2019: First Team All-MSFA Midwest. Anderson kept his consecutive streak of first-team selections alive by being named to the first team as a punter. Over his career, Anderson has been named a First Team All-MSFA kicker (2017) and punter (2018). He has also been named a Second Team All-MSFA kicker (2018). In 2019, Anderson became the Tigers all-time leader in punting. Over his career, Anderson has punted 166 times for 6,131 yards, good for a 36.9 yard average. 2018:MSFA Midwest All-League First Team Punter, MSFA Midwest All-League Second Team Kicker. 2017: MSFA Midwest All-League First Team Kicker.

2019: Bohn ended his season ranked second in the NAIA by averaging 43.8 yards per punt on 32 attempts. That included 10 punts of 50-plus yards and 12 that ended inside the opponents 20-yardline. Was the Sooner Athletic Conference Special Teams Player of the Year. Bohn is a two-time AFCA-NAIA All-America selection – the only player in team history to achieve that honor – and he was also named First Team All-NCCAA each of the past two seasons.

2019: AFCA NAIA Coaches' All-America Team. Higgins was chosen as a first team All-American, and finished his senior season as the NAIA leader in yards per punt average, at 45.1 yards per punt. He also broke the school's record for punting average in a season. Higgins had a season-long punt of 71 yards, and finished with 12 punts downed inside the opponent's 20 yard line. This is the second-straight year that Higgins has earned first team All-American honors from the AFCA. Higgins was selected to the All-South Division First Team for the third time in his career. 2018: AFCA NAIA Coaches' All-America 1st Team, Heart Southern All-Division 1st Team.

2019: Recorded 46 punts on the season and averaged 133.2 punt yards per game to garner All-America honors. McMillin pinned opponents inside the 20-yard line 11 times, including recording a 44-yard punt against Bethel to give the Wildcats the ball on the one-yard line which led to a Patriots defensive touchdown. The senior saved the longest punt of his career, a 69-yarder, in the second quarter against Keiser in the opening round of the NAIA Championship Series. For his career, McMillin tallied 144 punts for 5,378 yards and averaged 37.3 yards per punt. The dual-sport athlete also handled UC's kicking duties as he went 14-21 on field goals and 117-125 on PATs in his career. McMillin also etched his way into the NAIA record book after converted 14-14 on PATs in the Patriots 98-0 win over Union.

Named a first-team All-Frontier Conference and first-team AFCA NAIA and AP All-American.
