Feauto was named All-America by the Associated Press and American Football Coaches Association/NAIA following the 2019 season. 2018 Offensive Player of the Year, was named the 2019 KCAC Player of the Year. In 10 conference games, Feauto threw for 3335 yards and 38 touchdowns while completing 64.3 percent of his passes, averaging 333.5 yards per game. He led the KCAC in total offense by nearly 100 yards per game, and also led the KCAC in passing, pass efficiency and passing touchdowns. He finished the season with 4089 yards passing, the first KWU quarterback to throw for over 4000 yards in a season, and tossed 49 touchdown passes, averaging 314.5 yards passing per game. He threw for 7,362 yards and 90 touchdowns, and rushed for 900 yards and nine TDs during his two seasons as the Coyotes compiled 25-2 record.

2019: Mayo Clinic Comeback Player of the Year Honorable Mention. Martinez lost the second half of his junior season to a torn ACL in 2018, but following surgery and an off-season of physical therapy, was back for his senior year. Midwest League Offensive Player of the Year honors. The senior led No. 9 Saint Xavier to a third-consecutive Midwest League Championship, as the Cougars (8-2) completed a perfect conference season for the third year in a row. Martinez finished the regular season ranked 2nd in the NAIA, averaging 322.0 passing yards per game, and collected 33 passing TDs with 3,220 yards throughout the year.

2019: Earned First Team All-KCAC as a punter and was named Honorable Mention All-KCAC as a quarterback. He earned KCAC Offensive Player of the Week and NAIA Offensive Player of the Week honors once this past season. As a punter, Kaegi had 55 punts for 2,192 yards, averaging 39.9 yards per punt. He had a punt of 66 yards, eight touch backs, five fair caught, 17 inside the 20, and eight punts for 50 or more yards. As a quarterback, Kaegi had a passing efficiency of 126.81, went 248-for-427 through the air, completed 58.1 percent of his passes, threw for 2,639 yards, averaged 263.9 yards passing per game, and threw 26 touchdowns. He rushed for 68 yards on 104 attempts and scored three touchdowns. Kaegi is ranked 10th in the NAIA in passing yards per game (263.9), 10th in total passing yards (2,639), 11th in total offensive yards (2,707), 13th in total offensive yards per game (270.7), 13th in punting yards per attempt (39.9), and 37th in passing efficiency (126.8). 2018: KCAC Second Team.
