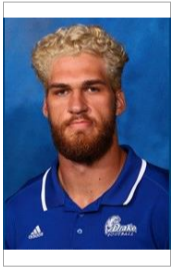

Over the course of the 2018 and 2019 seasons, Gonzalez posted a streak of touchdown receptions in eight consecutive home games at Joe Walton Stadium, a school record. During that span, Gonzalez finished with 11 touchdowns overall. Gonzalez concluded his career with totals of 96 receptions for 1,473 yards and 17 touchdowns. He ranks fifth all-time in both receiving yards and is tied for fourth in RMU career record book for touchdown catches. 2018: Associated Press FCS All-America Second Team. All-NEC First Team. Team-record 12 touchdown LED THE NEC. Led the Colonials in receiving yards with 642.

Over the course of his collegiate career, he has now totaled 52 receptions for 698 yards and seven touchdowns in 40 games played. Preece wraps up his career at No. 5 on the school's career receiving TD list with 24 – the most ever by an Aggie tight end – and became the third tight end in program annals to surpass 100 career receptions (109). He also captured his second straight CoSIDA Academic All-District 8 award this fall, and will be a candidate to repeat as an FCS Athletics Directors Association Academic All-Star.

Schlageter, who caught at least one pass in nine of Columbia's 10 games in 2019, set career-highs for both receptions (7) and receiving yards (52) in the Lions' season finale at Cornell. A 31-game starter, who has seen action in 37 career contests at Columbia, Schlageter has caught 38 passes for 328 yards (8.9 average per catch) and three touchdowns.

Taumoepeau caught 36 passes for 474 yards and two touchdowns this season despite missing two games. He wrapped up a career that included 117 catches, 1,876 yards and 11 TDs. Vikings primary offensive weapon; great hands and route runner. Often splits wide due to his size and ability to run. 2018: STATS 2nd team All-American, Hero Sports 2nd team All-American, Phil Steele 2nd team All-American, 1st team All-Big Sky Conference.



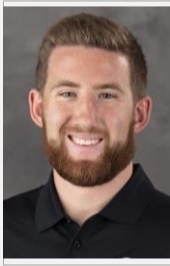
ADAM TRAUTMAN

TE Projected Position: TE

2019 team captain. Named All-American by HERO Sports, the Associated Press, FCA ADA, STATS FCS, AFCA. The Flyers' all-time leading receiver. He was UD's Most Valuable Player and the Pioneer Football League Offensive Player of the Year. He is the first tight end in PFL history to be named the league's top offensive player. (He is actually believed to be the first of any FCS league's offensive player of the year, but research is not complete.) He is the FCS's top-rated tight end in receiving touchdowns (14), receptions (6.4 per game), receiving yards (916) and scoring (7.8 points per game). Overall, he is ranked among the FCS's Top 50 in each of those categories, including third in the nation in receiving touchdowns. He also ranked first or second in the PFL in each of the receiver categories. The Flyer co-captain finished his Dayton career with the school record for receptions in a season (70), TD catches in a season (14), career receptions (178) and career touchdown catches (31). He also set the Flyer mark for TD catches in a game when he caught four this season against Jacksonville. (2018, 2017): Second-Team All-PFL.

2019: Named to the Big South All-Academic Team for the second straight season, starting all 11 CU games at tight end. A 2019 CoSIDA Academic All-District Team honoree and semifinalist for the 2019 National Football Foundation Campbell Trophy, the redshirt senior started his final 32 games for the Camels, posting a 10-yard catch at Charleston Southern. One of Campbell's team captains, Wooten was named Second Team All-Big South by Phil Steele in 2018.
