Second consecutive selection to the Academic All-Patriot League squad. Albershardt started all 11 games at defensive end for the Leopards in 2016, making 33 tackles with 3.5 tackles for loss. An Economics major, Albershardt holds a 3.61 cumulative GPA and was a team captain.

**Brad Ambrosius North Dakota State 6-4 250 DE**

Really deserved some post-season accolades. An ever-improving, coachable player who makes big plays. Stats: 40 TT, 10 TFL, 6.5 Sacks, 3 PBU, FF

**Siupeli Anau Northern Arizona 6-3 250 DE OLB**

1st All Big Sky, 3rd Stats FCS All American. Led the Big Sky in sacks (8.5) and was second in league in tackles for loss with 15 at the end of the regular season. Anau registered 55 total tackles for NAU, including 30 solo stops. He recorded three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery to complete his senior campaign with the Lumberjacks. 2016 Stats: 54 TT, 4 QBH, 15 TFL, 8.5 Sacks, 3 FF, BK,

**Jared Blum South Dakota State 6-3 250 DE OLB**

**Dewayne Cameron Holy Cross 6-4 255 DE**

All-New England honors for the first time, after previously being named first team All-Patriot League in both 2015 and 2016. He started all 11 games for the Crusaders at defensive end this season, totaling seven quarterback sacks for 41 yards and 13 tackles for loss for 54 yards. Cameron also ranked fourth on the squad with 51 total tackles, in addition to recording one forced fumble and 10 quarterback hurries. He finished the season ranked third in the Patriot League in tackles for loss, fifth in sacks and 36th in total tackles. **Koby Couron Lamar 6-3 250 DE**

Played in 38 games, earning 13 starts during his career. 2016: Honorable Mention All-Southland Conference. Played in and started all 11 games. Recorded 25 tackles, including 11 solo stops. Posted two tackles for losses, including one sack. Recovered a fumble and broke up a pass on the season. Had a season-high five tackles, including three unassisted stops at Houston

**Keionta Davis** *Chattanooga* **6-4 270 DE**

A two-time All-American who led the SoCon with 10.5 sacks. The 2016 SoCon Defensive Player of the Year finished his career second all-time at UTC with 31.0 sacks. The Chattanooga native finished ninth in the voting for the Buck Buchanan Award and was invited to the prestigious Reese's Senior Bowl in January. **Michael Doman** *Portland State* **6-4 270 DE**

Was one of the most experienced players on the defense. Had a good senior season. Good pass rusher, transfer from Brigham Young University. 2016. Stats: 28 TT, 3 Sacks, 8.5 TFL, 3 QBH, 2 FF.

**Roosevelt Donaldson** *Samford* **6-2 265 DE DT**

2nd All SoCon, Spent two seasons at Western Michigan University. Has played inside and outside. 2016Stats: 57 TT, 14 TFL, 4.5 Sacks, INT, 4 QBH, 4 FF

**Mikhail DuBose** *Northern Colorado* **6-2 260 DE OLB**

2nd All Big Sky, had his hand in a little bit of everything on defense this season. He recorded 59 tackles, including 7.5 TFLs and 2.5 sacks. DuBose was also accountable for two quarterback hurries and two pass breakups. He forced a team-high two fumbles, recovering one of them, as well as blocking two kicks, in the same game. The senior blocked a punt, and returned it for a touchdown, as well as a PAT in the win over Montana, the first time in 40 seasons UNC defeated the Griz. **Samson Ebukam** *Eastern Washington* **6-3 245 DE OLB**

**Miki Fangatua** *SE Louisiana* **6-0 295 DE DT**

Became starter during junior season. Lacks height but makes up for it with good moves and strength. 2016 Stats: 35 TT, 4.5 TF, 2.5 Sacks

**Brett Field Colgate 6-4 275 DE DT**

2nd All Patriot, finished eighth on the Colgate tackle chart and posted 6½ sacks and was Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week after a three-sack game against Lafayette. 2016 Stats: 38 TT, 7.5 TFL, 5.5 Sacks, 2 PBU, BK

**Xavier Garcia Eastern Kentucky 6-3 260 DE**

Enrolled at ECU for the 2016 spring semester. Played in all 11 games and started 10 times at defensive end. Totaled 29 tackles, 4.5 tackles for a loss, 3.0 sacks, four quarterback hurries and one forced fumble, had a season-high six tackles at Tennessee Tech. Recorded sacks in two of ECU's final three games. 2016 Stats: 29 TT, 4.5 TFL, 3 Sacks, 4 QBH, FF

**Stacey Garner Alcorn State 6-4 245 DE OLB**

Good size, would be effective at covering TE and vs the run game. Stats: 42 TT, 10.5 TFL, 4 Sacks, 3 PBU, 2 FF

**Peyton Gryder William & Mary 6-2 255 DE OLB**

Team Captain. Started the first three games before missing the final eight contests with an injury. Finished the season with 10 tackles and 2.0 TFL. Posted four stops in the season opener at NC State

**Kedrick Harrison Stephen F. Austin 6-2 250 DE OLB**

Second team All-Southland Conference selection. Started all 11 games on the defensive line for the Lumberjacks. Registered 37 tackles on the year, including 21 solo tackles, 17.0 tackles for loss, 10.0 sacks and five quarterback hurries. Finished the season ranked 1st in the SLC and 7th nationally in sacks (10.5) while ranking second in the SLC and 17th nationally in tackles for loss (17.0). One of the key members of SFA's defensive line which ranked among the national leaders in both sacks and tackles for loss

**Frederick Henry-Ajudua NC Central 6-2 250 DE**

1st All MEAC, Boxtorow All American finished second in the conference with a team-best 7.5 sacks, along with 11.5 hits for a loss and 33 total tackles.

**Alex Jenkins Incarnate Word 6-6 275 DE**

DE from England, raw but shows very good potential. Coachable and loves the game. Jenkins was first noticed at the Football University (FBU) Camp at Stirling University in Scotland. At the camp, he gained a spot on the FBU All-Europe Team and was then invited to the FBU Top Gun Event in Virginia. He was the first British player to be featured on the Rivals.com website. 2016 Stats: 35 TT, 9 TFL, 3.5 Sacks, 2 PBU, FF, 2 BKs

**Ryan Johnson Montana 6-3 250 DE OLB**

3rd All Big Sky (3x) earned recognition for an outstanding senior campaign with a place on the All-Big Sky third team. Johnson posted the third-most sacks in the Big Sky this season (6) and the fourth-most tackles-for-loss with 13. He shattered his career high for tackles in his swan song against Montana State with 15, more than double his previous career high of 7, earning player of the game honors. 2016 Stats: 57 TT, 6 Sacks, 13 TFL, 3 FF

**Noah Johnson** *North Dakota* **6-2 275 DE DT**

3rd All Big Sky, For the second-consecutive year, Johnson earned third-team accolades after finishing the regular season with 30 tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss. 2016 Stats: 30 TT, 4.5 TFL, 5 QBH, FF

**Angelo Keyes** *NC A&T* **6-1 270 DE DT**

1st All MEAC, Boxtorow All American, earned his second straight first team All MEAC honor. He proved to be an excellent pass rusher this season for the Aggies. He made 38 tackles with eight tackles for loss. His six sacks ranked fifth in the MEAC. His athleticism allowed him to finish his career with 16 pass break ups. 2016 Stats: 38 TT, 8 TFL, 6 Sacks, 2 PBU, 3 QBH, FF

**Caleb Kidder** *Montana* **6-5 260 DE**

Named to All-Big Sky 2nd team at Defensive End. His career total of 29.5 tackles-for-loss ties him at No. 11 on UM's all-time career TFL list with current Seattle Seahawk Jordan Tripp. posted the sixth-most sacks in the Big Sky (5.5) and the fifth-most tackles for loss (11) in 2016. Finished the season as Montana's fifth-leading tackler with 55 total tackles. Also had three pass breakups and pass deflections. Led Montana in fumble recoveries (2). blocked a field goal. Named to STATS FCS Buchanan Award watch list. Named STATS FCS Preseason All-American. Named Big Sky Conference Preseason Defensive Player of the Year. Named to the Athlon Sports preseason FCS All-America first-team. made a move from defensive tackle to defensive end in the off season. Montana's leading returning tackler from 2015 with 82 tackles as a defensive tackle. UM's only returning first-team all-Big Sky player. posted four tackles (two solo), a sack and two tackles for loss in the 2016 spring game at defensive end.

**Damiond King** *Texas Southern* **6-4 260 DE**

Overlooked defender who deserved some post-season notice. Stats: 45 TT, 10 TFL, 5 Sacks, 3 PBU, 3 QBH, FF, 2 BKs

**Hunter Kiselick** *Georgetown* **6-1 250 DE ST**

2nd All Patriot (DL), 1st (STs), had a huge senior season for the Hoyas. He was a force on special teams, leading the entire FCS with four blocked kicks - all field goals. He blocked two field goals at Marist on Sept. 10 to preserve a three-point victory, and also recorded blocks against Princeton and Colgate. Defensively, Kiselick finished third on the team with 71 total tackles, including 26 solo takedowns. He led the Hoyas with 8.5 TFL and eight quarterback hurries, while ranking second with 3.0 sacks. He also added an interception, a fumble recovery and two pass breakups. He was named the Patriot League Special Teams Player of the Week on September 12 and earned an honorable mention selection on Nov. 21. Stats: 71 TT, 8.5 TFL, 3 Sacks, INT, 2 PBU, 8 QBH, FR, 4 BKs

**Tanoh Kpassagnon Villanova 6-7 290 DE**

1st All CAA (DPOY), Stats: 45 TT, 21.5 TFL, 11 Sacks, 3 QBH, FF, BK, 1st Stats FCS All American, Senior Bowl, 1st AP All American, 1st AFCA All American, Walter Camp All America, was named the CAA Football Defensive Player of the Year, had a league-best 21.5 tackles for loss and 11.0 quarterback sacks during the season. He made 45 tackles overall (27 solo, 18 assisted) and added two fumble recoveries, one forced fumble and one blocked kick. He scored his first career touchdown on a 25-yard fumble return in a win over Lafayette. Kpassagnon is a pro prospect and wrapped up his collegiate career with 105 total tackles, including 37.5 tackles for loss and 22.0 sacks. A dominant performer who has a good combination of speed and strength.

**Josh Letulgasenoa Cal Poly 6-2 265 DE OLB**

3rd All Big Sky. Rush linebacker notched 61 tackles (38 solo), including 8.5 tackles for lost yardage and 3.5 sacks. His numbers also include three pass breakups, four quarterback hurries and a fumble recovery.

**Ryan Lewis Robert Morris 6-5 280 DE DT**

Starter at defensive end for most of the last three seasons, earned All-NEC recognition for the first time in his career with a spot on the first team. Playing in the team's base 3-4 setup, he got to the quarterback 4.5 times in 2016 and tallied 6.5 tackles for loss. He led the team with six quarterback hurries. Lewis finished his career with 19.5 tackles for loss and 136 total tackles. His 12 sacks rank 13th all-time at RMU. 2016 Stats: 48 TT, 6.5 TFL, 4.5 Sacks, 6 QBH

**Manny Maragoto Monmouth (NJ) 6-6 255 DE DT**

Had a very good season playing inside at DT. Could possibly move outside. In his only year as a starter, had an All-Conference year without the recognition. 2016 Stats: 30 TT, 11.5 TFL, 6 Sacks, 4 PBU, FF

**JeMarcus Marshall Northwestern State 6-4 265 DE**

A Freshman All-America defensive end in 2013 when he had 8.5 sacks, overcame back surgery in his sophomore season to be a productive player in his final two seasons. He was the leading tackler on the NSU defensive line in 2016 with 41 tackles, including two sacks, and made an interception despite playing with a cast on a broken hand. 2016 Stats: 31 TT, 4.5 TFL, 1.5 Sacks, INT, 2 QBH

**Donovan McCray** *Grambling State* **6-3 265 DE**

2nd AP All American, Boxtorow All American, 1st All SWAC (DPOY), anchored the front four of a Tigers unit that led the SWAC in most every statistical category and ranked fourth in FCS in points allowed (16.4), as well as ranked first nationally in red zone defense (.577). McCray notched 28 total stops – 11.5 for loss -- with five sacks, three fumble recoveries, a blocked kick and a safety recorded. 2016 Stats: 35 TT, 13.5 TFL, 5 Sacks, INT, 3 QBH, 3 FR-108 yds, FF, BK, Safety

**Vantrel McMillan** *Chattanooga* **6-2 250 DE OLB**

First Team All-SoCon by the league's media, second team coaches. 7.5 sacks and 14.0 TFLs. 1.5 sacks at Alabama tied for most by an individual against the Tide this season. 2016 Stats: 57 TT, 14 TFL, 7.5 Sacks, PBU, 8 QBH, 2 FF

**Lorenzo Melvin** *Northern Arizona* **6-2 230 DE**

Battled injuries in 2015 but came at back almost 100% in 2016. An undersized college DE. Stats: 19 TT, 5 TFL, 3 Sacks, FF

**Marty Moesta** *Yale* **6-6 255 DE**

HM All Ivy for 2nd year in a row, started every game at defensive end. Had six tackles in win at Harvard. Eight TFL and five sacks both second on the team. 2016 Stats: 36 TT, 8.5 TFL, 4 Sacks, 2 QBH

**Avery Moss** *Youngstown State* **6-3 265 DE**

4.85/40, Nebraska transfer (suspended, indecency charge), East-West Shrine Game, 2nd AP All American, 1st All MVC, Had a breakout year with 42 total tackles, 28 of which were solos, and 10 sacks. Tied for the team lead with 12.5 TFLs and had a team best four forced fumbles. In MVFC games, had 32 total tackles, including 19 solo stops. registered eight sacks in league play with four hurries and three pass breakups. Led the team with 10.5 TFLs vs. league foes. Had sacks in seven games overall with a high of three against Indiana State. Had five or more tackles on six occasions. Had 25 tackles last season before starting all 11 games this year. 2016 Stats: 51 TT, 14.5 TFL, 9.5 Sacks, 3 PBU, 8 QBH, FR, 4 FF

**Anthony Murphy** *SE Louisiana* **6-4 260 DE**

HM All Southland, returned after an injury-riddled 2015 season. The Compton, California native shared team-high honors with four sacks, while also recording 37 tackles, eight tackles for loss, one fumble recovery and a forced fumble. 2016 Stats: 37 TT, 8 TFL, 4 Sacks, FF

**Bryan Osei** *Villanova* **6-1 255 DE DT**

Temple transfer, 5.06/40, 3rd All CAA, Stats: 46 TT, 8 TFL, 4.5 Sacks, came to Villanova last year after playing his first two collegiate seasons across town for Temple. He played in seven games for the Wildcats last season and has appeared in all 11 games this year while becoming one of the team's top performers on the defensive line. Osei has been credited with 40 tackles on the year, including 12 solo stops and 28 assisted tackles. He has also totaled five tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks. Osei had a career-high seven tackles, including a tackle for loss, at Maine. He has had four or more tackles in six games this season, and tallied sacks in wins over Lafayette and Albany. Osei is part of a Villanova defensive line which has consistently limited opposing offenses this season. Through the end of the regular season, the Wildcats ranked third in the nation in both scoring defense (14.9) and total defense (265.1), in addition to being 11th in rushing defense (100.5). Villanova leads CAA Football in all three of those categories, as well as in red zone scoring percentage (64.7%), sacks (24) and third down conversion percentage (30.5%).

**Desmond Owino** *Jacksonville State* **6-4 280 DE DT**  
2nd All OVC, was an OVC All-Newcomer pick a year ago after transferring from Navarro College in Texas. The senior from Nairobi, Kenya, helped fill the middle of JSU's defensive front and notched 22 tackles, 5.5 for a loss, 4.0 sacks and four quarterback hurries. Stats: 22 TT, 5.5 TFL, 4 Sacks, 2 PBU, 4 QBH, BK

**Zak Pettit** *UC Davis* **6-4 260 DE**  
HM All Big Sky, led the Aggies with 10.0 TFLs, including a pair of sacks. He finished with 42 tackles, including 25 solo, had a pair of quarterback-hurries, forced two fumbles and recovered one. He had a season-high nine tackles at Wyoming. 2016 Stats: 10 TFL, 42 TT, 2 Sacks, 2 QBH, 2 FF

**Jake Radziukinas** *Duquesne* **6-1 290 DE**  
2nd All NEC, Starting defensive end returned in 2016 after an injury cut his season short last year. Team captain. 2016 Stats: 50 TT, 4 TFL, 2.5 Sacks, FF

**Marquis Ragland** *NC A&T* **6-3 277 DE DT**  
1st All MEAC, Boxtorow All American (2x), regarded as the Aggies best defensive player with teams needing to double team him to stop him from being disruptive. He made 50 tackles from his interior defensive line position with 11 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks. 2016 Stats: 50 TT, 11 TFL, 3.5 Sacks, FF, BK

**Jordan Ransone** *Butler* **6-2 285 DE DT**  
Made the All-PFL First Team despite ending his season early due to injury. The defensive lineman played in just eight games and totaled 5.5 sacks, seven tackles for loss, 27 tackles, and a fumble recovery. Ransone's first appearance on an All-PFL Team.

**Samuel Reese** *Grambling State* **6-2 255 DE**

1st All SWAC, tough grad student who led the team in sacks. Quick to the ball. 2016 Stats: 39 TT, 15.5 TFL, 8.5 Sacks, 4 PBU, 3 QBH, FR, FF

**Patrick Ricard** *Maine* **6-3 285 DE DT**

5.00/40, 1st All CAA, During his senior campaign racked up 50 tackles in 11 games, 15.5 of which coming as tackles for loss. His 15.5 tackles for loss ranked him second among Colonial Athletic Association leaders. Ricard also notched 5.5 sacks during the 2016 season, averaging 0.5 per game to place him fifth among CAA leaders. For his career at Maine, Ricard played 44 games and was a constant force on the 'Black Hole' defensive line. Nearly a quarter of Ricard's 208 total tackles were for a loss. Had sacks in seven games with a season-high three at Illinois State. Also had two against South Dakota. had a season-best seven tackles, including six solos vs. SIU. **Karter Schult** *Northern Iowa* **6-4 269 DE DT**

Named the FCS STATS Buck Buchanan Award Winner. led all of Division I football in quarterback sacks during the regular season, racking up 17.0. He set a new UNI record for tackles for loss in a season with 24.0, giving him the UNI career record with 56.0. He was the 2016 MVFC Defensive Player of the Year, FCS ADA Defensive Player of the Year, Madness FCS Defensive Player of the Year and a consensus All-American. He is a two-time All-MVFC first-team honoree and two-time Scholar-Athlete first-team selection at UNI. He also earned three MVFC Player of the Week nods this past season. Schult recorded at least one sack in 10 of the 11 games in 2016. Along with his single-season records, he tied the UNI record for single-game tackles for loss with 5.5 against #14 Montana. He finished third on the team in total tackles with 69, leading all defensive linemen in the league during the regular season. Along with his sacks and tackles for loss, he also racked up four quarterback hurries, two forced fumbles, a blocked kick, a safety and his first-career interception to give him a well-rounded senior campaign. Schult finished his career at UNI ranked first all-time in career tackles for loss (56.), yards from tackles for loss (266), yards from sacks (215) and quarterback hurries (20), also ranking No. 2 in career sacks with 35.5.

HM All Big Sky, made 18 tackles, 4 for a loss, broke up four passes, hurried the quarterback three times, had an INT for a TD, and recovered one fumble.

**Cam Shorey New Hampshire 6-5 265 DE DT**

CAA All-Conference First Team selection, led New Hampshire with 10 tackles for loss as part of his 45 total tackles. The 6-5, 260 pound senior made 24 solo stops and 21 assisted tackles with three sacks. He also had three pass breakups, three quarterback hurries, an interception and a forced fumble. 5.25/40, Bethel U. transfer, 2nd All OVC, notched his second All-OVC second team honors in his two years while starting in all 12 games at defensive end. Serving as the perfect complement to Jones, the Skyhawk defense also ranked second in the OVC rushing and pass defense. Taylor tallied 35 tackles on the season while recording 7.5 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks. He also tallied seven quarterback hurries along with a both a forced fumble and recovery. His best game came against Southeast Missouri where he notched his fourth game with five tackles while tallying 2.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks on Senior Day. 2016 Stats: 35 TT, 7.5 TFL, 3.5 Sacks, 7 QBH, FF
