Four-year starter for Edward Waters and was named one of the team captains this past season. In 2016, Dolcine was named team Offensive Lineman of the Year.

BENEDICTINE (KS)

6-5 320 OC/

2017: All-Heart North 1st team. Was a main cog of the Ravens offensive line this season. Benedictine finished the year with 3,037 yards rushing which ranks No. 4 in the NAIA. As a team, the Ravens also ranked No. 3 in total scoring offense (583) breaking the previous single-season team record of 488 set by the 1985 team. 2016: All-Heart North 2nd team

BRAYDEN KEARSLEY

EASTERN OREGON

6-4 300 OC/

2017: Started every game on the EOU offensive line as helped the Mountaineers rush for 1,812 yards on the season, good for 181.2 rushing yards per game. Transferring out of Oregon State before the season, Kearsley made an instant impact up front, helping the Mounties score 25.3 points per game.

JALEN WHITLEY**MONTANA TECH****6-3 295 OC/**

2017: 3 year starter. All-Frontier Second Team the first time. Tech's offense ranked first in scoring and total offense this year. The Orediggers were nationally ranked in most offensive categories.

SPENCER BAALMAN**TABOR****6-5 300 OG/OT**

2017: Second Team AP All-American; AFCA NAIA Coaches' All-America 2nd Team. Helped the Tabor offense to a conference-high 40.5 points per game this season and 466.8 yards of offense per game. The Bluejays also led the KCAC and ranked fifth nationally with 280.5 rushing yards per game. 2016: Unanimous 1st Team All-KCAC. AFCA All-American.

GARRETT BADER**BENEDICTINE (KS)****6-5 287 OG/OT**

2017: AFCA-NAIA All-America 2nd team. Was a center piece of the Ravens offensive line this season. Benedictine finished the year with 3,037 yards rushing which ranks No. 4 in the NAIA. As a team, the Ravens also ranked No. 3 in total scoring offense (583) breaking the previous single-season team record of 488 set by the 1985 team. 2016: All-Heart North 1st team

DOMINIC BARICH**BENEDICTINE (KS)****6-6 313 OG/**

2017: 3 year starter. All-Frontier Second Team the first time. Tech's offense ranked first in scoring and total offense this year. The Orediggers were nationally ranked in most offensive categories.

6-2 305 OG/OC

2017: Became a two-time VSN All-American with the selection this year, after earning the honor a year ago. The senior finishes his four-year SXU career with four All-American awards in all, having twice been named to the AFCA-NAIA All-American Team as well. Has started every game of his career and been first team all-conference every year.

JAY HURA**LANGSTON****6-3 330 OG/**

2017: Named Honorable Mention All-CSFL as starting right guard for the undefeated Langston team.

ERIC JACKSON**LANGSTON****6-4 315 OG/**

2017: Named Honorable Mention All-CSFL as starting left guard for the undefeated Langston team.

AVERY LOCK**VALLEY CITY STATE****6-4 290 OG/OT**

2017: AP All-America 2nd Team. First-Team All-Conference. 2016: First-Team All-Conference. 2014: Named NSAA 1st Team All Conference. Three-year starter.

ANDY METZGER**MORNINGSIDE****6-3 290 OG/OC**

2017: All-GPAC Second Team. Key part of a Morningside offensive line that has allowed only nine quarterback sacks all season for the fourth lowest total in the nation. 2016: HM All-GPAC

JOHN MUNGER**MONTANA WESTERN****6-4 285 OG/**

2017: Tech's offense ranked first in scoring and total offense this year. The Orediggers were nationally ranked in most offensive categories.

CULLEN OLIVER**OKLAHOMA PANHANDLE****6-3 300 OG/**

2017: All-Conference 2nd Team. Team averaged 30 points/game with a balanced offense.

DAJSHON OLIVER WARNER

6-5 315 OG/

2016 & 2017: NAIA All-American, First Team All-Sun Conference. Most decorated player in program history.

PAYS TODD CARROLL COLLEGE

6-4 295 OG/OT

2017: College Sports Information Directors of America College Division Academic All-America First Team. Pays was a starter on the offensive line that produced the second rushing offense in the Frontier Conference and the No. 18 ranking in the NAIA with 209.8 yards per game.

KYLE WILSON BETHEL (KS)

6-3 320 OG/OC

2016 & 2017 All-KCAC Honorable Mention. Broke the 60+ year old Bethel shot put record, and was the KCAC Individual Champion in both the shot put and discus. Arguably the strongest man on Bethel's campus.

ANDREW ALT DICKINSON STATE

6-5 290 OT/

2017: Honorable Mention All-NSAA. Transfer from Montana State.

LOGAN BALL TAYLOR

6-4 295 OT/OG

2017: Followed his First-Team All-MSFA award from one year ago with an All-MSFA Honorable Mention nod to close his collegiate career. The right tackle bolstered TU's offensive line and helped the Trojans eclipse 100 yards rushing in five contests during the regular season. 2016: First-Team All-MSFA.

GRIFFIN BLEDSOE**BENEDICTINE (KS)****6-5 297 OT/**

2017: Part of an Raven's offensive line this season. Benedictine finished the year with 3,037 yards rushing which ranks No. 4 in the NAIA. As a team, the Ravens also ranked No. 3 in total scoring offense (583) breaking the previous single-season team record of 488 set by the 1985 team. 2016: All-Heart North 2nd team

AYRIUS BROWN**KANSAS WESLEYAN****6-4 306 OT/**

2017: A repeat First Team All-KCAC selection and was key in helping the KWU offense average 434.8 yards of total offense, which ranks No. 2 in the KCAC and No. 26 in the NAIA and only allow 11 sacks, which ranks No. 9 in the NAIA. 2015, 2016 1st Team All-KCAC.

JUSTIN BURNS**BETHANY (KS)****6-4 315 OT/**

Three-time all-KCAC lineman for a balanced offense. Very good at the initial point of attack and has some skills getting to the 2nd level.

CHRIS EMTER**CARROLL COLLEGE****6-4 305 OT/OG**

2017: Associated Press All-America First Team. Four-year starter and a back-to-back Frontier Conference First-Team honoree. He was the anchor of an offensive line that was second in the Frontier in rushing and was 18th in the NAIA at 209.8 yards per game. 2016: 1st Team Frontier All-Conference. Emter also earned All-American honors in outdoor track and field. He finished sixth in the shot put last season with a throw of 55-feet-4.25. He was also named to the AFCA All-America First Team released last week. Emter now looks to close out his senior year in strong form in the throwing circle. He has already qualified for the NAIA Indoor championship in the shot put.

LOGAN GLAZE**MARION****6-6 285 OT/**

Career Achievements: Named AFCA All-American Second Team (2016), named All-MSFA Midwest First Team (2016). 2017: Key part of offensive line that helped Marian rank fourth in the nation in rushing yards per game (283.2) and number eight in total rushing offense (2832 yards). Offensive line allowed only nine sacks, which ranked fourth in the country.

TAYLOR JOHNSON**TAYLOR****6-6 310 OT/**

Left tackle bolstered TU's offensive line and helped the Trojans eclipse 100 yards rushing in five contests during the regular season.

TAYLOR KOOI**NORTHWESTERN COLLEGE****6-3 290 OT/OG**

Started every game this season and have paved the way for a Red Raider offense that averages 35 points and 479 yards per game. They are part of an o-line that leads the way for the Red Raiders dominating rushing attack and have also given up just 11 sacks all season, ninth best in the NAIA.

ZAC LAWSON**LINDSEY-WILSON****6-3 300 OT/**

Anchored an offensive line that helped Lindsey Wilson post 459.2 yards of total offense per outing, including 161.5 rushing yards per game. The Blue Raider offense averaged a program-record 48.2 points per game this season. In addition to the two all-America teams, Lawson was also named first-team All Mid-South Conference, academic all-conference and NAIA Scholar Athlete this season.

DEVON PETTY**SAGU****6-4 290 OT/**

2016 & 2017 Central State Football League's 1st Team All-Conference.

JAKOB POPPLE**OKLAHOMA PANHANDLE****6-5 290 OT/OG**

2017: All-Conference 1st Team 2016: All-Conference Honorable Mention. Team averaged 30 points/game with a balanced offense.

GREG RODRIGUEZ**DAKOTA STATE****6-3 305 OT/OG**

2017: Rodriguez started at right tackle position for Dakota State's offensive line. He was one of the integral members of the DSU's offensive line as one of the top offensive teams in the NAIA. The Trojans only limited its opponents to 10 total quarterback sacks in 11 games, which is sixth-best in the nation. Dakota State also piled up a total of 3,311 passing offense as well as 1,997 rushing yards in 2017, breaking a new DSU school single-season team record for most offensive yards with 5,308 yards. The Trojans also recorded 260 first downs, which is also a new team single-season record. It was the third straight year that Rodriguez was honored to the North Star All-Conference Team, his second straight year as the First-Team selection. 2016: North Star Football All-Conference First Team. Transfer from Jamestown.

ALI SHARYAR**BETHANY (KS)****6-5 300 OT/**

Honorable Mention All-KCAC. Also competed in shot put. Solid lineman for a balanced offense.

DANE SKRILOFF**SOUTHERN OREGON****6-6 285 OT/OG**

2017: Two-year starter. Headed an offensive line that's only allowed QB to be sacked 16 times.

JASON SMITH**CUMBERLAND****6-4 305 OT/OG**

2017: First Team All-Mid-South Conference Bluegrass Division. Paved the way for 2,867 rushing yards and 35 touchdowns on the ground, ranking seventh nationally in total

rushing yards and eighth in rushing yards per game (260.7). The Phoenix rushed for more than 244 yards in seven of the team's 11 contests. Transfer from Eastern Kentucky.

2017: Honorable Mention All-NSAA. Helped team average 36.7 points for, 287.4 yards passing, 188.4 yards rushing, 287.4 yards receiving, and 557.4 all-purpose yards per game.
