## **CODY BAUMAN**

## **NORTHWESTERN COLLEGE**

**6-5 260 DE/**

2017: One of the premier pass rushers in the GPAC, ranking third in the conference with five quarterback sacks. The senior excelled on the Red Raiders defensive line, accounting for 23.5 stops, including 9.5 for a loss of 35 yards. Bauman earned 1st Team All-GPAC postseason honor for the first time.

**6-3 255 DE/**

2017: All-KCAC 2nd Team earned a spot on the second-team defensive line by finishing this season with career highs in tackles (48), sacks (5.5), and tackles for loss (8.5).; 2016: All-KCAC 2nd Team

**6-3 260 DE/**

2017: First Team All-Mid-South Conference Appalachian Division. Had 40 tackles 11.4 TFLs, 8 sacks a forced fumble and a blocked kick.

## **ST. XAVIER**

**6-3 250 DE/**

2017: Earned All-MSFA Honorable Mention honors. Spent a lot of time in opposing backfield with 10 TFLs, 6 sacks and 6 QBHs

**JOSH KOCK                      BAKER**

**6-0 260 DE/ILB**

2017: American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) NAIA First Team All-America. Was fourth on the team in tackles this season with 59 and led the team in tackles for loss with 15 and added seven more sacks to his illustrious career total. He ends his impressive Baker career with 29 career sacks, just four behind the school record of 33. Kock also had a fumble recovery for a touchdown this season and ends his BU career with 55 tackles for loss, one interception and 243 total tackles. He was named the Heart South Co-Defensive Player of the Year in three-straight seasons from 2015 to 2017. In 2016, he earned a spot on the AFCA-NAIA Second Team All-America as well.

**JASON LUPKES                      MORNINGSIDE**

**6-3 260 DE/**

2017: All-GPAC First Team Defense. HaD 16 solos and 26 assists to lead the Mustangs' defensive linemen with 42 tackles. Lupkes is second on the team with nine tackles for losses of 36 yards, 3.5 quarterback sacks and six quarterback hurries.

**BRAD WOLF                      MORNINGSIDE**

**6-4 275 DE/**

2017: Honorable Mention All-GPAC. Had 36 tackles with 8.0 for a loss, 3.0 sacks and 4 QBHs.

---

**DENZEL BRADFORD                      WAYLAND BAPTIST**

**6-2 314 DT/**

2017: 1st team All-CSFL. Played tackle along the WBU defensive front. In nine games he recorded seven solo and eight assisted tackles for 15 total. He tallied 3½ tackles for loss and one sack.

---

**JAMARAE FINNIE****LANGSTON****6-3 300 DT/**

2017: Named a finalist for the Cliff Harris award after finishing the 2017 season with 64 total tackles, 33 solo with 7.5 sacks and 17 tackles for loss; the senior defensive linemen currently ranks 10th in the NAIA in total tackles for loss. For his efforts this season, Finnie was named Associated Press NAIA First Team All-American, AFCA NAIA First Team All-American, the CSFL Defensive Player of the Year, All-CSFL first team defense, OSN Defensive Player of the Year and All-OSN first team defense.

**ERIC HEMMELGARN****ST. FRANCIS (IN)****6-5 320 DT/**

2017: NAIA Football All-American team. Named All-MSFA 1st Team. 2016 & 2017 NAIA National Champion. The big block of granite for USF D - always double-teamed. Had 29 tackles, 6.0 TFLs, 3.5 sacks, 9 QBHs.

**KRYTON KILGORE****MISSOURI VALLEY****6-1 305 DT/**

2017: Heart of America Athletic Conference All-Southern Division 1st Team. A three-time first team all-division selection and a third team selection in 2014, finished the season with 41 total tackles and was second on the team in tackles-for-loss (7.5) and second in sacks (3).

**JOSH PRICE****COLLEGE OF IDAHO****6-3 305 DT/**

2017: Earned second-team honors All-Frontier. Was the anchor of a defensive line that allowed just 138 yards a game – the fewest since 1974. He recorded 49 total tackles, including a team-leading 11.5 tackles for loss, four sacks and two forced fumbles.

**SHAQUILLE WELLS****GRAND VIEW****6-0 320 DT/**

2017: Heart of America Conference Defensive Player of the Year. Accumulated 26 total tackles on the season, including 4 tackles for loss and 1 sack, coaches were impressed on his ability to control the line of scrimmage and disrupt opposing offenses.

**CAMERON OSHODI      GEORGETOWN**

**6-1 305 NG/**

2017: NAIA/AFCA All-America Second Team. Finished his GC career in the quarterfinals of the NAIA Football Championship Series. He played 32 games with 57 total tackles.

His three sacks this season gives him five and half for his four years as he forced opponent's backward 22.5 yards. Oshodi finished with 16 total career tackles for loss for a negative 46.6 yards.
