

**Xavier Bethany Lamar 6-0 195 FS SS**

Two-Time Second-Team All-Southland Conference; Defensive MVP of the 2016 FCS Scout Senior Bowl. Played in 46 games, earning 34 starts during his career. 2016: Played in and started all 11 games. Second-Team All-Southland Conference selection. Ranked third in the Southland, and led the team, with 103 tackles. Was one of only three players in the conference to record 100 tackles. Of his 103 stops, 52 were solo tackles. Finished tied for fourth in the Southland with three interceptions. Was also credited with a tackle for a loss and five pass breakups. Ended the season with five double-figure tackle performances.

**Jamerson Blount Samford 6-1 185 FS CB**

Three-time All SoCon, bit undersized for safety but plays tough and always comes to play. 2016 Stats: 99 TT, 1.5 TFL, INT, 3 PBU, 2 FR

**Kolbi Brown Harvard 5-11 200 FS CB**

Started all 10 games. Ranked fifth on the team with 46 tackles. Had 1.0 tackles for a loss and two stops overall vs. Rhode Island. Returned an interception 25 yards and had seven tackles at Brown. Recorded three tackles and one kick return for 12 yards against Georgetown. Made five tackles vs. Cornell. Accumulated seven tackles, two for a loss, at Holy Cross. Made an interception and had seven tackles at Princeton. Had two stops at Dartmouth. Finished with one tackle vs. Columbia. Amassed three tackles at Penn. Led Harvard with a career-high nine tackles vs. Yale. 2016 Stats: 46 TT, 3 TFL, 2 INTs

**Jacques Bryant Florida A&M 6-0 180 FS CB**

Named to the All-MEAC First Team, after he led the Rattlers in tackles for the second straight year, finishing the season with 71 takedowns (51 solos), with four pass interceptions for 127 yards in returns, to go with seven pass breakups. He was the FAMU Florida Blue Florida Classic MVP on Nov. 19, when he finished with an interception and fumble return, along with five tackles against Bethune-Cookman.

**Nate Casey Davidson 5-10 195 FS ILB**

HM All Pioneer, Casey had a great final season for the 'Cats including being named to the Allstate Good Works Team. Recorded 37 total tackles, 18 solo stops and 7.5 tackles for loss. Casey forced a fumble and broke up a pass, starting and appearing in nine games.

**Trey Colbert Incarnate Word 6-0 215 FS**

Southern Illinois transfer. Named the team's Special Teams Player of the Year. Earned Southland Conference Player of the Week honors after he broke a school record with two blocked punts against Stephen F. Austin on Oct. 29.

**Malik Diggs The Citadel 6-1 181 FS SS**

Ranks 13th on program's career tackles list with 219. SENIOR (2016): Started all 12 games. recorded 57 tackles, including 4.0 for loss, two interceptions and four pass breakups. Opened season with career-high 11 tackles and one pass breakup in 24-23 win at Mercer. Nine solo tackles vs. Bears were most in SoCon and 5th in FCS in week one. Made four tackles and grabbed game-clinching interception with 1:33 remaining in 19-14 victory vs. Furman. 2016 Stats: 57 TT, 4 TFL, 2 INTs, 4 PBU

**Joe Figueroa Colgate 5-10 190 FS**

2nd All Patriot, was fifth in tackles with 49, tied for the team lead in pass breakups with six and contributed two interceptions. 2016 Stats: 49 TT, 2 INTs, 6 PBU

**Eric Foster Alcorn State 6-3 195 FS CB**

UT-Chattanooga transfer, 1st All SWAC. Ranked top-10 in the SWAC in passes defended. He's wrapped up 41 tackles on the season and has also forced a fumble. Foster has recorded a pair of interceptions this year against Alabama A&M and Prairie View A&M. He posted a season-high eight tackles at PVAMU. Stats: 48 TT, 5.5 TFL, 3 Sacks, 2 INTs, 6 PBU, FF, BK

**Keith Graham Northern Arizona 5-11 185 FS**

Really came on in his senior year and made a definite impact in the both the run and pass defense. 2016 Stats: 73 TT, 7 TFL, INT, 3 PBU

**Donte Haynesworth Norfolk State 5-11 195 FS**

Saw significant time since freshman year, mostly at CB. Became starting FS in 2016. Stats: 63 TT, TFL, Sack, INT, 3 PBU

**Braxton Hoof Arkansas-Pine Bluff 6-1 215 FS**

Though not listed as a starter, took advantage of every opportunity and put up starters stats. Stats: 62 TT, 2 INTs, 3 PBU, FF, BK

**Justin Jemison Jackson State 6-3 190 FS**

2nd All SWAC, had his best season as a Tiger, as he posted 41 tackles, 3 INTs (1 TD), 2 forced fumbles, and a blocked punt. He returned an INT 71 yards for a TD against UAPB, as well as returning a blocked punt 8 yards for a TD against Southern. 2016 Stats: 41 TT, 3 INTs, 2 FF, BK

**Lorenzo Jerome St. Francis (PA) 6-0 195 FS SS**

DROY '13, KR, 4.55/40, 1st Stats FCS All American, NFLPA Bowl, 1st AP All American, Walter Camp All America, 1st All NEC (DB/RS), trying to become the first SFU player drafted by the NFL since Ed Stofko was taken in the ninth round of the 1944 draft by the Chicago/Pittsburgh Cardinals/Steelers. 2016 Stats: 59 TT, 5.5 TFL, 2.5 Sacks, 6 INTs, 5 PBU, 2 QBH, FRKR-405 yds, 28.9 AVG, TD

**Demetrius Johnson Texas Southern 6-1 180 FS SS**

Solid DB who can play versus run and pass. Alert with some thump to his tackling. Stats: 70 TT, 1.5 TFL, 2 INTs, 6 PBU, 3 QBH

**Adam Jones** *Northwestern State* **6-2 205 FS SS**

Had 62 total tackles with 2.5 tackles for loss and 2 pass breakup for the Demons. Jones played linebacker when he arrived to Northwestern State and moved to safety in 2014 where he started 11 games and finished with 76 tackles and team-high five interceptions. In 2015, Jones missed three games due to being academically ineligible causing the NCAA suspension. Stats: 67 TT, 2.5 TFL, PBU, FF, 2 QBH

**David Jones** *Richmond* **6-2 210 FS SS**

Led the FCS with nine interceptions. His four interceptions against Albany tied the NCAA record. Finished second on the team with 97 total tackles. Suffered arm injury in October '16.

**Zach Jones** *UC Davis* **6-0 200 FS SS**

HM All Big Sky, earned honorable mention as a safety even though he started the year as a linebacker. But his versatility allowed him to be moved throughout the Aggies' defense and he was productive everywhere, leading the team with 63 tackles, including 51 solo. He intercepted a pass and forced a team-high three fumbles. Twice had 10 tackles in a game, including at Cal Poly in October when all of them were solo stops. 2016 Stats: 63 TT, 3 FF, 2 TFL, INT

**Charles Keenan** *Bryant* **6-1 185 FS**

Started all 11 games as Bryant's free safety, finishing his career with 33-straight starts. He posted a career-high 55 tackles, recovered a fumble and also posted his first-career interception.

**Brock Kenyon** *Columbia* **6-1 200 FS**

2nd All Ivy, Team's Most Valuable Defensive Player Award as a cornerstone on the Lion defense. As Columbia's starting safety, Kenyon ranked sixth among Ivy League leaders and led the Lions with three interceptions on the year. Ranked No. 11 among league leaders in total tackles (71). He also finished with 43 solo tackles and three pass deflections. The senior wrapped up his career with 200 tackles (119 solo), three interceptions and 11 pass breakups in 40 games played and 26 starts. 2016 Stats: 71 TT, 3 TFL, 3 INTs

**Zach LaRoche** *Butler* **6-2 190 FS SS**

2016: Saw action in all 11 games, including 10 starts. Finished fourth on the team in total tackles (66). Tied for second on the team in interceptions (1-20-yds.). Accounted for two pass break-ups.

**Charles Mack** *Richmond* **6-2 205 FS**

Showed very good ability with increased playing time. 2016 Stats: 69 TT, INT, 2 PBU, 2 FF

**Teddie Martinez Monmouth (NJ) 6-0 190 FS**  
Had a very good statistical season despite only starting in 4 of the 10 games that he appeared in. 2016 Stats: 55 TT, 3 TFL, 3 INTs, FF, BK

**Charlie Miller Dartmouth 6-0 185 FS SS**  
2nd All Ivy, Played in nine games, starting eight, recording 41 tackles, 1.5 for a loss, a pair of interceptions and five passes broken up. Miller also blocked a field goal that helped preserve a 20-17 victory over Towson on Oct. 15, earning Ivy League Special Teams Player of the Week honors in the process.

**Trey Morgan Western Carolina 6-0 180 FS CB**  
2nd All SoCon, finished with a single-season, career-high 74 tackles in 2016 including 47 solo stops and 2.5 tackles for loss. He led the Catamounts with 10 total pass breakups during the season. Started every game in which he suited up for the Catamounts, recording 245 career tackles over 46 total games. He tallied his 10th career interception to seal the home win over VMI on Senior Day.

**Jordan Mynatt Towson 6-2 210 FS ILB**  
Undersized OLB who is a tough competitor and a sure-tackler. Great at getting penetration and can fall into coverage; though run-stopping is his best. 2016 Stats: 71 TT, 9.5 TFL, 2 Sacks, PBU, 2 FF

**Carlton Nash Central Connecticut 5-10 180 FS CB**  
West Virginia transfer, Made a great showing in his only year as a starter. Stats: 49 TT, 2 TFL, INT, 10 PBUs, FF, 2 FR.

**La'Darius Newbold Illinois State 6-1 200 FS SS**  
Texas Tech transfer, Saw action in 12 games for the Redbirds, with two starts at cornerback. Finished the season with 13 tackles, 11 of which were solo stops, also recorded a pair of interceptions and ranked third on the team with seven pass breakups. Returned an INT 92 yards for a touchdown in a win over nationally-ranked South Dakota State. 2016 Stats: 13 TT, 2 INTs-108 tds, 7 PBU, FF

**Matthew Nicholson VMI 6-2 195 FS SS**  
Converted to defensive back from wide receiver in spring drills of 2016. Worked out at safety and performed well in the transition. 2016 Stats: 52 TT, 2.5 TFL, INT, 3 PBU, 2 FR, FF

**Tony Omli Murray State 6-0 200 FS**  
Named to 2016 Kentucky Pro Football Hall of Fame All-Commonwealth Team. Earned 2016 Preseason All-OVC third-team honors from College Sports Madness. 2016 Stats: 73 TT, 3 TFL, Sack, PBU, 2 FF

**Jihaad Pretlow Fordham 5-11 195 FS SS**

CB, KR, Temple transfer, 2nd All Patriot (RS/DB), Was All-League at both defensive back and kick returner, finished fourth on the 2016 squad with 46 total tackles, 38 solo, including two for loss and one sack. He also had a team-high eleven pass breakups and one interception. Pretlow was second in the Patriot League and 45th in the NCAA FCS in passes defended. As a returner, Pretlow brought back 18 kickoffs for 511 yards (28.4 average) with a long of 83 yards. He leads the League and is ranked sixth in the NCAA FCS in kickoff return average. 2016 Stats: 46 TT, 2 TFL Sack, INT, 11 PBU, KR-511 yds, 28.4 AVG

**Trey Robinson** *Furman* **6-2 220 FS SS**  
2nd All SoCon, Consensus all-conference scroll was the second for him as he paced Furman with 104 tackles this season. He finished his Paladin tenure with 264 tackles and six interceptions. 2016 Stats: 104 TT, 4 TFL, INT, 6 PBU, FF

**Yamen Sanders** *Montana* **6-4 216 FS SS**  
Arizona transfer, a fixture at safety since transferring from the University of Arizona. Good tackler and solid special teamer. Stats: 32 TT, TFL, INT

**Guy Stallworth** *Grambling State* **6-3 215 FS ILB**  
1st All SWAC, Stats: 70 TT, 6.5 TFL, 7 PBU, FR

**Ryan Torzsa** *Delaware* **6-2 205 FS**  
A four-year regular and two-year starter in the Delaware defensive secondary and finished his career with 88 tackles, five interceptions, six pass breakups, one fumble recovery for a touchdown, and a blocked punt. He had 33 tackles and two interceptions in 2016. Stats: 33 TT, 2 INTs, 3 PBU
