He also amassed 7,374 career all-purpose yards, a school and Patriot League career record, tenth best in NCAA FCS history. Edmonds, who was limited by injuries this year but still was named a second team All-Patriot League selection, rushed 136 times for 577 yards and five scores in seven games this fall. He also caught eleven passes for 129 yards. Despite missing four games to injury, Edmonds ranked fourth in the Patriot League in total rushing yards. As a senior, he returned 30 kickoffs for 740 yards, averaging 24.7 yards per return, which ranked third in the league and eighth all-time in Georgetown's single-season history. Ellsworth was also third on the team with 133 rushing yards, and added 50 receiving yards on 10 catches. He had kickoff returns of 62, 75 and 73 yards in consecutive games against Harvard, Princeton and Lehigh, respectively, and had a season-high 232 yards on seven kickoff returns against Harvard. For his career, Ellsworth ranks second in the GU record books in both kickoff returns (91) and kickoff return yards (2,140), while his career average of 23.5 yards per return is first.
