## **KEEGAN BELL**

## **BENEDICTINE (KS)**

**5-9 185 CB/**

2017: 1st Team All-Heart. Recorded 36 tackles with two interceptions.

## **MONTANA TECH**

**5-10 180 CB/**

2017: On the All-Conference roster for a second time. Finished the year with 35 tackles, an INT, and 8 PBUs. Also blocked a kick. 2016: 1st Team All-Frontier.

## **MIDLAND**

**5-11 185 CB/RS**

2017: named to the All-GPAC 1st team as a kick returner. Averaged 27.6 yards per return with a pair of kickoff returns for touchdowns. Also earned honors for his play at defensive back. He was named to the second team as he compiled 37 tackles and two interceptions on the year.

## **TAYLOR**

**6-0 195 CB/**

2017: Closed his career at Taylor with a Second-Team All-MSFA honor, picking up his

fourth All-MSFA award after posting 52 tackles and leading the team with 35 solo hits and three interceptions from his safety position. 2016: First-Team All-MSFA.

**TABOR**

**6-2 185 CB/**

2017: 2nd Team All-KCAC. Solid tackler, good cover skills. Teams tended to avoid him.  
2016: HM All-KCAC.

**TAYLOR HAWKINS**

**6-1 180 CB/**

2017: Put together a strong season. Solid coverman, ballhawk. Had 28 tackles, 2.5 for a loss, a sack, 4 INTs and 9 PBUs.

**BRIAN JOHNSON, JR.**

**WAYLAND BAPTIST**

**5-9 185 CB/**

2017: 1st Team All-CSFL. Was third on the team in tackles with 45, including 26 solo and 19 assists. He made a team-high three interceptions with 34 return yards and recovered a fumble. He was an honorable mention all-conference choice in 2016.

**SEAN KELLEY**

**TABOR**

**5-11 190 CB/**

2017: Unanimous 1st Team All-KCAC. Had 33 tackles and scored two defensive TDs -1 on a 68 yard fumble recovery and one of his 4 INTs went for a score.

**ARTHUR KING**

**ST. FRANCIS (IL)**

**6-0 180 CB/**

2017: Took home first-team All-MSFA honors. King led the MSFA and ranked seventh in the NAIA in passes defended per game (17 in 10 games) this regular season. He broke up 13 passes and also pulled down four interceptions, while adding 31 tackles. Three of his four

interceptions went for touchdowns, including a 97-yard return that is now the longest play in school history.

## **D'MAURIA MARTIN**

**CONCORDIA (NEB)**

**6-0 195 CB/FS**

2017: A first team All-GPAC performer for the second year in a row, Martin put together a final collegiate season worthy of All-America consideration. Pulled in the NAIA National Defensive Player of the Week award on Oct. 16 after snaring three interceptions in a win over Midland. On the year, Martin totaled 52 tackles (six for loss), eight pass breakups, five interceptions and a forced fumble. After starting at corner his first three seasons as a Bulldog, Martin moved to safety in 2017. In his four-year career, Martin racked up 136 tackles, 13 tackles for loss, 30 pass breakups and seven interceptions.

**6-0 180 CB/RS**

2017: 1st team All-CSFL. Had four INTs returning one for a TD. Also had 22 tackles and 314 KOR yards. 2016: 1st team All-CSFL. 2015 2nd Team All-NAIA. 2015,

## **DARIUS PRICE**

**SIENA HEIGHTS**

**6-2 215 CB/**

2017: Was the top vote recipient in the NAIA for the Cliff Harris Award, which is awarded to the top defensive players in NCAA Div. II, Div. III and the NAIA. Price is the first Saint to receive this award. Price was named AFCA-NAIA First Team All-American, MSFA Midwest League Defensive Player of the Year and a rare four-time All-MSFA Midwest League selection. He collected 41 tackles, nine pass break ups, two fumble recoveries and a sack for the Saints in 2017. 2016: Mid-States Football Association Midwest League First Team.

## **TARENCE ROBY**

**CONCORDIA (NEB)**

**6-3 200 CB/RS**

2017: One of the most electrifying talents in the conference. Has been named an all-conference choice in each of his four seasons. The highlight reel play of his senior season was a 100-yard interception for a touchdown in the win over Ottawa that landed him on

ESPN's SportsCenter. On the year, Roby posted 31 tackles, seven pass breakups, four interceptions and a forced fumble. He also piled up 1,041 all-purpose yards (718 kick return, 166 punt return, 151 interception return) while serving as one of the nation's top return men. Roby compiled 141 tackles, 27 pass breakups and nine interceptions over his Bulldog career. AP First Team All-American, Victory Sports Network First Team All-American, AFCA Second Team All-American, Finalist for Cliff Harris Award (given to top small college defensive player), First Team All-GPAC, Omaha World-Herald All-Nebraska. 2016: named first team all-conference as a kick returner and second team All-GPAC as a defensive back.

**MALIK WHITFIELD**                      **COLLEGE OF IDAHO**

**5-10 180 CB/**

2017: How does a CB with 20 PBUs not make the All-Conference team? Two year full-time starter who also had 24 tackles, a FF, 3 FR, and an INT in 2017. In his fifth season with the Coyote football program and completed his four seasons of eligibility with the track program.

**TOMUNCI WHITFIELD**                      **SOUTHWESTERN**

**5-10 180 CB/**

2017: AFCA 1st Team All-American finished his season as NAIA leader with seven interceptions. He also added 37 tackles (25 solo, 12 assist), including 21 passes defended, which ranked him fourth in the NAIA in passes defended per game (1.900). Whitfield was named to the First Team All-KCAC unanimously, by the conference coaches.

**TERRANCE WILLIAMS**                      **ROCKY MOUNTAIN**

**5-11 175 CB/**

2017: Named to the All-Frontier second team at defensive back. The senior from Baltimore, Md., recorded four interceptions and made 29 tackles this season. Williams also recorded one pass breakup and one fumble recovery to secure his first all-conference award.
