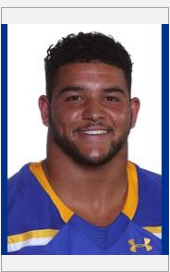

The senior tied a career high with 141 yards on 16 carries at Ivy League co-champion Yale and ran for a 74-yard touchdown to cap a 15-carry, 111-yard effort in the win over No. 12 Dartmouth, the league's other co-champ. The two-time first-team academic all-district pick posted 122 yards on 21 carries with a pair of touchdowns in the season-ending 35-9 win over Columbia. He surpassed the 2,000-yard mark in the triumph over the Lions, graduating No. 8 on Cornell's career rushing list and finishing first in career yards per rush.



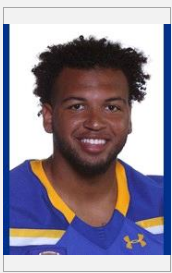

During his career with the Crusaders, Cozier has rushed 385 times for 2,128 yards and 18 touchdowns in 39 games played, while catching 36 passes for 273 yards and a score.

Guerriero, who ran for 1,995 yards, played three years of football at Monmouth after running track as a freshman, winning the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference 100 and 200 meter titles in the spring of 2017 before deciding to play football. Guerriero ran for over 100 yards in nine games last season, including four 200-yard games. Averaging 166.5 all-purpose yards, he had seven touchdown runs of 50 yards or more, including an FCS Playoff record 93-yard scamper against James Madison, which lost to North Dakota State on Saturday in the FCS Championship Game. For his career at Monmouth, Guerriero, 5-10, 190, ran for 3,974 yards and 35 touchdowns during his three seasons, while catching 69 passes for 551 yards and three touchdowns.

As a Freshman (2016) rushed for a Duquesne freshman-record of 1,291 yards and 13 touchdowns.

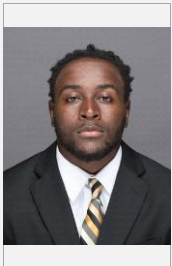
