HAYDEN ADAMS

DAKOTA WESLEYAN

6-1 190 WR/

2017: A year after being named All-GPAC Second Team had a season to remember. Adams finished the season with 81 receptions, 1,472 receiving yards and 18 touchdowns. He finished the regular season ranked first in the NAIA in receiving yards per game with 133.8 yards and total receiving yards. He also ranks second nationally in total receptions and fourth in receptions per game with 7.4 receptions per game. He holds the DWU football records for receiving yards and receptions in a game with 254 yards on 18 catches against Doane University on Sept. 16. Adams also broke school records for receiving yards in a season, receptions in a season and career receiving yards with 3,243 yards. He ranks second in DWU history in career receptions with 213 and in scoring with 258 points.

THEO BERRY

AVILA

5-11 180 WR/

2017: 2nd Team all-conference. Proved to be one of Avila's most explosive offensive threats during the 2017 season, hauling in 61 receptions for 756 yards in just nine games for the Eagles. He finished the season with seven touchdown receptions, which tied him for the most in a single season in program history. Berry topped 100 yards three times this past season, and finished in the top fifteen in the country in total receptions and receptions per game.

ST. FRANCIS (IN)

5-8 185 WR/

2017: 1st Team All-MSFA MEL. Tied for team lead in receptions with 73. Gained 1014 yds for a 13.89 yds/rec average and 6 TDs. 2016 & 2017 NAIA National Champion.

MATT BOUDREAUX

SOUTHERN OREGON

6-2 180 WR/

2017: 2nd Team All-Frontier. Had 36 catches for 698 yards and four TDs.

ALEX BRAMMER

GRAND VIEW

6-2 185 WR/

2017: 1st-Team All-Heart. Had second consecutive 1000+ receiving yards season with 53 receptions for 1141 yards, a 21.5 yds/rec average and 10 TDs.

CLARENCE CLARK

BAKER

5-10 185 WR/PK

Two-time All-American; once as a kicker and once as a WR; became the first player in AFCA All-America Team history at all levels to repeat as an AFCA All-American at two different positions. He was named to the 2015 squad as a receiver, then earned 2016 honors as a place-kicker. Multiple All-Heart at both positions. Is the NAIA's all-time leading scorer and will go down as the Wildcats top receiver in school history, as he leads the program all-time in receptions (247), receiving yards (4180) and receiving TD's (44). Also had 48 field goals and 2 rushing TDs. 2017: 62 rec, 1135 yds, 10 TDs, 18.3 yds/rec. Also was 56/59 on PATs and 9/13 on FGs.

CALVIN CONNORS

EASTERN OREGON

5-9 180 WR/RS

2017: 2nd Team All-Frontier Conference. Ranked second on the team in receptions (41), receiving yards (572) and receiving touchdowns (3). He averaged 57.2 yards per game receiving and led the team with 108.5 all-purpose yards per game. Connors had 20 kick returns for 383 yards and returned 14 of the team's 16 punts for an average of 5.3 yards. 2015, 2016 All-Conference as a WR and RS.

JACOB COUGHLIN**PERU STATE****6-2 185 WR/RS**

2017: Second-straight year of being named to the All-Heart first team. Had 26 receptions for 495 yards, 19.0 yds/rec and 6 TDs.

MIKEY DAVIS**LINDSEY-WILSON****6-3 205 WR/**

2017: MSC Bluegrass First Team as undersized TE. Caught 23 passes for 364 yards and six touchdowns during the regular season, averaging 15.8 yards per catch

MONTERO DUBOSE**BETHEL (KS)****5-10 175 WR/RS**

2017: Received honorable mention All-KCAC status. Finished with 440 receiving yards on 36 receptions and 2 TDs. Suffered from subpar passing game.

CHARLES DUCKWORTH**POINT****5-11 200 WR/**

2017: AFCA NAIA All-America Second Team as an all-purpose player, playing wide receiver and returning kick-offs. Received the Craig Mullins Mid-South Conference Appalachian Division Offensive Player of the Year Award. He also received All-MSA Appalachian Division first team honors as both a wide receiver and a kick return specialist. Ducksworth finished with 44 receptions for 998 yards and 10 touchdowns and led the Mid-South Conference in receiving yards. He also ranked 17th in the NAIA national statistics with 90.7 receiving yards per game. He also was a threat as a kick returner and ran back three kickoffs for touchdown this year and four kick-offs for scores in his two-year career at Point. He totaled 724 yards on 24 kick-off returns (30.2 yards per return) during the 2017 season and totaled 821 kick-off return yards with four touchdowns in two seasons. His 13 total touchdowns in 2017 was good for second place in the MSC and his 1,785 all-purpose yards ranked number one in the conference and number three in the NAIA.

Ducksworth holds Point's career records for all-purpose yards (2716); kick-off returns for touchdowns (4); receptions (88); receiving yards (1815); receiving touchdowns (24); receptions per game (4.0); receiving yards per game (82.5); and receiving yards per catch (20.6) in 22 games played in 2015 and 2017. He also set Point's single-season records

during the 2017 season in all-purpose yards (1785); kick-off returns for touchdowns (3); receiving yards (998); receiving yards per catch (22.7); and receiving yards per game (90.7), and tied his own school record for receptions in a season with 44, the same mark he recorded in 2015.

ARIZONA CHRISTIAN

6-4 207 WR/SLOT

2017: Moved the chains from the slot. Had 31 recpetons for 338 yards, a 10.9 yds/rec and 2 TDs. 2016: HM All-CSFL

GRAYLAND DUNNAMMS

BACONE

5-11 190 WR/

2017: Earned 1st team All-CSFL as top receiver on a 2-9 team. Had 51 receptions, for 640 yards, a 12.5 yds/rec and 4 TDs.

CHASE FERGER

ST. AMBROSE

5-11 180 WR/

2017: All-MSFA second team. Hauled in 24 passes for a team-leading 495 yards and six touchdowns after receiving all-conference honorable mention last season. 2016: HM All-MSFA.

JARED GARCIA

CONCORDIA (NEB)

6-3 200 WR/

The most accomplished receiver in program history. Over his four seasons as a Bulldog, Garcia hauled in 161 receptions for 2,495 yards and 35 touchdowns. His yardage and touchdown totals represent all-time school records while his reception total placed him at No. 2 in the record book. As a senior, Garcia reeled in 21 passes for 307 yards and six touchdowns over five games. Garcia notched two first team All-GPAC awards and two second team All-GPAC honors throughout his career, which included eight games with 100 or more receiving yards. His 11 touchdown receptions as a freshman remain a program single-season record.

LAQVIONTE GONZALEZ**SOUTHEASTERN****5-11 175 WR/RS**

2017: NAIA All-America First Team, Gonzalez rewrote the SEU receiving record books in his lone season with the Fire. In eight games, Gonzalez had 60 catches for 1,018 yards and 10 touchdowns. His 127.3 yards per game ranked second in the NAIA this season.

Additionally, Gonzalez Averaged 7.5 catches per game, which was fourth nationally. JUNIOR (2016): Played in all 12 games at Kansas. Second on the team in receptions and yards with 62 catches for 729 yards and three touchdowns. Returned a kickoff for a touchdown vs. Ohio. Had 131 yards on eight catches vs. TCU. SOPHOMORE (2014): Played in eight games at Texas A&M. Had eight catches for 77 yards. FRESHMAN (2013): Played in all 13 games at Texas A&M, helping the Aggies to a 9-4 season. Made 21 catches for 240 yards. Scored a touchdown against Vanderbilt. Dismissed from Kansas for an undisclosed violation of team rules. Was Jayhawks #2 receiver. Gonzalez was the ninth player from Texas A&M's 2013 recruiting class to leave that team for one reason or another

BRAD HARGIS**TRINITY INTERNATIONAL****6-3 196 WR/**

2017: Just a solid, reliable receiver with good height and route-running skill. Solid year after year. Had 30 rec, 475 yards, 15.8 avg, 4 TDs.

DEVONTE HAYDEN**WAYLAND BAPTIST****6-0 180 WR/RS**

2017: All-CFL as a returner. Ranked third in the NAIA in kickoff yards per attempt at 32.4. Also a receiver, Hayden led the team in catches with 33 and receiving yards with 571 to average 17.3 yards per catch.

TRE HOBBS**DAKOTA WESLEYAN****5-11 180 WR/**

Transfer from Concord University. Committed to the next level. Appeared in four different senior bowl games in Florida and South Carolina. Hobbs attended the American vs. Europe Bowl on Friday in Myrtle Beach, S.C., the Tyrant Bowl in Miami, Fla., the NCAA DII vs. NAIA Bowl in Myrtle Beach and the Globe Bowl. During his senior season, Hobbs played in five games, hauling in 16 catches for 262 yards and three touchdowns.

BRYANT HUDSON **CONCORDIA (MI)**

6-0 190 WR/

2017: All-MSFA 1st Team. Two-year starter who caught 23 balls for 363 yards, a 15.8 yds/rec and 5 TDs in 2017. 2016: All-MSFA Second Team.

LEXUS JACKSON **ST. FRANCIS (IL)**

6-0 175 WR/

2017: Jackson is 24 years old. Was named a finalist for the NAIA Football National Player of the Year. USF's leading receiver was also the Mid-States Football Association Midwest League Offensive Player of the Year and a first-team all-league selection at both wide receiver and kick returner. During the season, he earned a pair of MSFA Midwest League player of the week awards, one on offense and another on special teams. Jackson led the Saints and the MSFA Midwest League with 12 total regular season touchdowns (nine receiving, two rushing, one punt return), while also pacing St. Francis in receptions (37) and receiving yards (672). On October 7, he made SportsCenter's "Small Schools Big Plays" segment after weaving through defenders for a 75-yard touchdown run. Jackson wrapped up his time as a Saint with program records in career receiving yards (2,201) and reception touchdowns (22). 2016: MSFA All-Midwest League 2nd Team

TRISTAN JEFFRIES **ROBERT MORRIS**

6-0 207 WR/

2017: Earned Second Team honors after leading RMU in receiving this season, making 36 catches for 520 yards and five touchdowns. 2016: All-MSFA Midwest League 2nd Team.

JAKARI JOHNSON **MISSOURI VALLEY**

6-0 203 WR/

2017: Heart of America Athletic Conference All-Southern Division 1st Team. A second team selection in 2015, set a program record with total receptions (78), and led the team in yards receiving (1209), reception touchdowns (8) and all-purpose yards (1467), while finishing third in points scored (54). He ranked third in the Heart in receptions per game (7.1), second in total receptions, second in total receiving yards, second in all-purpose yards and No. 12 in scoring. Johnson also finished the season ranked third in the NAIA in receiving

yards, fourth in receptions, sixth in receiving yards per game (109.9) and ninth in receptions per game. Was named to the all-division second team as a punt returner, after finishing the season with a team-high 187 punt return yards and one punt return for a touchdown. He finished fourth in the Heart and ninth in the NAIA in punt return yardage.

5-10 192 WR/RS

2017: Second Team All-GPAC. Klein led the Tigers with 51 receptions for 570 yards and five touchdowns. 2016: First Team All-GPAC (SLOT), Second Team All-GPAC (Kick Return); 2015:

2017: All-MSFA 1st Team. Three-year starter who caught 26 balls for 560 yards, a stunning 21.5 yds/rec and 7 TDs in 2017. 2016: All-MSFA Second Team.

AUSTIN OPDAHL

DAKOTA STATE

6-1 185 WR/

2017: Had another monstrous season for Dakota State, breaking a new single-season record of 1,121 receiving yards in 2017. Owns the DSU single-game record of 333 receiving yards in Trojans' victory over long-time rival Dakota Wesleyan (S.D.). He caught 14 touchdowns this season, extending his school record with 42 touchdown receptions. He ranks eight in the NAIA in receiving yards per game (101.9), total receptions (72) and total receiving

yards. Opdahl scored a total of 90 points this season for the Trojans. He finished his career with 204 receptions with 3,202 receiving yards. It was the third consecutive year that Opdahl was listed on the NSAA Football All-Conference, his second straight year being honored as First-Team selection. 2016: North Star Athletic Association Football Offensive Player-of-the-Year; AFCA-NAIA Football All-American Second Team.

2017: 2nd Team All-CSFL. Teams reception leader with 41. Gained 482 yards for an 11.8 yds/rec average and 5 TDs. 2016: 1st Team All-CSFL. Transfer from Henderson State.

6-4 210 WR/ATH

Transfer from Eastern Michigan. 2017: Was named as the second team All-Heart athlete for his efforts at quarterback and receiver this season. He threw for 297 yards, rushed for 125 yards and 77 yards receiving and accounted for a total of seven touchdowns.

MONTANA WESTERN

6-3 230 WR/P

2017: All-Frontier Second Team as a WR and a punter. Had 731 yards receiving on 38 receptions for a 19.24 avg/rec and 2 touchdowns. He also had over 2000 yards punting with a long of 76 yards. He was ranked 39th in the nation in total receiving yards and 13th in punt yards per attempt (39.6).

2017: Heart of America Athletic Conference All-Southern Division 1st Team. A three-time selection to the all-division first team, was second on the team in receptions (31), second in receiving yards (522), second in receiving touchdowns (5), fourth in points scored (30) and fourth in all-purpose yards (553).

MARK STRBJAK**ST. XAVIER****6-3 215 WR/RB**

Versatile former QB who has lined up at RB & WR. Transfer from Northern Illinois. 2017 Stats: 36 rec, 398 yards, 11.1 avg, 4 TDs; 10 carries, 31 yards, 3.1 avg, TD; 5 attempts, 7 completions, 71.4%, 29 yards. Earned All-MSFA Honorable Mention honors.

ZERRICK WILLIS**CAMBELLSVILLE****5-11 170 WR/**

2017: All-NCCAA First Team. First Team All Mid-South Conference Bluegrass Division. Finished second on the team with 50 receptions and 794 receiving yards. He caught a total of six touchdown passes, while averaging 79.4 receiving yards per game. Willis was also named the NCCAA Victory Bowl Most Outstanding Offensive Player.

ANTONIO WILSON**BACONE****5-10 180 WR/**

2017: Earned honorable mention All-CSFL. Led team in receiving yards (642) and receiving TDs (7) despite having 19 fewer receptions. Averaged 20.1 yds/rec.

MIKE WIMBERLY**BETHANY (KS)****5-9 185 WR/**

2017: 1st team all-KCAC at WR and Second team all-KCAC as a PR; Team's leading receiver with 38 receptions, 555 yards, a 14.6 average and 7 TDs. 2016 Second team all-KCAC.

All-CSFL as both a wide receiver and kick returner in 2016, 2015. Owns the school record for all-purpose yards.
