HM All Southland, averaging over 21 yards/catch on 32 receptions deserves attention; especially when you consider the team's "just ok" QB play. Good on-field speed and can obviously get down field. Nice height as well. 2016 Stats: 32 rcp, 687 yds, 21.5 AVG, 7 TDs

**Shakim Alonzo** *Hampton* **6-4 220 WR TE**

Cincinnati transfer, had trouble getting an opportunity at Cincinnati despite switching to tight end. Stats: 22 rcp, 306 yds, 13.9 AVG, 3 TDs, Pass-TD

**Darren Ambush** *Monmouth (NJ)* **5-8 185 WR Slot**

2nd All Big South, a first team honoree as a junior, capped off his senior campaign by finishing third in the BSC in reception yardage (588) and second in receptions (49). His 77 yard catch against Liberty was the longest pass of the season by a Big South player while his 1,315 all-purpose yards was second in the league. Ambush set the Monmouth single-season kickoff return mark with 678 yards in 2016. 2016 Stats: 49 rcp, 588 yds, 12.0 AVG, 2 TDs, KR-678 yds, 22.6 AVG, STs-7 TT

Voted Second Team All-MEAC in 2014 then suffered season-ending injury after first game of 2015. Good size with great hands. Good receiver when healthy. Only played in 9 games in 2016 with 4 starts. 2016 Stats: 14 rec, 210 yds, 15.0 avg, 1 TD.

**Ben Axline** *UT-Martin* **6-3 200 WR**

2nd All OVC, provided a dependable offensive target which led the OVC in scoring for much of the season. Axline started in 11 of 12 games this season while leading the team with 35 catches for 659 yards and four touchdowns. He averaged 54.9 yards per game while hauling in 18.8 yards per catch. His best game came against Austin Peay where he notched the most receiving yards in Division-I program history with eight catches for 198 yards and a touchdown. 2016 Stats: 35 rcp, 659 yds, 18.8 AVG, 4 TDs

**Oluwafemi Bamiro** *NC A&T* **6-4 215 WR Ath**

Has played two different positions in his career, but came into his final season with a chance to play the position he came to N.C. A&T to play. Switched to play tight end in 2014 before switching back to quarterback for the 2015 season. Very good athlete in search of a position. 2016 Stats: 581 yds, 8 TDs, rush-284 yds, TD

**Josh Barge** *Jacksonville State* **6-0 185 WR**

All Newcomer '13, 4.60/40, foot injury '16, 2nd All OVC, claimed his fourth All-OVC mention in his four-year JSU career, even after an early injury sidelined him for the first few games of the season. Fought through injuries to catch 41 passes for 662 yards and two touchdowns and extending his school records in receptions to 245 and receiving yards to 3,549. He is now second in OVC history in receptions and third in receiving yards. 2016 Stats: 41 rcp, 662 yds, 16.1 AVG, 2 TDs, PR-204 yds, 11.3 AVG, TD

**Isaiah Barnes Princeton 6-3 210 WR**

HM All Ivy, earned All-Ivy League honorable mention in helping Tigers win the Ivy League title. Posted career highs in both catches (36) and receiving yards (563), and helped Princeton produce Ivy League's top unit in scoring (34.6) and total (415.5) offense. Moved into Princeton record book with second-longest score in program history, a 95-yard TD catch at Cornell during Tigers' 56-7 win; caught seven passes for 170 yards and a score in the game and was named to the Ivy League Honor Roll Stats: 36 rcp, 563 yds, 15.6 AVG, 2 TDs, 95 lng

**Ricardo Barnett Houston Baptist 6-5 210 WR RS**

Tall receiver with decent speed. Could develop with strong passing game. Stats: 24 rcp, 337 yds, 14.0 AVG, 2 TDs, KR-138 yds

**Taylor Barthelette Bryant 6-1 190 WR**

Team's OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR, Barthelette posted another outstanding season for the Black and Gold, earning Second Team All-NEC honors. He led the Bulldogs with 47 catches, for 758 yards and eight touchdowns, all which were career highs. Barthelette posted back-to-back 100-yard games to open the season, becoming the first wide receiver in school history to open a season like that. He finished his career sixth all-time in receptions and fifth all-time in receiving yards.

**CJ Bates Nicholls State 6-1 200 WR**

Dismissed from Louisiana-Lafayette, 2nd All Southland, Bates finished the season with 53 receptions for 798 yards and eight touchdowns, averaging 72.5 yards per game. In league play, he was third touchdown catches (8), and fourth in receptions (49) and yards per game (84.7). He tallied three 100-yard games in conference, highlighted by two outstanding efforts on the road. At Northwestern State, he was named Southland Player of the Week after totaling 10 catches for 179 yards and three touchdowns – tying the program's mark for TD catches in a single game. He followed up with a nine-catch, 187-yard day at No. 13 Central Arkansas, which included a pair of touchdown catches. 2016 Stats: 53 rcp, 798 yds, 15.1 AVG, 9 TDs, 72.5 y/g

**CJ Board Chattanooga 6-2 180 WR RS**

**Devin Borders Eastern Kentucky 6-6 217 WR TE**  
Concluded his career with the fifth most receiving yards in program history (2,157 yards). He was also a proficient kick blocker. His 13 career blocked kicks and eight career blocked field goals are both Ohio Valley Conference records. In the FCS career rankings, he is second on the blocked kicks list and is tied for second on the blocked field goals list. This past season, Borders caught a team-best 47 passes for 727 yards. **Xavier Borishade Chattanooga 5-10 180 WR RS**  
Played in 51 games with 37 starts. 117 career catches for 1,654 yards and 16 TDs. Tied for fifth all-time at UTC in receiving TDs. Three 100-yard receiving games. 2016 Stats: 47 rcp, 688 yds, 14.6 AVG, 8 TDs, KR-319 yds, 26.6 AVG

**Joey Borsellino Western Illinois 5-11 185 WR**  
Started in all 11 games. Finished second on the team with 40 catches for 500 yards. Caught two touchdowns. Ended his career third all-time with 2,363 yards and second in WIU history with 184 receptions. Caught 13 touchdowns all-time, averaging 12.8 yards per reception in his four-year career. 2016 Stats: 40 rcp, 500 yds, 12.5 AVG, 2 TDs

**Kendrick Bourne Eastern Washington 6-3 190 WR**  
Selected as a NCAA Football Championship Subdivision All-American, 2nd All Big Sky. Finished the 2016 season with 79 catches for 1,201 yards and seven touchdowns, and combined with Kupp and Hill for totals of 273 receptions for 4,058 yards and 41 scores. All three went over the 1,000-yard mark for the season. 2016 Stats: 74 rcp, 1051 yds, 6 TDs, 14.2 AVG

**Brian Brown Richmond 6-2 205 WR**  
Earned four different All-American accolades this past year after leading the CAA in catches (81), receiving yards (1,485) and TDs (11). He ranked in the top-five in the country in all three of those categories for the second consecutive season.

**Rudder Brown The Citadel 6-4 220 WR TE**  
Started all 12 games. Caught 13 passes for 243 yards and one touchdown and added six-yard rush. led team in receptions and receiving yards. Caught career-high four passes for 72 yards in second round of FCS Playoffs vs. No. 19 Wofford. 2016 Stats: 13 rcp, 243 yds, 18.7 AVG, TD

**Robbie Cantelli Fordham 6-0 193 WR**

Worked his way from walk-on to scholarship player over his career. Led all Fordham receivers with 13 touchdown catches, one shy of the school single season record. He hauled in 37 passes for 634 yards (17.1 yards/catch), both second best on the team. Cantelli finished fourth in the Patriot League in scoring touchdowns and tenth in receiving yards/game. 2016 Stats: 37 rcp, 634 yds, 17.1 AVG, 13 TDs

**Wayne Capers, Jr** *Duquesne* **6-1 211 WR SS**

Could also play SS, 1st All NEC was a second team pick in 2015. Was a multi-dimensional player for the Dukes in 2014 after transferring in from Arizona, switching from defensive back to wide receiver. Also ran out of the backfield that year. 2016 Stats: 50 rcp, 948 yds, 19.0 AVG, 9 TDs, 86.2 y/g

**Will Carter** *Bucknell* **5-10 180 WR**

Finished his career with 195 catches for 2,744 yards, both school records. He eclipsed standard that had stood for 51 years. Carter will graduate tied for the program record for career touchdown receptions (18). In 2016, Carter led the Bison with 49 catches for 734 yards and three touchdowns. He also ran 10 times for 14 yards and two touchdowns.

**Danny Cotter** *Butler* **6-2 190 WR**

2016: Started all 11 games. Named First Team Academic All-PFL. Finished second on the team in receptions (37), receiving yards (541), and receiving touchdowns (4), averaged 14.6 yds/rec.

**Rashard Davis** *James Madison* **5-9 175 WR RS**

Played in all 15 games, making 12 starts. STATS FCS First Team All-American. Associated Press FCS Second Team All-American. Walter Camp Football Foundation FCS All-American. HERO Sports FCS First Team All-American. CAA Special Teams Player of the Year. First Team All-CAA Punt Returner. ECAC First Team All-Star. VaSID First Team All-State Return Specialist. VaSID Second Team All-State Wide Receiver. Roanoke Times First Team All-State. CAA Special Teams Player of the Week (Sept. 12). Set JMU and CAA single-season record with an FCS-best four punt returns for a touchdown. Had 15 punt returns for a JMU single-season record 426 yards and four scores. Tallied 42 receptions for 530 yards and three touchdowns

**Andre Dessenberg** *Towson* **6-3 200 WR**

3rd All CAA, posted a team-high 60 receptions for 774 yards and three touchdowns. He had a pair of 100-yard receiving games, including 12 catches for 140 yards against Dartmouth. The 12 catches are just one shy of the school record. 2016 Stats: 60 rcp, 12.9 AVG, 774 yds, 3 TDs

**Marshall Deutz** *Cornell* **5-10 190 WR Slot**

Teams 2nd leading receiver for the second consecutive year. Just a reliable target with good hands. 2016 Stats: 41 rcp, 429 yds, 10.5 AVG, 3 TDs

**Troy Doles** *Brown* **5-11 190 WR**

Missed 4 games and played sparingly in two others because of injury. Was Brown's main downfield threat with terrific speed. Averaged 15.6 yds/reception over his career. In 2015, ranked 9th nationally with 96.0 receiving yards per game and his 66 catches were 16th best in the nation. 2016 Stats: 20 rcp, 327 yds, 16.4 AVG, 5 TDs

**Cameron Dunn** *Columbia* **6-3 210 WR**

Was presented with the Team's Unsung Hero Award, given to a player whose role is not always obvious to the outside observer, but without his contribution, the team would not be as successful. Dunn started nine games and finished with 32 receptions for 332 yards (10.4 yards per catch average) and two touchdowns. Dunn finished his collegiate career with 64 catches for 668 yards and four touchdowns. 2016 Stats: 32 rcp, 332 yds, 10.4 AVG, 2 TDs

**Ricky Fisk** *Morgan State* **6-0 185 WR**

This is a good receiver on a team that suffered from a mediocre passing game. A weapon anywhere he lines up. Great vision and quick feet, tremendous hands.

**Brendan Flaherty** *Holy Cross* **6-2 201 WR**

Made his second straight appearance on the All-New England team, in addition to being a first team All-Patriot League selection in both 2015 and 2016. He started 10 games at wide receiver this season and led the team with 59 receptions for 621 yards and four touchdowns. Flaherty also rushed the ball 34 times for 117 yards and a score, while totaling 738 all-purpose yards. He finished the year ranked third in the Patriot League in receptions and ninth in receiving yards. Flaherty caught 197 passes for 2,035 yards and 17 touchdowns during his collegiate career, and ranks second all-time at Holy Cross in receptions, fifth in receiving yards and seventh in touchdown receptions. 2016 Stats: 59 rcp, 621 yds, 10.5 AVG, 4 TDs, pass-TD, rush-117 yds, TD

**Dane Forlines** *VMI* **5-10 190 WR RS**

In 2015, was named All-Southern Conference First Team for return specialist as selected by the league coaches and also media. 2016 Stats: 55 rcp, 604 yds, 11.0 AVG, TD, PR-137 yds, 11.4 AVG

**Keith Foster** *Wagner* **6-3 200 WR**

An explosive athlete with great size. Switched to wide receiver in the spring of 2014 after seeing playing time in the Seahawk secondary as a freshman in 2013. Has had trouble staying on the field, but a very good prospect when healthy. 2016 Stats: 7 games, 14 rec, 172 yds, 12.3 avg, 2 TDs.

**Isaiah Gillis** *Wagner* **6-4 225 WR SS**

A tall, physical athlete who was converted to defensive back in the spring of 2016 after spending his first three seasons at wide receiver.

**Dano Graves** *Cal Poly* **5-10 190 WR QB**

Finished No. 1 in the Big Sky Conference in passing efficiency, was named the team's most valuable player. completed 63 percent of his passes (97 of 153) for 1,485 yards and 17 touchdowns and also rushed 157 times for 686 yards and nine more scores as the Mustang offense averaged 471 yards and 35 points per game this season. Graves surpassed the 100-yard mark three times and was intercepted just four times. Air Force transfer

**Karel Hamilton** *Samford* **6-1 205 WR RS**

1st Stats FCS All American, 1st AP All American, 2nd AFCA All American, Walter Camp All America, 1st All SoCon, Hamilton caught 111 passes for 1,389 yards and 14 touchdowns. Hamilton led the nation in receptions per game (10.1), and he ranked second in the nation in receiving yards per game (126.3), and fourth in total receiving yards (1,389). Hamilton currently holds single-season Samford records for receptions (111) and receiving yards (1,389). He also holds school career records for receptions (279) and receiving yards (3,803), and he tied the career record for touchdown receptions (31). 2016 Stats: 111 rcp, 1389 yds, 12.5 AVG, 14 TDs, 126.3 y/g, KR-113 yds, 22.6 AVG

**Jeremiah Harris, Jr** *Savannah State* **6-4 205 WR**

Tall WR, smart and effective. Presents a great target and uses his height very well. Missed three game due to injury. 2016 Stats: 11 rec, 144 yds, 13.09 avg, 2 TDs.

**Jordan Hicks** *Incarnate Word* **5-8 175 WR RS**

HM All Southland (AP), totaled 393 yards on 17 kick returns, averaging 23.1 yards per return this season. An all-around player, Hicks also had a major impact from the receiver position, contributing 493 yards and five scores through the air. 2016 Stats: 34 rcp, 493 yds, 14.5 AVG, 5 TDs, KR-393 yds, 23.1 AVG

**Shaq Hill** *Eastern Washington* **5-10 180 WR RS**

Started his career in 2012 when the Eagles finished 11-3 overall and 7-1 in the Big Sky in the first year of a three-peat as league champs and FCS Playoffs participant. Hill redshirted in 2015, thus, he is the first player to see action in four years to win Big Sky titles each year, with a collective record of 46-11 overall and 30-2 in the league. He was also the second Eastern player in school history to letter in four playoff years. Hill broke the school record for career kickoff return yards, with a total of 2,280 yards. With 94 career returns, Hill previously broke Richardson's record of 80. Hill's average of 24.3 yards per return was ninth in school history, as he has had returns of 99, 93, 90 and 80 yards in his career (two of them for touchdowns). His 5,234 all-purpose yards were the third-most in school history. HM All Sky '13, HM All Sky (KR) '12, Could also play CB, 1st All Big Sky. 2016 Stats: 72 rcp, 1077 yds, 15.0 AVG, 15 TDs, 89.8 y/g, rush-72 yds, TD, KR-153 yds

**Scooter Hollis Columbia 5-11 175 WR Slot**

Hollis finished the 2016 season with 36 receptions for 363 yards and a 10.1 yards per catch average. Over his four-plus year career, Hollis started 31 games, caught 111 passes for 1,222 yards and two touchdowns.

**Zac Hoover Missouri State 6-0 195 WR**

HM All MVC, reeled in a team-best six touchdown receptions and 496 yards on his 27 total catches this fall. At South Dakota State, he caught the longest pass reception of the season by an MVFC receiver with his 91-yard scoring catch. Hoover also scored on receptions of 36, 39 and 76 yards this fall, totaled a club-high 267 yards after catch—an average of 10.3 per reception—and averaged 19.1 yards per reception to lead the Bears.

4.5/40, 1st All Ivy (WR/RS), A four-time First Team All-Ivy selection, Jette was named a First Team All-Ivy wide receiver and return specialist in 2016. One of the top receivers in Brown football history, Jette finished his Brown career ranked ninth in both career receiving yards (1,860) and receptions (150). A dynamic return specialist, Jette had a 79-yard punt return for a touchdown against Cornell and ranks fourth in all-time career punt return yards (493) at Brown. He finished the season with 54 catches for 518 yards and three touchdowns. Stats: 54 rcp, 518 yds, 3 TDs, rush-133 yds, 8.9 AVG, TD, PR-149 yds, 16.6 AVG, TD

**Anthony Johnson Jacksonville State 6-4 205 WR**

Good-sized receiver who did not see enough action at JSU to make an impression.

**Gerard Johnson** *Norfolk State* 5-9 205 WR AP

Backs were called on to be solid receivers in the offense and Gerard showed those skills in addition to being a solid rusher. Stats: 419 yds, 4.7 AVG, 2 TDs, rec-27 rcp, 260 yds, TD

**Joe Jordan** *Marist* 6-4 205 WR

Smart, tall receiver with good hands. A project but can't beat the size. 2016 Stats: 24 rcp, 331 yds, 3 TDs

**Tim Keith** *Stony Brook* 6-0 210 WR

Team's second leading receiver. Spent four years at Western Michigan as a receiver and a special teams member. 2016 Stats: 19 rec, 263 yds, 13.84 avg, TD.

**Kyle Kerrick** *UT-Martin* 6-3 200 WR

Michigan State transfer, Great target who, at times, looks dominating. Consistency is a goal. Has the talent. 2016 Stats: 32 rcp, 442 yds, 13.8 AVG, 3 TDs

**Denzel Keyes** *NC A&T* 6-4 215 WR

2nd All MEAC, has continually gotten better over his career. A superb athlete, Keyes was a starter on the Aggies football and men's basketball teams as a junior. Was the Aggies threat inside the red zone. 2016 Stats: 42 rcp, 461 yds, 10 TDs

**Derek Knott** *Lehigh* 5-9 175 WR

Started all 12 games as a slot receiver. established career-highs in receptions, yards and touchdowns. Had first 100-yard receiving games of his career against Holy Cross (10/22) and Fordham (10/29). Season-high eight receptions against Princeton (9/24) and at New Hampshire (11/26). Career-high 130 receiving yards, including 84-yard touchdown in Fordham game.

**Colton Korn** *Charleston Southern* 6-0 190 WR

Second on the team with 15 receptions for 235 yards and three touchdowns, averaging 15.7 yards per reception and 23.5 receiving yards per game. A go-to target on third down in the Bucs' passing game.

**Cooper Kupp** *Eastern Washington* 6-2 215 WR RS



Selected by the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision Athletic Director's Association as a repeat selection for its FCS Offensive Player of the Year Award. Kupp earned first team All-America honors on all seven teams announced, including recognition as the FCS Athletic Director's Association Wide Receiver of the Year. He was previously honored for the fourth-straight year on teams selected by the American Football Coaches Association, STATS and Associated Press, and for the third time by the Walter Camp Football Foundation (2013-2015-2016). He was also honored by Hero Sports and College Sports Madness for first team All-America accolades. Kupp missed 1 1/2 games earlier in the season and almost a half at both Portland State on Nov. 18 and Central Arkansas on Dec. 3 with shoulder injuries. But he still finished with a Big Sky Conference record 117 catches for 1,700 yards and 17 scores. Including his rushing, passing and return yards, he finished the season with 2,047 yards (157.5 per game) and 21 touchdowns. Broke one all-division collegiate record, 15 FCS records, 11 Big Sky marks and 26 EWU records during his illustrious 52-game career .

**Israel Lamprakes** *Southern Illinois* **5-11 175 WR**

Named the Team's Offensive Player of the Year. Was the team's leading receiver with 617 yards as a sixth-year senior. Lamprakes ended his career with the most productive two-game stretch for any wide receiver in SIU history (18 receptions for 359 yards). 2016 Stats: 33 rcp, 617 yds, 18.7 AVG, 4 TDs

**Dominique Leake** *Grambling State* **5-11 175 WR**

Deep threat, runs solid routes, go-to guy who made most of every opportunity in multiple WR set. 2016 Stats: 35 rcp, 585 yds, 16.71 AVG, 6 TDs

**Lance Lenoir, Jr** *Western Illinois* **6-0 210 WR RS**

3rd Stats FCS All American, NFLPA Bowl, 1st All MVC, Third Team All-America (HERO Sports, STATS). First Team All-Missouri Valley Football Conference. Leaves Western as the all-time leader in: receptions (273), yards (3,796), touchdowns (28), 100-yard games (14), 200-yard games (2), and consecutive games with a catch (41). In all listed among the 'Top 5' on 29 occasions for single-game, season and career records – including 10 total records held. Broke the Missouri Valley Football Conference all-time record for most catches. Ended his career third all-time among MVFC leaders in yardage. Played in all 48 games of his career, starting 47 times. Caught a pass in his final 41 consecutive games. **Justice Liggins** *Stephen F. Austin* **6-1 210 WR**

Appeared in 36 games during his SFA career with 13 starts. Caught 102 passes for 1,166 yards and eight touchdowns. Recorded two 100-yard receiving games during his career. Ranks 31st all-time in program history for receiving yards (1,166). 2016: Started 10 games at wide receiver for the Lumberjacks. Caught 49 passes for 641 yards and three touchdowns on the season. Opened the year with a season-high 10 catches for 80 yards and a touchdown at Texas Tech.

**Cam Livingston Weber State 6-2 195 WR Slot**

Leg injury in November, HM All Big Sky. Finished his four-year career at Weber State in 2016 and ended his career as one of the top wide receivers in school history. He played in 44 career games with the Wildcats and twice earned All-Big Sky honors. He finished his career with 171 career receptions, which ranks fourth in Weber State history. He also had 2,199 career receiving yards, sixth most in Weber State career history. He also had 11 career touchdowns. 2016 Stats: 49 rcp, 485 yds, 4 TDs, rush-485 yds, 9.9 AVG, 4 TDs

**John Maddaluna Colgate 6-0 190 WR RS**

2nd All Patriot, led the Raiders this season in receptions and receiving yards, and he finished fifth at Colgate in career catches with 153 and sixth in yards at 2,332. 2016 Stats: 54 rcp, 878 yds, 16.3 AVG, 5 TDs, rush-TD

**Thomas Martin Morgan State 5-10 185 WR**

Has sure hands and the speed to stretch a defense. Good route runner who provides leadership. 2016 Stats: led team w/ 28 rcp, 400 yds, 14.3 AVG, TD

**Tuff McClain Northwestern State 6-0 190 WR RS**
