



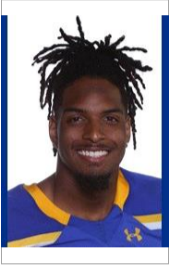

2019: Became the first two-time first team All-American for the Toreros in a dozen years. Among the nation's top wide receivers once again. At the end of the regular season, Bandy was top-10 in receiving touchdowns (8th) and receiving yards (10th) while his 103.6 receiving yards per game made him only one of eight FCS players to average more than 100 yards per game during the 2019 regular season. Bandy completed the entire season with 1,152 receiving yards on 75 catches, making him the first Torero in program history to have back-to-back 75+ catch seasons as well as consecutive 1,100+ receiving yard campaigns. Also had 12 receiving touchdowns and 1,304 all-purpose yards in 12 games. 2018: All-American honors - Associated Press FCS first team, STATS FCS first team, Walter Camp, FCS ADA, AFCA 2nd team. Ranked 1st in the FCS in receiving yds (1,427) and receiving yards/game (142.7), 2nd in receiving TDs (14). Unanimous All-Pioneer. Bandy has received All-America honors seven times in his career: twice from the AFCA, twice from STATS FCS, and once each from the AP, Walter Camp and FCS ADA. For his entire career, Bandy had 192 catches, 3,294 receiving yards and 28 receiving touchdowns as well as helped USD win four PFL championships and make the FCS Playoffs each season. The two-time All-PFL first team honoree averaged 17.2 yards per catch, which is sixth-best in program history, and 76.6 receiving yards per game in 43 contests. His 192 career grabs are tied for fourth-most in school history while his nearly 3,300 receiving yards are third-best.

He is only one of five receivers in MEAC history with 200-plus career receptions. Finished fourth on the MEAC's all-time touchdown receptions list. Has linebacker size, wide receiver speed and a running back mentality. STATS: 53 rec, 782 yds, 14.8 yds/rec avg 6 TDs. All-MEAC selection earning second-team honors in 2016, 2018 and 2019 and first-team honors in 2017. 2016 MEAC Rookie of the Year.

He finished with three 100-yard receiving games, highlighted by a career-high 133-yard effort against Merrimack that included an 80-yard reception. Bibbens had a career-high 11 receptions for 92 yards at Bucknell and was named Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week after catching 10 passes for 83 yards and scoring two touchdowns at Fordham. He showed his well-roundedness as a receiver by delivering the key block on freshman Zaythan Hill's Patriot League-record 94-yard touchdown run and also by catching the game-winning touchdown in overtime.

Cotton closed the season with a program-record 18 receptions at Northern Arizona, tying the most by an FCS player this year. Cotton was the only Big Sky student-athlete to average over 100 yards receiving per game. Despite playing only 10 games, Cotton led the conference in total catches and finished second in total yards. STATS: 83 rec, 1076 yds, 13.0 avg, 8 TDs. 2016: NJCAA Honorable Mention All-America, first-team all-region, first-team All-Western States Football League. He drew interest from FBS teams Kansas, UAB and UTEP after he earned JUCO All-American honorable mention status in 2016 by catching 43 passes for 837 yards and six touchdowns as a sophomore. Since he couldn't graduate until August 2017, most Division I teams pulled their offers because he couldn't join the team for spring camp or even summer workouts.
