 interceptions. Also rushed for 322 yards and seven scores on 146 carries. Led CAA and ranked ninth nationally in completion percentage (65%). Also ranked 13th in passing touchdowns, 23rd in pass efficiency (143.8 rating), 28th in both point responsibility (13.2) and in yards per pass attempt (7.73) and 30th in completions (18.07). Second in JMU single-season history in passing yards, completions and pass attempts and third in both passing touchdowns and total offense (3,544). Tied JMU single-game record with five passing

Nine games over 70% for completion percentage. Rushed for 76 yards and a career-high three touchdowns at Elon (Nov. 18). CAA Preseason Player of the Year. Preseason All-CAA selection. Recognized on Preseason and Midseason Watch List for CFPA FCS National Performer of the Year. Paced the NEC in passing touchdowns (27), total touchdowns (32), completion percentage (.667) and pass efficiency rating (159.3) and passing yards per attempts (8.1) Stats-66.7%, 2405 yds, 27 TDs-8 INTs, 218 y/g, 159.3 eff, 328 rush yds, 5 TDs.
