He led the Trojans with 13 kick-off returns for a total of 302 yards (23.2 yards average). Frederiksen ranks first in the NAIA in all-purpose yards (1,772 yards), fifth in total scoring (102 points), eighth in total rushing, 10th in rushing yards per game (115.5 yards) and 28th in kick-off return yards per attempt. He finished as the all-time rushing leader at Dakota State, racking up a total of 3,487 rushing yards. 2018: NAIA Football All-America Honorable Mention, First-Team All-Conference.

He led the nation in all-purpose yards this season, racking up 210 total yards per game. He also led the NAIA in rushing yards per game (150). Despite missing two games to injury, Quinones racked up 1198 rushing yards, 12 touchdowns and 1678 all-purpose yards during the 2019 campaign – helping VCSU to a 7-3 overall record. Quinones was named Honorable Mention NAIA All-American by the American Football Coaches' Association. He was also named First Team All-Conference as a running back and Second Team All-Conference as a kick returner. He achieved All-Conference as both a running back and returner in his sophomore, junior and senior seasons. Quinones also broke the VCSU career rushing record this season and tied the school record for rushing touchdowns, finishing his Viking career with 3530 rushing yards and 36 rushing touchdowns.

Eclipsed the 100 yard mark in a game eight times. Rushed for a single-game Marian record 309 yards Oct. 19 vs. Concordia, which included a touchdown. Scored at least one touchdown in nine games. Scored multiple touchdowns in seven games, including three games with three.

Also named the SAC Offensive Player of the Year and SAC All-Conference first team and ranks second in the NAIA in scoring per game (12.5 points), fourth in scoring (125 points) and sixth in rushing yards (1,301) and average rushing yards (130.1 a game). Whitfield completed a record-setting season, establishing Langston marks for single-season rushing yardage, single-season rushing touchdowns (20) and career touchdowns (33). Whitfield surpassed 100 yards rushing six times, 150 yards on the ground in four outings and 200 yards twice this year. He ran for a season-high 230 yards and four touchdowns on 19 carries Oct. 5 against Lyon in Batesville, Ark. He added four rushing touchdowns against Wayland Baptist on Nov. 16 in Plainview, Texas. Whitfield picked up three SAC offensive player of the week nods in 2019. Whitfield owns 2,159 yards rushing in his Langston career.
