

CODY BONTE *Dakota Wesleyan* 6-1 190 CB SS

GPAC Second Team Defense. Bonte finishes his four-year Tiger career with 56 tackles, a sack, seven tackles for loss, an interception and 19 pass break-ups. The senior ends his Tiger career with 152 total tackles and 32 total pass break-ups.

ANTONIO BROWN *William Penn* 6-0 175 CB

Notched his second career All-Heart nod (both on second team), tallying 54 tackles (37 solos, 17 assists, six for loss).

JARELL CARTER *Trinity International* 5-10 196 CB

Named to the All-MSFA Team for the second time; Carter was an Honorable Mention last season. Three-year starter. 2016 Stats: 66 tackles, 3 TFLs, 0.5 SACKS, 3 INTs, 12 PBUs, QBH, FR.

TIMOTHY CLAYTON *Arizona Christian* 6-1 185 CB

Two Time All-CSFL. 2016 Stats: 44 tackles, 2.0 TFLs, 3 INTs, 6 PBUs, 2 FF.

CORY EVANS *Concordia (Neb.)* 6-2 210 CB

Recorded a total of 39 tackles, including one for loss. Had two interceptions for eight yards and six opponent pass breakups. Was a member of a unit that had national rankings of 16th in total defense (328.4), 21st in pass defense (182.6) and 28th in scoring defense (24.1). Ranked 47th in Division I in passes defended per game (1).

SIDTRELL GRAYSON *Langston* 5-10 175 CB

First team All-CSFL tallied 20 total tackles but was a force to be reckoned with in the passing game as he snagged five interceptions for 28 yards.

JOSH HARRIS *Georgetown (KY)* 6-0 205 CB FS

Transfer from University of Kentucky where was listed as a safety. Played CB and FS. 2016 1st Team All-Conference. 2016 Stats: 48 tackles, 3.5 TFLs, 5 INTs (TD), PBU, FF.

CEESAY KALLIY *Eastern Oregon* 6-2 215 CB

Great size, quickness, strong tackler. Should have received post-season recognition. 2016 Stats: 49 tackles, 3.5 TFLs, 2 INTs (TD), 11 PBUs.

NA'SHAWN LEWIS *St. Francis (IN)* 6-1 203 CB

2016 1st. Team All-MSFA. 2015 (Jr.): All-MSFA Midwest League Honorable Mention. 2016 Stats: 46 tackles, 3.5 TFLs, 3 INTs, 8 PBUs.

KAVODERIC McINTYRE *McPherson* 6-0 180 CB

Honorable Mention All-KCAC made 51 stops, intercepted a team-high three passes, broke up three others, forced two fumbles and was credited with a fumble recovery.

QUADARIAS MIRELES *Faulkner* 5-11 190 CB RS

Was a utility worker for Faulkner this season. He was seventh in total tackles on the team with 47 which included 4.5 for a loss of 7.5 yards. On special teams he compiled 223 yards on nine kickoff return attempts and added 98 yards on 12 punt return tries. Mireles was eighth for the Eagles with 321 all purpose yards.

NATE MOORE *College of Idaho* **5-9 170 CB**

C of I's first-ever two-time All-American – finishing the 2016 regular-season with a Frontier Conference best and school record 119 tackles, adding three interceptions, two fumble recoveries and two forced fumbles. He was one of five players who earned All-America honors for a second-straight year.

BRANDON NAPOLEON *Georgetown (KY)* **5-10 185 CB**

2nd Team All-Conference after transferring from Northern Iowa and West Virginia. 2016 Stats: 20 tackles, 2.0 TFLs, 3 INTs, 4 PBU.

AVERY PARKER *Baker* **5-9 170 CB**

First Team All-Conference. Second on the team in interceptions with 6 to go with 10 PBUs a FF, a FR and 59 tackles; 7.5 for a loss.

ANDRE PEPPERS *Valley City State* **6-0 170 CB**

74 total tackles (36 solo), 1 INT, named First Team All Conference

LEWIS ROBERT *Grand View* **6-0 180 CB**

2016 AFCA NAIA Coaches' All-America Team. Grand View has had at least one player named to the AFCA Coaches' All-America Team for 8 straight seasons, from 2009 to present, the second longest streak by any team in NAIA. Lewis was named first team All-Conference earlier this season, along with Heart Defensive Player of the Year. He earned second team All-Conference after the 2015 season. Lewis finished the 2016 season with 38 total tackles, 2 tackles for loss, 2 interceptions and 7 pass break-ups.

DARRIAN TURK *Morningside* **5-8 170 CB**

All-GPAC First Team. Led the Mustangs with five interceptions and 11 pass breakups. Nineteen of his 24 tackles have also been solos.

TYRUS WILLIAMS *Sterling (KS)* **5-10 180 CB**

Was a unanimous All-KCAC First Team Defensive Back. Williams battled through an injury this season to still put up impressive numbers, finishing the year with 35 tackles and leading Sterling with three interceptions, tied for fourth best in the KCAC.
