A FCS Punter of the Year Watch List honoree, Dennis logged 10 punts of 50 or more yards, including a career long of 60 at Charleston Southern, and boomed a 58-yarder at North Alabama. A 2018 First Team All-Big South punter, also serving as CU's holder, Dennis forced 17 fair catches with only one touchback on the year. 2018: First Team All-Big South, First Team Big South All-Conference by Phil Steele.

2019: Hurst earned his first career Patriot League honor after a strong year where he averaged 40.7 yards on 51 punts. He totaled 2,076 yards, including 11 punts that traveled at least 50 yards and 17 points that pinned the opponent inside their own 20-yard line. He recorded two punts over 70 yards, including a Georgetown-record 76-yard punt in the season opener at Davidson. Hurst finishes his career having punted 208 times for 8,534 yards, which ranks third and fourth, respectively, in GU history. His career average of 41.0 yards per punt is the second highest all-time at Georgetown.

2019: Was recognized All-Ivy as both a place-kicker and punter for the second time in three seasons. He led the Ivy League and ranked 58th nationally with his 39.5 yard average on punts with 16 downed inside the 20 and seven going at least 50 yards. In Ivy games only, the senior led the conference in total punts, punts inside the 20 (11), 50-yard punts (5) and punts that were fair caught (15). He was also fifth in the Ancient Eight in field goals per game (0.67, 83rd nationally). Null connected on a PAT and a 49-yard field goal, a career-long and the sixth-longest in school history, while punting eight times at Harvard and booted a game-winning, 41-yard field goal with nine seconds left to give the Big Red a 37-35 win over Brown. That capped a day that saw him go 3-for-3 on field goals (38, 29, 41 yards) and 4-of-4 on PATs while also averaging 42.0 yards on three punts with one downed inside the Brown 5. He booted a pair of field goals and averaged 36.0 yards per punt with three downed inside the 20 on seven attempts in the win at No. 12 Dartmouth. Cornell's all-time leader in field goal percentage (16-of-21, .762), he ranks second in nearly every punting category

2019: Named the inaugural FCS Punter of the Year. Selected as a First Team All-American by five organizations this season. Put an exclamation mark on his legendary career in 2019, shattering his own school record in punting average by 2.2 yards. His 47.3 punting average broke the Patriot League record by 1.3 yards and ranked seventh in FCS history at the end of the 2019 regular season; in addition, it raised his career average to 44.5, good for fifth in the FCS annals at the end of the 2019 regular season. Will graduate with Bucknell's top four single-season punting averages of 47.3 (2019), 45.1 (2017), 44.5 (2018) and 42.1 (2015); his 44.5 career punting average is the school standard by 3.8 yards. 2018: STATS, Phil Steele and Hero Sports FCS First Team All-American, AP and AFCA FCS Second Team All-American, Athlon Sports All-American. 2017: STATS FCS Third Team All-American. 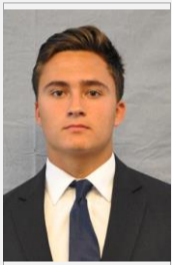

Made all 37 of his extra-point attempts. Kicked off 55 times for an average of 49.8 yards per kickoff and five touchbacks. Led the OVC in scoring with 7.6 points per game. Was second in the conference in field goal percentage (81.8 percent) and field goals per game (1.50 per game). Ranked ninth in the nation in field goals per game and 14th in field goal percentage. In a driving rain, and on a completely saturated field, hit four field goals and three extra-points to account for 15 of EKV's 33 points in a win at Eastern Illinois.
