6-0 200 QB/

2017: Was named to the MSFA Midwest All-League First Team for the second time, after being ranked 22nd in passing yards per game (238.5), and 22nd in total offense per game (248.1). The senior threw for 2,264 yards and 19 touchdowns.

DYLAN BEASLEY

LINDSEY-WILSON

6-0 190 QB/

2017: Mid-South Conference Bluegrass Division Football Offensive Player of the Year. Completed 171-of-269 passing attempts for 2,384 yards, 31 touchdowns and just three interceptions in his nine games during the regular season. He added one touchdown on the ground while eclipsing 300 passing yards twice throughout the year, including throwing for five touchdowns three times during the season. His pass efficiency of 173.8 led the Bluegrass Division. 2016: MSC West Second Team.

ALEX BELL

UNION (KY)

6-1 212 QB/

2017: All-Mid-South Conference (MSC) Appalachian Division 1st Team. A four-time MSC Appalachian Offensive Player of the Week honoree this year, threw for 2,521 yards and 26 touchdowns – both of which rank third best in program history. He saved his best game for last when he posted a career-high 372 passing yards and five touchdowns in a 56-29 win over Point (Ga.). Bell also ran for 405 yards and four touchdowns.

LOGAN BRETTELL**BAKER****5-11 190 QB/ATH**

2017: All-Heart 1st Team. 256 att, 157 comp, 8 INTs, 61.3%, 2550 yds, 24 TDs, 2016: NAIA National Player of the Year

HUNTER BROWN**CAMBELLSVILLE****6-3 220 QB/**

2017: Named the NCCAA Offensive Player of the Year for the second-straight season. All Mid-South Conference Bluegrass Division Second Team. Brown highlighted the All-NCCAA First Team on offense after racking up 370.5 passing yards per game in his final season of collegiate football, which led the NAIA. The redshirt-senior finished the year 35 total touchdowns in 10 games for the Tigers. Over his three season at Campbellsville and last two years as the Tiger starting quarterback, Brown rewrote the Campbellsville record books in passing attempts (945), passing completions (573), passing yards (7,649), passing yards per game (332.6), total offense (7,502), total offensive yards per game (326.2) and touchdown passes (71).

GARY CHOULOUTE**WEBBER INTERNATIONAL****6-4 190 QB/ATH**

2017: Finished his final season as a Warrior with career-highs in attempts (284), completions (169), passing percentage (.595), passing yards (1,438) and passing yards per game (159.8). He also equaled his career-high with eight passing touchdowns while adding 273 rushing yards and three rushing touchdowns. He finished the season ranked 50th in the NAIA in total offensive yards per game at 191.100.

TREY COOPER**MIDAMERICA NAZARENE****6-2 220 QB/**

2017: 2nd Team All-Heart. Good arm, decent runner. Keeps the chains moving. 368 attempts, 196 completions, 12 INTs, 53.3%, 2636 yds, 24 TDs; 90 carries, 393 yds, 4.4 avg, 9 TDs.

KELLY CORDOVA**KANSAS WESLEYAN****5-10 204 QB/ATH**

2017: 2nd Team All-KCAC was ranked second in the KCAC in total offense per game averaging 295.7 yards per contest. He averaged 232.3 yards per game passing and 63.4 yards per game rushing leading the Coyotes in both categories. He had 28 passing touchdowns and five rushing touchdowns on the season. He threw for 2323 yards on the season, completing 56.9 percent of his passes. In his last three games he completed 70 percent of his passes while throwing for 851 yards and 15 touchdowns. He ranks No. 13 in the NAIA in total offense per game, No. 18 in pass efficiency and No. 26 in passing per game.

RYAN ESSLINGER**ARIZONA CHRISTIAN****6-1 200 QB/**

2017: 2nd Team All-CSFL. Completed 237 passes in 377 attempts for 62.9% rate. Had 29/6 TD-INT ratio. Passed for 2738 yards while rushing for 216 yds, a 3.3 average and 4 TDs.

NICK FERRER**ST. FRANCIS (IN)****6-4 225 QB/**

2017 NAIA Football Player of the Year. Has led the to back to back NAIA Football Championship titles. Ferrer is No. 2 on the NAIA career passing touchdowns list with 135 (No. 1 in the MSFA) and he is No. 4 on the NAIA career passing yardage list passing No. 4 Jon Kitna (Central Washington 1992-95). A two-time Mid-States Football Association Mideast League Player-of-the-Year in 2015 and 2017, Ferrer has led USF to 22 consecutive wins at quarterback, a USF record, and that includes the 2016 NAIA FCS Championship. He is 38-4 as the USF starting QB starting every USF game from the start of the 2015 season. Ferrer leads the MSFA in passing yards, pass completion percentage, pass efficiency, yards per game (301.9), TD passes (38), pass completions (288), passes attempted (423) and tied for fewest interceptions with four. He was a 2016 NAIA Daktronics Scholar-Athlete and a 2017 CoSIDA All-Academic Team nominee.

JACOB GILES**DAKOTA STATE****6-2 210 QB/**

2017: Chosen as the 2017 Dacotah Bank/North Star Athletic Association (NSAA) Football Offensive Player-of-the-Year. Had a monstrous season for Dakota State where he had set

numerous passing records. He finished the 2017 season by completing 243 passes in 384 attempts for a total of 3,133 yards with 39 passing touchdowns. His completions, passing yards and passing touchdowns all set the Trojan Football single-season records. Giles also rushed 65 times for 178 yards with four rushing touchdowns for DSU. He set the single-season record of 3,311 total offensive yards. Giles completed his stellar four-year career at Dakota State with career records of 664 completions, 8,736 passing yards and 91 passing touchdowns. 2016: North Star Football All-Conference First Team.

JORDAN KNOCK **GRAND VIEW**

6-3 235 QB/

2017: Heart of America Conference Offensive Player of the Year. Knock threw for 3,169 yards and 28 touchdowns, while also rushing the ball for 296 yards and 14 touchdowns.

QUINN MCQUEARY **MONTANA TECH**

6-3 200 QB/

Transfer from Montana State. 2017: Made his second appearance on the Frontier Second Team. The senior quarterback passed for 2,887 yards and had 31 total touchdowns. 2016: 2nd Team All-Frontier.

CURRY PARHAM **TABOR**

6-3 260 QB/

2017: Big QB with a strong arm and ability to run effectively. Tough to bring down. Accuracy could be improved though he protects the ball well. Moved up to 1st Team All-KCAC. Stats: 120 comp, 246 att, 5 INTs, 48.8%, 1863 yds, 18 TDs; 88 rushes, 340 yds, 3.9 avg, 10 TDs. 2016: HM All-KCAC. Has had a past ACL surgery.

SETH SUIDA **CONCORDIA (MI)**

6-2 208 QB/

2017: All-MSFA Second Team. Good arm QB who plays smart with the ball. Decent mobility. Had 132 completions in 239 attempts, for a 55.2 average and 2083 yards, 24 TDs and just 3 INTs.

TANNER TROSIN**SOUTHERN OREGON****6-0 180 QB/ATH**

2017: Was a first-team AP All-American selection, just as he'd been on the AFCA-NAIA list. The Frontier Offensive Player of the Year threw for 31 touchdowns and seven interceptions, completed 62.5 percent of his attempts and ranked second in the NAIA in passing yards (347.4) and total offense (380.5) per game. On the run, he totaled 430 yards with seven more TDs.

DILLON TURNER**DAKOTA WESLEYAN****6-1 215 QB/ATH**

2017: Named Great Plains Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year for the second-consecutive year. This marks the first time in GPAC football history that a player has won the award outright in back-to-back seasons. In 2015 he notched 2,366 passing yards, 889 rushing yards and 35 total touchdowns. He helped lead the Tigers to a 9-2 record, finishing the season ranked 14th in the NAIA, just missing the national playoffs. Turner came into his own during his junior season after recording 3,197 passing yards, 1,043 rushing yards, 47 total touchdowns, while helping the Tigers to an 8-3 overall record. He was named GPAC Offensive Player of the Year in 2016 for his efforts on the field. In his senior campaign, Turner etched his name in the DWU football record books. He finished the season with 3,400 passing yards, 926 rushing yards, 48 total touchdowns. Turner tied the GPAC record for passing touchdowns in a game with seven and owns the conference records for passing yards in a career with 10,704 yards and passing touchdowns in a career with 115. He also holds the school records for touchdowns in a season with 48, passing offense in a season with 3,400 passing yards, touchdowns in a career and passing yards in a career. Turner ranks third on the DWU all-time list in career rushing yards with 3,215 yards, and ranks first in career passing yards, single season passing yards and career total offense with 13,919 yards.

In his time at DWU, Turner played in all 44 games and started in 43 of them.
