

**TYUS          ALCORN                  Campbellville (KY)      6-2   190 WR**

All-American and MSC West Division Co-Offensive Player of the Year who finished the 2016 season with 1,095 receiving yards and 109.5 receiving yards per game, which led the Mid-South Conference in both categories. Alcorn also led the Mid-South with 6.6 receptions per game this season. At the NAIA level, Alcorn ranked fifth in receiving yards, sixth in receiving yards per game and receptions per game.

**CHAD          BENNETT                  Sterling (KS)              6-2   190 WR**

Was named All-KCAC Honorable Mention at Wide Receiver. Bennett was a threat down the field, putting pressure on the defense, coming up with big plays in games. He finished with 27 receptions for 352 yards, bringing in four touchdowns for the Warriors.

**DILLON          BRITT                          Central Methodist        6-1   195 WR**

All-Conference Honorable Mention. 2016 Stats: 26rec, 425 yds, 16.3 avg, 4 TDs.

**TJ                  BROWN                          Sterling (KS)              6-0   170 WR KR**

All-American led the nation in receptions (95), receiving yards (1,585), receiving yards per game (144.1), all-purpose yards (2,535) and all-purpose yards per game (230.5). TJ Brown had the second highest receiving yards in a game (287) of all-time for a receiver in the KCAC. A threat all over the field, Brown proved to be a weapon on offense for the Warriors, allowing Sterling to have another exciting and explosive season. Brown was a unanimous All-KCAC First Team selection this season for the Warriors. He also was fifth in the nation in scoring with 138 points.

**SETH          COATE                          St. Francis (IN)        6-3   215 WR**

Repeat 1st team All-MSFS, tied for the 2016 MSFA lead in TD receptions with 14 while catching at least one TD pass in 23 consecutive games over his last three seasons. He is 13th on the MSFA career reception yardage list with 2,853. His 1,043 yards receiving is No. 3 in the MSFA. 2015 (Jr.): All-MSFA First Team, MSFA All-Academic, finished NAIA #3 with 1,225 receiving yards, #6 102.1 rec. yds per game, #7 in total scoring 108 pts (18 TDs, also led USF), #9 scoring per game (9.0) led MSFA in TD receptions with 18, led MSFA in average yards per reception at 21.1 yards, No. 2 in MSFA in reception yardage with 1,225, averaged 102.1 receiving yards per game, No. 3 in MSFA, No. 2 in MSFA scoring average (9.0 ppg) and No. 3 in MSFA with USF-leading 108 points.

**BRAD          CONNOR                          St. Ambrose (IA)        5-9   185 WR**

One of only four three-time first-team all-conference selections for the Bees. Became the program's all-time leading receiver this season, finishing his SAU career with school records of 3,853 receiving yards and 34 touchdown catches. He caught 54 passes for 1,137 yards and seven touchdowns in 2016. His 1,137 yards are third most in a single season by a Bee receiver in program history. Connor among the national leaders in both receiving yards (fifth at 113.7 yards per game) and receptions (17th at 5.4 catches per game).

**LaRYAN FLETCHER** *Waldorf* **6-3 180 WR**

Earned all-conference honorable mention recognition, finished second among Waldorf's receiving corps, turning in 363 yards and a team-high five touchdowns. Led the Warriors with 37 receptions while averaging 36.3 yards per game and 9.8 yards a catch.

**NATHAN FRAME** *Sterling (KS)* **6-3 190 WR**

Was named All-KCAC First Team as a Wide Receiver. As a big target in the middle of the field, Frame caught 52 passes this year for 881 yards, averaging 16.9 yards per catch and finishing with 10 touchdowns, creating a tough matchup for opposing defenses.

**MICHAEL GREEN** *Cumberland (TN)* **5-10 165 WR**

Despite missing two contests, Green ended the year with 1,366 all-purpose yards, ranking third in the conference and 24th nationally. Posted five games with 100-plus receiving yards, including 147 against Campbellsville University, 143 at Georgetown College and 134 versus the University of the Cumberlands. He ended the season with 39 receptions for 840 yards and six touchdowns.

**CHRISTIAN HAACK** *Benedictine (KS)* **6-0 181 WR**

Four-time All-Heart receiver wrapped up a remarkable career at Benedictine as the Ravens all-time leader in receiving yards. Haack recorded 943 yards off 47 catches this season to add to his all-time lead leaving Benedictine with 3,545 yards

**JOHN HAARMANN** *Culver-Stockton* **6-4 190 WR**

2nd Team All-Heart. Led the Wildcats with eight receiving touchdowns. He caught 47 passes for 649 yards, averaging 59 yards per game and 13.8 yards per catch. His 47 receptions were tied for 10th in the Heart, while his 59 yard receiving per game was 14th in the league.

**KRISHAWN HOGAN** *Marian* **6-4 210 WR**

Ranked among the top three nationally in seven offensive categories, including leading the nation in receiving yards per game (130.3), total receptions (101) and total receiving yards (1,824). A 2015 AFCA-NAIA First Team All-American, Hogan also made his mark in the playoffs, scoring 16 touchdowns – 12 of which came on the ground – to lead his team to the national championship.

**KEENAN HONORE** *Central Methodist* **5-9 165 WR**

All-Conference 2nd Team Offense. Honore finished the season with 35 receptions for a team high 804 yards and eight touchdowns.

**DENTTON HUDSPETH Sterling (KS) 5-10 200 WR ATH**

Was named All-KCAC First Team as a Utility Player. Hudspeth continued his versatile game play, creating many opportunities on offense for the Warriors. Hudspeth finished with 120 passing yards and two touchdowns, while also adding 29 catches for 291 yards and four touchdowns. He also added 89 rushing yards and two touchdowns on the season for the Warriors.

**ANTHONY JACKSON Bethany 5-11 180 WR**

Had 41 receptions for 497 yards in 10 games of work. He got into the end zone four times throughout the year. Averaged 12.1 yards per catch and 45.2 yards per game. Jackson showed his best performance in his senior campaign in the team's loss at Sterling. Here he had five catches for 73 yards.

**QUANZEE JOHNSON Baker 5-9 187 WR RS**

Transfer from NW Missouri. First Team All-Conference. Had an incredible 85 receptions for 1134 yards and 14 TDs (just two short of the team record) and a 13.3 avg/rec. Also average 24.8 yds on 12 KORs.

**AKEIM KELSAW St. Francis (IN) 6-0 200 WR**

2015 (Sr.): Medical redshirt. 2014 (Jr.): 16th Cougar with 1,000 or more career yards receiving with 33 yds, 7th Cougar with 120 or more career receptions . 2014 All-MSFA Honorable Mention. 2016 Stats: 39 rec, 452 yds, 11.59 avg, 6 TDs.

**KHARI KIMBROUGH Mayville 6-4 190 WR**

Nice tall receiver who is very good in the red zone. Very good athlete. 2016 Stats: 9 games, 42 rec, 540 yds, 12.9 avg, 8 TDs.

**MITCH KLEIN Doane 6-1 186 WR**

All-GPAC Honorable Mention (Wide Receiver) and a NAIA Scholar Athlete. 2016 Stats: 21 rec, 303 yds, 14.4 avg, 5 TDs.

**MITCH KUF AHL Kansas Wesleyan 6-1 202 WR H-Back**

A repeat first-team All-KCAC selection from 2015. As an under-sized TE, he caught 27 balls this season for 484 yards and six touchdowns. He averaged 17.9 yards per catch and 48.4 yards per game for the Coyotes. He ranked ninth in the conference in receiving yards per game and 12th in total receiving yards. His six touchdowns and two PAT catches earned him 40 points on the season which ranked 18th in the conference in touchdown scoring. His 1668 career receiving yards ranks him third all-time in school history.

**DAN LADD St. Xavier 6-2 180 WR**

Former QB who has carried the ball out of the backfield, threw as a QB, and lined-up as WR. 2016 Stats: 43 rec, 527 yds, 12.3 avg, 6 TDs.

**KODI LARSON Dakota Wesleyan 6-0 195 WR**

Finishes his four-year career with 106 receptions, 1,226 yards and nine touchdowns. In 2016 in only 7 games had 34 rec for 487 yards, a 14.3 average/rec and 6 TDs.

**MATT LICKFOLD** *Montana Western* 6-4 240 WR TE

All-Frontier. Made the position switch from wide receiver in the spring of 2015. It proved to be a great fit as Matt was second on the team in receptions in 2015 with 27 and reeled in five touchdowns. Had 133 receptions in his career. 2016 Stats: 41 rec, 490 yds, 12.0 avg, 4 TDs.

**DUSTIN LIVINGSTON** *Dakota Wesleyan* 6-1 190 WR RS

Named to the GPAC First Team Special Teams for his efforts this season. Tallied 1,347 all-purpose yards, 225 on PR with a TD and 130 on KR, while hauling in 984 receiving yards to go along with 14 total touchdowns. Livingston was also named to the GPAC Second Team, helping a DWU offense tally 433 total points, breaking the previous record of 329 set in 2013. Livingston and the Tigers also recorded 39.4 points per game, surpassing the previous record of 31.9 set in 1992. The senior tallied 52 receptions and 984 yards in 10 games.

**ROB LOCKHART** *Faulkner* 6-1 185 WR

Three-time all-conference recipient Lockhart spearheaded the Faulkner receiving corps with 814 yards on 55 receptions this season. Ranked third in the league in receptions per game (5.5), reception yards per game (81.4) and total reception yards this season. Lockhart also ranked in the top 30 nationally in all three categories.

**COLBY LUM** *Valley City State* 5-7 170 WR RS

Second team all-conference (2015, 2016). 40 receptions for 640 yards and 3 TD's, 6 punt returns for 41 yards, 9 kick returns for 203 yards, NSAA Offensive Player of the Week Oct. 24.

**MONTAY McDOWELL** *St. Francis (IN)* 6-2 198 WR

All-MSFA. Really came on in senior season. Showed self to be a legitimate deep threat. 2016 Stats: 35 rec, 730 yds, 20.86 avg, 7 TDs.

**FRED MOORE, III** *Culver-Stockton* 6-4 200 WR TE

2nd Team All-Heart as an under-sized TE. totaled 60 receptions for 786 yards and six touchdowns this season. He averaged 71.5 yards per game and 13.1 yards per catch. In the NAIA, Moore ranked 14th in total receptions and receptions per game.

**ISAIAH MOSHER** *St. Ambrose (IA)* 6-3 205 WR

2nd Team All-MSFA caught 20 passes for 477 yards, an average of 23.9 yards per catch, and five touchdowns.

**NATE NICHOLSON** *Benedictine (KS)* 6-4 220 WR

Great target WR who appeared in only 8 games in 2016. Had 20 rec for 278 yards, a 13.9 average and 3 TDs.

**LUKE OLDHAM** *Avila* 6-2 190 WR TE

2nd Team All-Heart of America. Undersized tight end and four year starter for the Eagles, finished the season with 36 catches for 399 yards and a touchdown on the season, and is Avila's all-time leader for receptions (125), yards (1,257) and touchdowns (8) from the tight end position.

**VAN PARKER** *William Penn* **5-10 180 WR ATH**

Was chosen as an athlete for his first-ever All-Heart laurel. The senior started the year in a battle for the quarterback slot, then moved to wide receiver before finally concluding the season as WPU's starting signal-caller. He rushed for 511 yards and two touchdowns, completed 11 of 28 passes for 171 yards and two scores, and caught three balls for 106 yards.

**TERRANCE POLK, III** *Ottawa (KS)* **6-0 180 WR**

Was named unanimous First Team All-KCAC. This is his second straight first team selection. Polk finished with 49 receptions for 699 yards and nine touchdowns. He averaged 14.3 yards per catch and averaged 99.9 receiving yards per game. Polk is ranked 30th in the NAIA in total receptions (49), 33rd in total kickoff return yards (437), 36th in all-purpose yards (1,149), 41st in total receiving yards (699), and 43rd in total points scored (42).

**MATT RETZLAFF** *Southern Oregon* **5-10 190 WR RS**

All-American. Named a Frontier Conference all-star for the fourth year in a row, set SOU career records for receptions (247), receiving yards (3,373) and receiving touchdowns (40). He missed two games in 2016 – a fact that likely kept him off the first team – but still put together his most prolific season statistically with 81 catches for 1,058 yards and 13 touchdowns in nine outings. He scored at least one touchdown in every game, went for 100-plus yards five times and ranked first in the NAIA in catches per game (nine) and fourth in receiving yards per game (117.6). 2015: Voted onto the All-Frontier's first team as a receiver and second team as a punt returner, marking his third straight all-conference campaign.

**TREY ROWE** *Wayland Baptist* **5-10 160 WR**

Was voted to the CSFL first team this year after making the second team a year ago. Rowe leaves as the Pioneers' career leader in receptions (113), receiving yards (1,966) and receiving touchdowns (21), while also holding records for most catches (43), receiving yards (736) and TDs (10) in a season.

**STEPHEN SIMMS** *St. Xavier* **5-8 175 WR**

2016: All-MSFA Midwest League First Team wide receiver & return specialist.  
2015: MSFA All-Academic Team, AFCA-NAIA Coaches All-American First Team, MSFA Midwest League Offensive Player of the Year, All-MSFA Midwest League First Team wide receiver & return specialist. 2013 & 2014: All-MSFA Midwest League Second Team. 2016 Stats: 50 rec, 720 yds, 14.4 avg, 9 TDs; 18 PR, 243 yds, 13.5 avg, TD, 73 LONG, 27 KR, 664 yds, 24.6 avg.

**DONOVAN SMITH** *Arizona Christian* **6-1 190 WR**

Transfer from Southern Mississippi. Team's leading receiver. Led team in reception despite missing one game. 2016 Stats: 44 rec, 505 yds, 11.5 avg, 4 TDs.

**JACOB TATGE** *Kansas Wesleyan* **5-10 175 WR**

Led the Coyotes with 44 receptions for 671 yards on the season. He had four touchdowns while averaging a team best 61 receiving yards per game and averaged 15.3 yards per reception. He was sixth in the conference in total receiving yards and fifth in total receptions.

**BRUCE THOMPSON** *Langston* **6-3 190 WR**

2nd team All-CSFL led the Langston receiving core with 28 receptions for 311 yards and one touchdown.

**JASON VANDER KOOI** *Morningside* **6-3 205 WR**

All-GPAC wide receiver was the Mustangs' leading pass receiver with 43 receptions for 692 yards and four touchdowns for an average of 16.1 yards per catch.

**QUINCY WALDEN** *Bethel (TN)* **5-7 170 WR RS**

All-American was No. 1 in the nation in punt return yards per game at 31.4. He was No. 2 in kick-off return yards for the season at 906. Walden was No. 2 in all-purpose yards per game at 209.6. He returned three punt returns for touchdowns and had a kick-off return for a score. He had four touchdown receptions and a rushing score giving him nine touchdowns on the season.

**DeSEAN WARREN** *Lindenwood* **5-11 170 WR**

Honorable mention all-MIAA finished the season with 31 receptions for 831 receiving yards and five touchdowns. Averaged an incredible 26.8 yds/rec.

**ADAM WEILAND** *Central Methodist* **6-1 210 WR**

Named to the All-Conference Honorable Mention despite first team stats. 2016 Stats: 41 rec, 786 yds, 19.2 avg, 9 TDs.

**CJ WHITAKER** *Ottawa (KS)* **5-10 165 WR**

Was named Honorable Mention All-KCAC. He had 42 receptions for 546 yards and four touchdowns. Whittaker averaged 13 yards per reception and 49.6 receiving yards per game.

**TREY WHITE** *Marian* **6-0 190 WR**

Earned First Team All-MSFA honors after catching 37 balls for 720 yards and 11 touchdowns. White averaged 19.5 yards per catch.

**MICHAEL WHITEHEAD** *Morningside* **5-11 190 WR**

All-GPAC Second Team has 38 pass receptions for 587 yards and eight touchdowns for an average of 15.4 yards per catch.

**COREY WINDLE** *Trinity International* **6-4 219 WR**

Started every game for three years. Named to the All-MSFA Team for the second time. 2016 Stats: 46 rec, 506 yds, 11.0 avg, 12 TDs.
